Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-two, one number and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point situate in Section number four hundred and sixty-three, Township of Palmerston, Manchester Block, to a point in Subdivision ten, Section number one, all within the Provincial District of Wellington, Colony of New Zealand, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 7867, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

Declaring certain Lands to be the Nelson Creek Water-race.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation publicly notified and gazetted, declare any land therein specified, whether within or without, or partly within and partly without, a proclaimed gold field, to be a water-race; and may declare any stream therein specified to be taken for the purpose of supplying a water-race; and also that the Minister shall cause a map of such water-race to be

deposited in the Warden's Court of the district in which such land is; and such map shall be referred to in and shall form part of any such Proclamation:
And whereas, for the purpose of supplying with
water the Nelson Creek Gold Field, being a portion
of the proclaimed gold field known as the Nelson
South-West Gold Field, there has been constructed partly within and partly without such proclaimed old field a water-race, called the Nelson Creek Water-race, and a map thereof has been deposited as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the hereinbefore recited Acts, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the First Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby declared to be a water-race for the purposes of the said Acts, and shall be called the Nelson Creek Water race; and I declare that the several streams specified in the Second Schedule hereto are taken for the purpose of supplying such water-race, and that the lands over which the said water-race, known as the Nelson Creek Water-race, is constructed, are accurately specified in the First Schedule hereto, and in the map marked P.W.D. 6235, deposited as aforesaid.

Farndon Park Recreation-ground brought under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."

The University of London and the Gilchrist Scholarship.

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University June Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the "June examination" for New Zealand will be held at Christchurch, on Monday, the 6th September, and four

following days.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details specified under the several heads :-

1. Latin.

2. Any two of the following languages: -(a) Greek,

(b) French, and (c) German.3. The English Language, English History, and Modern Geography.

4. Mathematics

5. Natural Philosophy.6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for June, 1880, are Sallust, De Bello Jugurthino; and,

June, 1880, are Sallust, De Bello Jugurthino; and, Homer, Odyssey, Book XI.

The Calendar may be seen on personal application to the Secretary for Education, Wellington, or to either of the under-named gentlemen:—Professor Shand, University of Otago, Dunedin; Professor Brown, Canterbury College, Christchurch; Rev. J. C. Andrew, Nelson College, Nelson; and Farquhar Macrae Esa. Auckland College Macrae, Esq., Auckland College.

The Scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1881, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1881, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust, in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.
