

Regulations for the Public Prisons of the Colony, under "The Prisons Act, 1873," as to Jewish Sabbath, &c.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Prisons Act, 1873," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, make rules as to him shall seem fit touching the duties of the officers of public prisons, the treatment of the prisoners confined therein, and generally as may be necessary for the good management and government of such prisons, and from time to time to alter or revoke any such rules as aforesaid: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the eighteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, certain regulations were made for public prisons: And whereas it is expedient to alter such regulations:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from the first day of September next, the following regulation shall be in force within all the public prisons of the colony.

REGULATION.

Any prisoner who is a Jew is not to be compelled to labour on his Sabbath, or on any of the following sacred festivals :---

As the dates of these festivals vary, they will be communicated to those gaolers annually who intimate that they have Jewish prisoners in custody.

Proclamation of Boundaries of Wairau and Pelorus, and Queen Charlotte Sound Mining Districts.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Mines Act, 1877," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation, to constitute and appoint any portion of the Colony of New Zealand to be a mining district under the said Act, to assign boundaries to such district, to enlarge, contract, or otherwise alter such boundaries, and to declare by what local name every such district shall be designated; and, until the Governor shall otherwise order, every gold field proclaimed or constituted, at the time of the commencement of the said Act shall be and be deemed a mining district under the said Act:

And whereas certain portions of the Provincial District of Marlborough have from time to time been proclaimed gold fields and mining districts under the provisions of the Gold Fields Acts then in force, and under the provisions of "The Mines Act, 1877," by the Governor, and also by the Superintendents for the time being of Marlborough, under powers delegated to them by the Governor:

And whereas it is desirable to cancel all former Proclamations concerning the boundaries of the said gold fields, and to reproclaim the boundaries of mining districts in the said Provincial District of Marlborough:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by "The Mines Act, 1877," do hereby proclaim and order that the boundaries of the mining districts in the Provincial District of Marlborough shall include the land described in the First and Second Schedules hereunto annexed; and that the said mining districts shall be known and described by the local names hereunder given.

All former Proclamations concerning boundaries of Marlborough Gold Fields are hereby cancelled; and this Proclamation shall come into force from the date hereof.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

WAIRAU AND PELORUS MINING DISTRICT.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Marlborough, bounded towards the North by Sec-tion No. 32, Wakamarina Survey District, from the summit of the watershed between the Pelorus and Wakamarina Rivers to the Wakamarina River; thence by that river and by Sections Nos. 61, 60, and 1 of said survey district to the south-eastern corner of last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the south-western corner of Section No. 58; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 88, 94, and 77 of said survey district to Paul's Run; and thence by that run to the summit of the watershed between the Wakamarina and Kaituna Rivers: thence towards the East by the summit of the said watershed to the summit of the northern water-shed of the Onamalutu Creek; thence by that watershed to a point due north of the northern corner of Section No. 134, Onamalutu Survey Dis-trict; thence due south to the Onamalutu Creek, and thence by that creek to the Wairau River. and thence by that creek to the Wairau River: thence towards the South by that river to the Goulter River; thence towards the South-west by that river and the Ward's Pass Stream to Ward's Pass; thence towards the North-west by the summit of the watershed to Mount Rintoul; thence by the summit of the watershed between the Pelorus and Wairau Rivers to Mount Fishtail; thence by the summit of the watershed between the Pelorus and Wakamarina Rivers to Section No. 32 aforesaid : as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Blenheim.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

