Declaring Land open for Sale within the Mining District of Westland.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fifty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any Crown lands within any mining district, not held under license or lease at the date of such Proclamation, or over which the license or lease has been cancelled, to be open for sale or selection, in sections of such size and form, and on such date, as he may determine; and any lands so proclaimed may hereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be, as Crown lands of the same class not within a mining district: And the Governor may from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the land specified in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale, and that the twenty-third day of October next ensuing shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for sale.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece of land, being 200 acres, more or less, situated in the Provincial District of Westland, being Block II., Poerua, and Block XIV., Wanganui, Survey Districts. Bounded towards the East by the road along the south side of the Wanganui River; towards the South by a straight line, 40 chains; towards the West by a straight line distant 40 chains from, and generally parallel with, road before mentioned; and towards the North by a straight line, 40 chains, parallel with south boundary; said last-mentioned boundary to commence 20 chains north from Ferguson Brothers' Stockyard: subject to necessary reserves, and exclusive of rights under "The Mines Act, 1877."

All that piece of land in the Provincial District of Westland, containing 75 acres, more or less, on the map of the Mahinapua Survey District, Block VII. Bounded towards the West by the road reserve along the sea-coast; towards the South by Section No. 1888; towards the East by Reserve No. 9 (in red), railway reserve; and towards the North by a line to include the quantity: subject to necessary reserves, and exclusive of all rights under "The Mines Act, 1877."

Allocating Liabilities of Invercargill Road District, and Boroughs of Avenal, Gladstone, and East, North and South Invercargill.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the ninth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, a portion of certain liabilities, amounting to the sum of one thousand five hundred and fifty pounds, incurred by the Invercargill Road District, were allocated to the said district

and to the Boroughs of Gladstone and North Invercargill: And whereas it is expedient to rescind such Proclamation, and to make other provision in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by the fourth section of "The Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," and all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby allocate the proportions of the said sum of one thousand five hundred and fifty pounds, borrowed on the security of the rates of the said Invercargill Road District, to be borne by the said district and the Municipal Corporations or boroughs named in the Schedule hereto; and do proclaim and declare that such proportions shall be those set opposite the names of the said Corporations or boroughs and the name of the said district in the said Schedule.

Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Dunedin, Port Chalmers, Waikouaiti, North Taieri, and East Taieri Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into six marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

BLUESKIN DISTRICT.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the East by the sea and Blueskin Bay from Brinn's Point to the road forming the western boundary of Block IV., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence by that boundary, and by Sections Nos. 1, 2, 3, 94, 4, 6, and 5, Block VI., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, and Section No. 76, Block VII., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; towards the South by

Section No. 59 of said Block VII. to Main North Road; thence across and by that road to Section No. 19, Block VII., aforesaid; thence by that section and by Section No. 4, Block XII., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; and thence by a right line to Trig. Station S, Swampy Hill; thence towards the West by a right line to Silver Peak; thence along the summit of the Silver Peak Range to Trig. Station R, Waikouaiti Survey District; thence towards the North to and by the nearest branch of the Mount Misery Creek to its confluence; thence by that creek to its confluence with the south branch of the Waikouaiti River; thence by that river to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section No. 9, Block VIII., Waikouaiti Survey District; thence to and by said Section No. 9, and by the Mountain Road, which forms the southern boundary of Sections Nos. 6, 3, and 2, Block VIII., and Section No. 84, Block II., Waikouaiti Survey District; thence by a road which forms the south-western boundary of Sections Nos. 56, 57, and 32 to Main North Road; thence across and by the Main North Road to Section No. 5; thence by that section and by Section No. 4 to a road which forms part of the southern boundary of said section 4, Block II.; thence by that road, which forms the southern boundary of Sections Nos. 9 and 48, Block III., Waikouaiti Survey District, and the western boundary of Sections Nos. 57 and 58, and the southern boundary of Sections Nos. 59 and 60, Block III., Waikouaiti Survey District, to the road which forms the south-western boundary of the Native Reserve; thence by that road to Brinn's Point, the starting point.

PORT CHALMERS DISTRICT.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North by the sea from the road which forms the eastern boundary of Block I., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, to the Otago Heads; towards the South-east and South by the Otago Harbour to Section No. 1, Upper Harbour West Survey District; thence by Section No. 1 aforesaid, and by Sections Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 1 of 35, Block IX., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, by Sections Nos. 86 and 87, North-East Valley Survey District; thence towards the West by Sections Nos. 41 and 40, Block VII., North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, to the Main North Road; thence across and by that road to Section No. 58, Block VII., aforesaid; and thence by the Blueskin Registration District, hereinbefore described, to the sea at the entrance of Blueskin Bay: including the adjacent islands.

