Defining the Middle Line of further Portion of the Foxton to New Plymouth Railway (Portion of Branch Line from Bunnythorpe to Woodville).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the branch line of railway from Bunnythorpe to Woodville from the main line of railway, Foxton to New Plymouth, is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point situate in Section number four hundred and sixty-three, Township of Palmerston, Manchester Block, to a point in Subdivision ten, Section number one, all within the Provincial District of Wellington, Colony of New Zealand, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 7867, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point situate in Section No. 463, Township of Palmerston, Manchester Block, pro-

ceeding thence in a generally easterly and southeasterly direction for a distance of 90 chains or thereabouts, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, &c.: Section No. 463, G. R. Rangiura, and terminating at a point in Subdivision X., Section No. 1, all within the Provincial District of Wellington, Colony of New Zealand; and including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; in the manner delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 7867, signed by the Honorable Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington; the total length being 90 chains or thereabouts.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876,"

the middle line of the railway from Otautau to Nightcaps (Opio Section), being one of the railways specified in "The Immigration and Public Works Appropriation Act, 1878," was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Invercargill, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said portion of the said line of railway and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas the branch line of railway from the Makarewa-Riverton Line to Otautau and Nightcaps Coal Fields (Western Railways), is one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1879," and it is enacted therein that such of the railways mentioned as are unfinished may be completed under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and "The Public Works Act, 1879: And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for the Opio Section of the said branch line of railway:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the sixth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of every power and authority in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the said portion of the said branch line of railway.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural land such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Auckland did, on the twenty-sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do

hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Friday, the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at Auckland, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in that office.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Southland did, on the twenty-ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, pass resolutions recommending that the land described in the Schedules hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendations, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Declaring certain Lands to be the Nelson Creek Water-race.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation publicly notified and gazetted, declare any land therein specified, whether within or without, or partly within and partly without, a proclaimed gold field, to be a water-race; and may declare any stream therein specified to be taken for the purpose of supplying a water-race; and also that the Minister shall cause a map of such water-race to be

deposited in the Warden's Court of the district in which such land is; and such map shall be referred to in and shall form part of any such Proclamation: And whereas, for the purpose of supplying with water the Nelson Creek Gold Field, being a portion of the proclaimed gold field known as the Nelson South-West Gold Field, there has been constructed partly within and partly without such proclaimed gold field a water-race, called the Nelson Creek Water-race, and a map thereof has been deposited as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the hereinbefore recited Acts, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the First Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby declared to be a water-race for the purposes of the said Acts, and shall be called the Nelson Creek Water-race; and I declare that the several streams specified in the Second Schedule hereto are taken for the purpose of supplying such water-race, and that the lands over which the said water-race, known as the Nelson Creek Water-race, is constructed, are accurately specified in the First Schedule hereto, and in the map marked P.W.D. 6235, deposited as aforesaid.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point on the Nelson Creek Water-race, marked by a peg driven in the ground, and figured 0 miles 10 chains, and thence follows along the hills forming the watershed of Lake Hochstetter entirely around the said lake to the starting-point on a race-line marked 0 miles 10 chains. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 0 miles 10 chains on the existing Nelson Creek Water-race, and ending at peg figured 5 miles 30 chains on same, having a width of 400 links throughout; bounded to the North by a line 200 links distant from the centre of the said water-race as constructed and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 400 links distant from the said northern boundary and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 5 miles 30 chains on the existing Nelson Creek Water-race, and ending at peg figured 5 miles 50 chains on same, having a width of 300 links throughout; bounded to the North by a line 100 links distant from the centre of the said water-race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 300 links distant from the said northern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 5 miles 50 chains on the existing Nelson Creek Water-race, and ending at peg figured 5 miles 76 chains on same, having a width of 250 links throughout; bounded to the North by a line 100 links distant from the centre of the said water-race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 250 links distant from the said northern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 5 miles 76 chains on the existing Nelson Creek Water-race, and ending at peg figured 9 miles 60 chains on same, having a width of 250 links throughout; bounded to the North by a line 100 links distant from the centre of the said water-race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 250 links distant from the said northern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted

