Extending Time for furnishing Statements under "The Property Assessment Act, 1879."

JAMES PRENDERGAST, Administrator of the Government. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of September, 1880.

Present: HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by certain regulations contained in an Order in Council made and issued under "The Property Assessment Act, 1879" (herein called "the said Act"), it was, among other things, provided that the Commissioner should give not less than one calendar month's public notice in every property assessment district of the time and place at which all persons should be required to furnish statements of all real and personal property belonging to them, of all real and personal property belonging to them, as therein particularly mentioned : And whereas, in pursuance of the said regulations, and as otherwise required by law, the Commissioner gave public notice in each district constituted under the said Act, specifying the thirtieth day of June then next, as the time when all persons were required to furnish statements of all real and personal property belonging to them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: And whereas by the said Act it is provided that if any act, matter, or thing required by the said

Act to be made, performed, or done at or within a fixed time is not so made, performed, or done, the Governor in Council may appoint a further or other time for making, performing, or doing the same, although the time within which the same ought to have been done has elapsed or expired, and that any act, matter, or thing made performed, or done within the time prescribed by such Order in Council shall be as valid as if it had been made, performed, or done within the time fixed by or under the said Act: And whereas the statements of property required to be rendered pursuant to the said Act and regulations have not been furnished within the date so fixed as aforesaid, and it is expedient that a further time should be appointed for that purpose :

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Esquire, Chief Justice of the Colony of New Zealand, and Administrator of the Government thereof, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities contained in the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in this behalf enabling me, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby appoint the twenty-fifth day of October next as the time within which statements of property in each property assessment district shall be furnished in pursuance of the said Act, or any such regulations as aforesaid, or any amendment of the said Act or regulations respectively.

ORDER IN COUNCIL. At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of September, 1880.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made and issued under the provisions of "The Property Assessment Act, 1879," on the sixth day of April last past, certain forms of statements of real and personal property were prescribed by regulations made for that purpose: And whereas by "The Property Assessment Act Amendment Act, 1880," it is, among other things, enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in "The Property Assessment Act, 1879," the Governor in Council may from time to time prescribe the form in which any statement of pro-perty required by the aforesaid Act shall be furnished, and the particulars that shall be stated in relation to any such property: And whereas it is expedient that a form of statement of property should be prescribed under the provisions of the last in part recited Act:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Esquire, Chief Justice of the Colony of New Zealand, and Administrator of the Government thereof, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities contained in "The Property Assessment Act Amend-ment Act, 1880," and of all other powers and authorities in this behalf enabling me, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and prescribe that, from and after the fifteenth day of September instant, the form in which statements of property required by "The Property Assessment Act, 1879," shall be furnished is that set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that the particulars to be stated in relation to any such property are those indicated in the said form: Provided that where any person has, prior to the coming into operation of this Order in Council, furnished any statement of property under "The Property Assessment Act, 1879," or any regulations made thereunder, he shall not be required to furnish any further statement except in such manner and to such extent as may be required by law: Provided further that the extended period within which statements of property may be furnished, in pursuance of an Order in Council bearing even date herewith, shall apply to the form prescribed by this Order in Council.