DUNEDIN DISTRICT.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North and East by the Blueskin and Port Chalmers Registration Districts, hereinbefore described, from Trig. Station S, Swampy Hill, to the Otago Harbour; towards the South and again towards the North by the Otago Harbour; again towards the East and South by the sea to the mouth of the Kaikorai Creek; towards the West by that creek and Abbott's Creek to the road which forms the eastern boundary of Section No. 58, Block VII., Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; thence by the road which forms the boundary of said section, and Sections Nos. 2 of 2, 1 of 2, 3, 4, and 5, block aforesaid, Sections Nos. 15, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13, and its continuation through Sections Nos. 50 and 13, Block VI., Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District, to the Dunedin and North Taieri Road; thence by that road to the road which forms the eastern boundary of Section No. 8, Block IV., Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; thence by the road which forms the boundary of said Section

No. 8, and of Sections Nos. 9 and 10, Block IV., aforesaid; thence by the road which forms the boundary of Sections Nos. 2 of 25, 62, 24, 23, 22, 17, 16, and 13, Block V., Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District, to a point due west of Trig. Station S, Swampy Hill; and thence by a right line to Trig. Station S, the starting point.

NORTH TAIERI DISTRICT.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North by Allen Creek from its confluence with the Taieri River to its source; thence by a right line due east to the Silver Peak Ranges; thence towards the East by the Blueskin and Dunedin Registration Districts to the Dunedin and North Taieri Road; thence towards the South by that road, which forms the northern boundary of Sections Nos. 13, 12, 2 of 3, 1 of 3, 1 of 2, 1 of 1, to Section No. 1, Block XIII., Taieri Survey District; thence by Sections Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of said Block XIII., 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, Block V., 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, Block VI., 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, Block VII., 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, Block VIII., Taieri Survey District, to Irregular Block; thence by the road which forms the eastern boundary of Sections Nos. 64, 63, 81, and 80 of Irregular Block, 36 and 37, Taieri River Sections, and by the road through Section No. 38 to the Taieri River; and towards the West by the Taieri River to Allen Creek, the starting point.

EAST TAIERI DISTRICT.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North by the North Taieri Registration District, hereinbefore described; towards the East by the Dunedin Registration District, hereinbefore described, to the mouth of the Kaikorai Creek; towards the South-east by the sea to the Taieri River; towards the South and West by the Taieri River.

WAIKOUAITI DISTRICT.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North-west by Run No. 307, from the Taieri River to the southern boundary of Run No. 250; thence towards the North by a right line due east to intersect a right line drawn due south from the confluence of the Deepdell Stream with the Waihemo or Shag River; thence due North to the north branch of the Waikouaiti River; thence by that river to a point due west of Mount Pleasant; thence by a right line due east over Mount Pleasant to the Pleasant River, and by that river to the sea; towards the East by the sea to Brinn's Point; towards the South by the Blueskin Registration District and North Taieri Registration District, hereinbefore described, to the Taieri River; and towards the West by the Taieri River to Run No. 307, the starting point.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Dunedin, Port Chalmers, Waikouaiti, North Taieri, and East Taieri Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into six registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Blueskin, Port Chalmers, Dunedin, North Taieri, East Taieri, and Waikouaiti Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

BY virtue and in exercise of the power and authority enabling me in that behalf, conferred upon me by "The Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871," section eight, and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Waihemo Road District, in the County of Waikouaiti, in the said colony, shall be divided into three separate subdivisions, named respectively the Highlay, Flat Hill, and Green Valley Subdivisions, the boundaries whereof are respectively set forth in the Schedule hereto, and the said district is hereby subdivided accordingly from the day of the date hereof; and I do further proclaim that the number of members to be elected for each such subdivision shall be three, and that the members of the Road Board now in office assigned to each such subdivision shall be as follows:—

WHEREAS His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand has received the certificate required by the twenty-fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1871" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to the effect that Joseph Finnerty's Swamp Paddock, Otahuhu Road, in the North Auckland Cattle District, is free from the disease called pleuropneumonia:

Now, therefore, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand aforesaid, by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred upon him by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, doth hereby proclaim and declare the said Joseph Finnerty's Swamp Paddock, Otahuhu Road, in the North Auckland Cattle District, to be free from disease; and such place shall, from the eighteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, cease to be infected within the meaning of the said Act.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, the Wyndham Road District was divided into three subdivisions, and it is expedient to rescind such Proclamation and to make other provisions in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by "The Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, and do hereby proclaim that the Wyndham Road District shall be divided into three separate subdivisions, named respectively the Wyndham Township, Oware, and Redan Subdivisions, the boundaries whereof are

set forth in the Schedule hereto, and the said district is hereby subdivided accordingly from the date hereof; and I do further proclaim that the number of members to be elected for each such subdivision shall be three, and that the members of the Road Board now in office assigned to each such subdivision shall be as follow:—

To the Wyndham Township Subdivision: John Templeton.

To the Oware Subdivision: James Cushnie, John Rae, and John Carey Strangman.

To the Redan Subdivision: James Milne and Donald Stalker.

LYTTELTON.

DURING the dredging operations now in hand in the fairway at the entrance of the inner harbour, between the Two Moles, the masters of all vessels are cautioned to take the entrance to the westward of the dredge and her buoys, and to the west of the transporting buoy.
