Land taken for a Portion of the Foxton to New Plymouth Railway—Branch Line from Bunnythorpe to Woodville (portion of).

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of a portion of the branch line of railway from Bunnythorpe to Woodville from the main line, Foxton to New Plymouth, being one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1879," was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said portion of the said branch line of railway and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas "The Public Works Act, 1879," enacts that such of the railways mentioned therein as are unfinished may be completed under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and "The Public Works Act, 1879:" And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for a portion of the said branch line of railway:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the sixth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of every power and authority in that behalf, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule

hereto is taken for the said portion of the said branch line of railway.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 83 acres, more or less, situate in the Survey District of Gorge, Provincial District of Wellington, being a portion of the Manchester Block, commencing at a Government block on the bank of the Pohangina River. WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the

Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Hawke's Bay did, on the fifteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

THE following provision in "The Customs Tariff Act, 1880," relating to playing-cards is published for general information:—

Section 8. Every pack of playing-cards imported or cleared from any warehouse after the passing of this Act shall be stamped or marked in such manner as the Commissioner of Customs may direct.

Any person who sells, uses, or has possession of any pack of cards so imported and cleared, and not so stamped or marked, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding fifty pounds.

In pursuance of this provision, stamps for stamping playing-cards have been provided at Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, and Dunedin, and the Collectors of Customs at those ports have been instructed to stamp any duty-paid stocks of cards which may be sent to them by dealers or others from any part of the colony within a reasonable time after the date of this notification.

Revoking Commissioner's Order No. 132, and making Regulations prescribing Time and Manner in which Payment of Beer Duty shall be made.

CUSTOMS.—In exercise of the power in me for this purpose vested by "The Beer Duty Act, 1880," I, the Commissioner of Customs, do hereby revoke the Commissioner's Order No. 132, dated the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and I do hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof:—

The duty leviable under "The Beer Duty Act, 1880," shall, until notification be gazetted stating that beer duty stamps have been prepared and are ready for use, be collected in manner following:—

Every brewer or his authorized agent shall, day by day, pay in cash to the Collector of the district in which his brewery is situated the duty chargeable on all beer sold or removed for consumption or sale from his brewery during the previous day; or, provided he lodges with the Collector a sum by way of deposit sufficient to cover the amount of duty payable weekly, he may pay the duty once a week.

Every brewer or his authorized agent, on tendering the duty payable by him, shall give to the Collector a statement in duplicate setting forth the number, sizes, and contents, in imperial gallons, of the several casks of beer sold or removed from his brewery for consumption or sale since the date when he last paid duty on beer so sold or removed; and on every such statement shall make and sign, in the presence of the Collector or a Justice of the Peace, a declaration in the following form, or to the effect thereof:—

I, _____, do hereby declare that the particulars given above state truly the actual quantity of beer sold, or removed for consumption or sale from the brewery, owned by _____, at _____, in the County [or Borough] of _____, from the day of _____ to the day of _____, 188

These regulations shall take effect from the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.
