Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice of the Colony of New Zealand, and Administrator of the Government thereof, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point on the Ohanghi Road to a point on the from a point on the Ohanghi Road to a point on the east side of the road to Tawhiti, all within the Hawera Survey District, County of Patea, Provincial District of Taranaki, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 7890, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme

Court at New Plymouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki.

further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice of the Colony of New Zealand, and Administrator of the Government thereof, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby pro-claim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point situate in Road Reserve one thousand and eighty-one, in the Oxford Road District, to a point in Road Reserve four hundred and thirteen, in the Malvern Road District, all within the County of Ashley, Provincial District of Canterbury, Colony of New Zealand, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 7967, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Christchurch, in the Provincial District of Canterbury.

WHEREAS by section seven of an Ordinance of the Province of Wellington intituled "The Highways Act, 1874," it is enacted that the Superintendent may from time to time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, divide any district or districts into two or more new districts, and the same in like manner from time to time to subdivide, alter, or reunite: And whereas the powers, duties, and functions vested in the Superintendent by the said Ordinance are, by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," now vested in the Governor: And whereas all things have happened and been performed to entitle the Governor to issue this Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice of the Colony of New Zealand, and Administrator of the Government thereof, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said recited Ordinance and Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date hereof, the portion of the Manawatu Highway District defined in the First Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby separated from the said district, and constituted into a new highway district, by the name of the "Foxton Highway District;" and such district shall have the boundaries set forth in the said First Schedule: And, in further exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, I do hereby divide the said Foxton Highway District into five wards, the names and boundaries whereof are set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Wellington, bounded towards the North by a right line from a point on the sea-coast where the production of the northern boundary-line of Section No. 321 of Block XIII., Te Kawau Survey District, intersects highwater mark, to the north-western corner of said section; thence by a road-line forming the northern boundary line of Sections Nos. 321, 322, and 323 of said Block XIII., and a railway reserve in Block XIV.; thence by the railway-line to the Oroua River; towards the East by that river and the Manawatu River; towards the West by the ocean to starting point: excepting therefrom the Foxton Local Board District, as described in the Wellington Provincial Gazette No. 23, of 1873: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the District Survey Office, Wellington.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

POPULATION.—In the case of Nelson the population is given according to the estimate for January, 1879, as the local authorities have not yet supplied the information necessary to enable the estimate to be corrected. In the other cases the estimates are for the lat January, 1880.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 497, against 485 in September, being a decrease of 12. The deaths amounted to 119 in October, a decrease of 45 on the number for September.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 70; females, 49. 44 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 86.97 per cent. of the whole number; 29 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—
The births were 268 in October, against 270 in September, a decrease of 2.
The deaths in October were 77, against 90 in September, a decrease of 13.
There were 3 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards, viz., 1 male of 67 and 1 female of 72 at Auckland; and 1 female of 80 at Wellington.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths in the 4 boroughs in October from these diseases only amounted to 8; of these, 4 were caused by typhoid fever, viz., 3 in Dunedin and 1 in Christchurch, and 2 from diarrhose, both in Dunedin.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths from these causes increased from 10 in September to 18 in October; of these, the deaths from phthisis increased from 7 to 15.

Local Diseases.—These diseases caused 34 deaths in September, against 41 in October. The deaths from diseases of the nervous system were 9 in September and 11 in October; from diseases of the respiratory organs, 14 in September and 13 in October; and from diseases of the digestive organs, 7 in September and 6 in October.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