QUEEN CHARLOTTE SOUND MINING DISTRICT. ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Marlborough, bounded towards the North and North-west by Port Gore to Cape Jackson; towards the East by Queen Charlotte Sound to Section No. 111, in Torea Moua Bay; thence towards the West by that section to the summit of the watershed between Pelorus and Queen Charlotte Sounds; thence towards the West by the summit of that watershed over Mount Stokes to Titirangi Run; thence again towards the North by that run to Port Gore : excepting all freehold and Native lands within the aforesaid boundaries; as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Blenheim.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOE IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS it has been made to appear that certain things required to be done by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," in connection with the making and revision of the burgess lists or rolls of the Borough of North Invercargill, and the election of Councillors and Auditors of the said borough, could not be done by or within the time required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the twelfth section of the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby extend the time for the doing of the said things in connection with the burgess lists or rolls of the Borough of North Invercargill, and for holding the elections of Councillors and Auditors of the said borough; and doth declare that the times for the doing of such several things shall be those which are specified in the Schedule hereto annexed. Regulation. - District High School Fees, Invercargill.

HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of August, 1880.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Education Act, 1877," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby make the following regulation prescribing the fees to be paid by pupils for receiving instruction in higher education at the District High School hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

1. In the District High School at Invercargill the fees for higher education within the meaning of section 56 of "The Education Act, 1877," shall be ten shillings a quarter for not more than one subject, and five shillings a quarter for each subject in excess of one.

2. This regulation shall come into force upon the date hereof.

Incorporation of Taieri Agricultural Society.

HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of August, 1880. Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOE IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by "The Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Act, 1877," it is, among other things, enacted that, whenever any number of persons, not being less than fifty, shall have associated themselves together into a society for any of the purposes therein recited, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the petition of not fewer than twothirds of such persons, to incorporate the said petitioners, and the whole other persons at that time being members of the said society, and such persons as shall thereafter be admitted members thereof agreeably to the rules of the said society and the provisions of the aforesaid Act, into a body corporate, by a style and title to be named in the Order in Council incorporating the same :

And whereas a number of persons exceeding fifty have associated themselves together into a society for the purpose of promoting the advancement of agriculture, the improvement of live stock, and the

different branches of rural industry, and the arts therewith connected:

And whereas not fewer than two-thirds of such persons have presented a petition to the Governor in Council, praying for incorporation under the provisions of the said Act, as in the said petition more particularly mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in compliance with the terms of the said petition, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby incorporate the said petitioners, and the whole other persons now being members of the said society, and such persons as shall hereafter be admitted **me**mbers thereof agreeably to the rules of the said society and the provisions of the said Act, into a body corporate, by the style and title of "The Taieri Agricultural Society."

WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which, in his opinion, are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas by the one hundred and forty-fifth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said one hundred and forty-fourth section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by the several warrants the dates of which are specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and the notifications of which were published in the *Gazettes* specified in the fourth column, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the lands so temporarily reserved as aforesaid, and enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule, being the same purposes for which the said lands were so temporarily reserved as aforesaid. ~

POPULATION.—In the case of Nelson the population is given according to the estimate for January, 1879, as the local authorities have not yet supplied the information necessary to enable the estimate to be corrected. The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs :--The births were 298 in July, against 267 in June, an increase of 31. The deaths in July were 102, against 103 in June, a decrease of 1. There were 10 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards, viz., 3 males of 68, 73, and 78 at Auckland; 3 males of 74, 80, and 83, with 1 female of 80, at Wellington; 1 male of 67 and 1 female of 78 at Christchurch; and 1 male of 78 at Dunedin. Zymotic Diseases.--These diseases caused 12 deaths, or 11.76 per cent. of the total deaths in July, against 15 deaths or 14.56 per cent. in June. Constitutional Diseases.--The deaths from these diseases increased from 20 in June to 23 in July; the deaths from tubercular diseases having caused 20 deaths in July. against 14 in June.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases increased from 20 in June to 23 in July; the deaths from tubercular diseases having caused 20 deaths in July, against 14 in June. Local Diseases.—These diseases exhibited a marked increase in July, against the number in June; the deaths from these causes having amounted to 46 in July, against 38 in June. Of these, diseases of the respiratory organs caused 20 deaths in July, against 10 in June. Violent Deaths.—There was only 1 death under this class registered in the four boroughs during July, the number in June having been 13. The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