green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 9 miles 60 chains on the existing Nelson Creek Water-race, and ending at peg figured 16 miles 12 chains on same, having a width of 300 links throughout; bounded to the North by a line 100 links distant from the centre of the said water-race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 300 links distant from the said northern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 16 miles 12 chains on the existing Nelson Creek Water-race, and ending at peg figured 16 miles 23 chains 80 links on same, having a width of 300 links throughout; bounded to the North by a line 100 links distant from the centre of the said water-race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 300 links distant from the said northern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at 5 miles 76 chains on the existing Nelson Creek Water-race, being also peg 0 miles 0 chains on existing race, known as Branch Race; thence following the said existing branch race, and ending at peg figured 1 mile 54 chains on same, having a width of 250 links throughout; bounded to the North by a line 150 links distant from the centre of the said branch race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 250 links distant from the said northern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at 1 mile 54 chains on the race known as the Branch Race, hereinbefore referred to, being also peg 0 miles 0 chains on the existing race known as the Branch to Magee's Race; thence following the said Branch to Magee's Race, and ended at peg figured 0 miles 18 chains 83 links on same, having a width of 100 links throughout; bounded to the East by a line 50 links distant from the centre of the said Branch to Magee's Race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the West by a line 100 links distant from the said eastern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 1 mile 54 chains on the race known as the Branch Race hereinbefore referred to, being also peg 0 miles 0 chains on the existing race known as the Waste Water Channel No. 1; thence following the said Waste Water Channel No. 1, and ending at peg figured 20 chains 40 links on same, having a width of 100 links throughout; bounded to the East by a line 50 links distant from the centre of the said Waste Water Channel as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the West by a line 100 links distant from the said eastern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 16 miles 12 chains on the existing Nelson Creek Water-race, being also peg 0 miles 0 chains on the existing race known as Waste Water Channel No. 2; thence following the said Waste Water Channel No. 2, and ending at peg figured 0 miles 6 chains on same, having a width of 400 links throughout; bounded to the East by a line 200 links distant from the centre of the said existing Waste Water Channel No. 2, as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the West by a line 400 links distant from the eastern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green

lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 0 miles 6 chains on the existing Waste Water Channel No. 2, as hereinbefore referred to, and ending at a peg figured 0 miles 24 chains on same, having a width of 100 links throughout; bounded to the East by a line 50 links distant from the centre of the said Waste Water Channel No. 2 as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the West by a line 100 links distant from the said eastern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at a point on the left branch of Nelson Creek about 8 chains above its junction with Sutherland's Creek; thence following the existing water-race known as Magee's Race, and ending at peg figured 4 miles 46 chains 10 links on same, having a width of 100 links throughout: bounded to the North by a line 50 links distant from the centre of the said race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 100 links distant from the said northern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading. All that piece or parcel of land commencing at peg figured 2 miles 71 chains on the race known as Magee's Race, hereinbefore referred to, being also peg 0 miles 0 chains on the existing water-race known as the Branch of Magee's Race; thence following the said Branch of Magee's Race, and ending at a peg figured 0 miles 72 chains 41 links on same, having a width of 100 links throughout: bounded to the North by a line 50 links distant from the centre of the said race as constructed, and generally parallel to same; and bounded to the South by a line 100 links distant from the said northern boundary, and generally parallel to same; as indicated on map by dotted green lines and green shading: all being within the Provincial District of Nelson, Colony of New Zealand, and are more particularly delineated upon the plan marked P.W.D. 6235, deposited in the Warden's office, Ahaura.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

THE whole of the streams flowing into Lake Hochstetter, the Lake Hochstetter itself, and the stream known as the left-hand branch of Nelson Creek, with all its tributaries from its junction with Lake Hochstetter downwards to the dam at head of the Nelson Creek Water-race about 90 chains below the said lake; also a stream of water, equal to twenty sluice-heads (measured in accordance with "The Mines Act, 1877"), to be taken from the left-hand branch of Nelson Creek aforesaid at the head of the race known as Magee's Race, being about 8 chains above the junction of Sutherland's Creek with the left-hand branch of Nelson Creek; as indicated on map.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Fardon Park Domain Board:—

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. 7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

The University of London and the Gilchrist Scholarship.

Education Department,
Wellington, 9th August, 1880.

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University June Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the "June examination" for New Zealand will be held at Christchurch, on Monday, the 6th September, and four following days.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin.
2. Any two of the following languages:—(a) Greek, (b) French, and (c) German.
3. The English Language, English History, and Modern Geography.
4. Mathematics.
5. Natural Philosophy.
6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for June, 1880, are *Sallust*, *De Bello Jugurthino*; and, *Homer*, *Odyssey*, Book XI.

The Calendar may be seen on personal application to the Secretary for Education, Wellington, or to either of the under-named gentlemen:—Professor Shand, University of Otago, Dunedin; Professor Brown, Canterbury College, Christchurch; Rev. J. C. Andrew, Nelson College, Nelson; and Farquhar Macrae, Esq., Auckland College.

The Scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1881, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1881, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust, in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.

Notice of entry, with satisfactory testimonials as to personal character, and the London matriculation fee of £2, must be sent to the Secretary for Education, Wellington, so as to reach his office not later than the 1st September. Candidates are recommended to give still earlier notice by telegraph.
