JAMES PRENDERGAST, (L.S.) Administrator of the Government. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Council of a borough constituted under that Act may take any land within the borough for any of the purposes of that Act in the manner provided by the second part of "The Public Works Act, 1876" (hereinafter called "the said Act"): And whereas the Council of the Borough of Mornington, requiring to take the land described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of a road, has laid before me the memorial referred to by section twenty-five of the said Act, praying me to declare, by Proclamation, that such land is taken for such purpose:

And whereas the Council of the said borough has, in accordance with the twenty-eighth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," laid before me a statutory declaration that the said Council is authorized by law to undertake the work for which the land described in the memorial laid before me under section twenty-five of the said Act is re-quired, that all the provisions of the said Act as to taking such land have been complied with, and that the said Council are of opinion that the proposed works should be executed, and that no private injury will be done for which due compensation is not provided by the said Act:

Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," to be done and performed to authorize the taking of such land have been done and performed, and it is expedient to declare that such land is taken for the purpose aforesaid :

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it W is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal dis-bility of a lunatic in the governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit: And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that

in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said lastrecited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto, in the several blocks of land referred to therein, shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees, within the meaning and for the

Letter from Board of Trade on Inquiry into Strand-ing of "Sophia R. Luhrs."

Marine Department, Wellington, 27th September, 1880. THE following letter from the Board of Trade, together with the enclosure thereto, on the sub-ject of the inquiry into the stranding of the barque "Sophia R. Lubrs," is published for general infor-mation. H. A. ATKINSON.

Board of Trade (Marine Department), Whitehall Gardens, S.W., 6th July, 1880. Inquiries.

SIR,—With reference to the inquiry recently held at Wellington into the stranding of the barque "Sophia R. Luhrs" on a rock which the Court found was not marked on the Admiralty chart, I am directed by the Board of Trade to state that a copy of the report of the Court was forwarded to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and a copy of a letter containing their observations thereon is enclosed herewith.

Admiralty, 1st July, 1880. SIR,—I have laid before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty your letter of the 17th instant, M. 10926, forwarding copies of a report of inquiry held in New Zealand, and of a casualty return Wr. 1, relating to the stranding of the "Sophia R. Luhrs" on a sunken rock not marked on the Admiralty chart, half a mile S.E. of the reef on the western point of Lyall Bay. Cook Strait, New Zealand. point of Lyall Bay, Cook Strait, New Zealand.

2. In reply, I am to acquaint you, for the information of the Board of Trade, that it appears this vessel was running for Port Nicholson with a fresh fair wind, and was apparently hove-to off Lyall Bay to wait for the flood tide to work into the harbour, and, while hove to, drifted on to a rock, the lead not being used. The rock is stated in these papers to be half a mile S.E. from the end of the reef on the west side of Lyall Bay; but from information published by the New Zealand Government it is described as being but one and a half cables E. by S. from the end of that reef.

3. The Court of Inquiry held at Wellington ex-onerates the master from blame on the ground that the rock was not defined on the chart, but adds that he had not acted prudently.

4. It appears to my Lords that the question of the chart had little, if anything, to do with the casualty in question.

The master was not justified in making so free with such a reef-bound coast as that westward of

Port Nicholson without using the lead; and if the directions in "The New Zealand Pilot" had been more closely followed, the vessel should not have come within a mile of the point eastward of Sinclair Head.

5. My Lords will cause the charts to be amended accordingly, and a notice to mariners issued. I have, &c., E. N. SWAINSON.

3. A fixed white light if shown from the extreme (western) end of the inner pier of the harbour.

NOTE.—The foregoing green and red lights mark the channel into the port. Entering Port Ibraham the green lights are left on the port hand, the red lights on the starboard hand, the vessel being steered

for the white light on the inner pier. 4. Also that it is intended, when the state of the sea prevents the exhibition of the floating lights, to show two lights, green and red placed vertically, from the eastern commencement of the inner pier. These lights kept in line with the white light at the extreme (or western) end of the pier will then indicate the channel.
