WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Taranaki did, on the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said

WHEREAS by the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth sections of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may authorize any person to construct harbour works (other than the reclamation of land from the sea or any harbour, or the construction of any graving dock, dock, or breakwater in any harbour or in the sea) in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence:

And whereas the Mangawai District Highway Board desire to build a wharf in Mangawai Harbour, a harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence; and it having been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the said work will not be, or tend, to the injury of navigation:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize the said Mangawai District Highway Board to build in Mangawai Harbour, for the use and benefit of the public, a wharf in accordance with the plan and specification marked M.D. 417, and in the position shown on the plan marked M.D. 418, which plans are deposited in the office of the Marine Department, on the following conditions, that is to

That the right hereby conferred shall not exceed

the period of fourteen years

That it shall be lawful for the said Mangawai District Highway Board to levy wharfage on all goods landed or shipped from the said wharf, in accordance with the rates specified in the Schedule hereto: Provided however that nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to charge with wharfage

Any stores or goods required for the use of Her Majesty's naval or military forces, or for any ship in the naval service of any foreign

Goods of or for the service of Her Majesty in the colony:

Any goods under seizure by officers of revenue: The baggage of any person in the service of Her Majesty whilst travelling on duty. The rights and powers conferred under or by this

Order in Council may be resumed at any time by the Governor, on giving to the said Mangawai District Highway Board six months' previous notice of his intention so to do.

WHEREAS by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1870," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by warrant under his hand, from time to time to appoint polling-places for each electoral district within or within one mile of the limits thereof and the proof limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such pollingplaces to be the principal polling place for the district, and all or any of such polling-places from time to time to abolish, and, if he think fit, to appoint other polling-places in lieu of those abolished, and that every such warrant shall be published in the New Zealand Gazette: Provided always that no pollingplace shall be appointed by the Governor under the said Act unless he shall be first satisfied that the place to be appointed is more convenient than any other for at least twenty electors to record their votes thereat;

And whereas, by warrants under the hand of the Governor, certain places were appointed polling-places for the election of members of the House of Representatives for the Electoral District of Wakaia, one of which places was appointed a principal polling-place for the said district:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the same:
Now know ye that I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby abolish all the polling-places for the election of members of the House of Repre-sentatives for the Electoral District of Wakaia, and do also hereby abolish the above-mentioned principal polling-place for the said district.

SIE,-I have the honor to inform you, with reference to the Earl of Carnarvon's circular despatch of the 19th February, 1875, that the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have found themselves obliged to reduce, from seven to four, the number of nominations to naval cadetships placed annually at the disposal of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

2. I am informed by the Lords Commissioners that when the seven nominations were first offered to the colonies the total annual number of cadets entered for the navy was over 180, and that even last year there were as many as 83 entries; but, in order to prevent the lists of sub-lieutenants and lieutenants from exceeding the number required by the service, their Lordships have now been compelled to limit the future entry to 55 cadets annually.

3. As a part of the arrangements necessary to effect this reduction, it has been decided to deprive naval officers of most of the privileges hitherto awarded them, and it has become necessary to diminish the number of nominations given to the colonies; but, if the total number of cadets should again be increased, I should hope to obtain the proportion of nominations allotted to the colonies increased also.

4. I have to add that, as the number of nomina tions at my disposal will be so much reduced, you should be extremely careful to warn the friends of any candidate you may recommend that your application is necessarily made without any assurance that the Secretary of State will be able to give effect to your recommendation.

INNER ANCHORAGE, FLAT-TOP ISLAND.

Two white beacons are now placed on East Point, which, when kept in line, lead clear of the reef running out to the northward of Flat-top Island. Two similar beacons are also placed on the S.W. end of Flat-top Island, which, when in line, lead clear of, and to the westward of, the reef off Flat-top. These beacons will be lit up at night when necessary.

Directions by Day.—Masters of vessels intending to anchor to the westward of Flat-top should bring the white beacons on East Point in line bearing W. ½ S.; steer with these in line until two other beacons on Flat-top are also brought in line bearing S. ½ E, then haul up and steer S. by W., until the lighthouse on Flat-top bears S.E.; a vessel can then anchor in not less than 18 feet at low-water springs. Coasters or steamers of light draught can proceed a little closer in, where they will get better shelter during S.E. gales.

By Night.—Bring the two lights on East Point in line, and keep them in that position, until a light on the S.W. end of Flat-top Island opens out, then proceed as by day.
