A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of a further portion of the railway from Napier to a junction with the railway from New Plymouth to Waitara at Sentry Hill, passing by Pakipaki, Waipawa, Waipukurau, Takapau, the Manawatu Gorge, Bunnythorpe, and Wanganui, with a branch from the main line at Bunnythorpe to Foxton through Palmerston, being one of the railways specified in the said Act, was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Plymouth, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said further portion of the said line of railway and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas the line of railway from Foxton to New Plymouth is the same railway as that referred to in the Proclamation hereinabove recited, and is one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1879," and it is enacted by the Act last named that such of the railways mentioned therein as are unfinished may be completed under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and "The Public

Works Act, 1879:" And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for the said further portion of the railway from Foxton to New Plymouth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the sixth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of every power and authority in that behalf, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the said further portion of the line of railway herein last above named.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:"

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Electric Telegraph Act, 1875," and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, make the regulation contained in the Schedule hereto in relation to the charges to be made for the transmission of Press telegrams; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby order and declare that such regulation shall take effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and that it shall be read with and form part of the regulations now in force, in substitution of any previous regulation in force of a similar purport.

The following shall be the charges to be paid in respect of the transmission of telegrams, generally known as "Press telegrams," on and after the 1st January, 1881:—

Newspapers publishing before 5 p.m. will be allowed to receive at any period of the day telegrams amounting in the aggregate to 1,000 words during the recess and 1,500 words during the session of Parliament, and will be charged for the same at evening rates. Any excess over 1,000 and 1,500 words respectively to be paid for at the rates in force between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

*Consent to Town Land in Otago being classed as Suburban.*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the thirty-ninth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Land Board, subject to the approval of the Governor, at any time and from time to time, to declare, by notice in the *Gazette*, that any land not already classified shall belong to either of the classes referred to in the thirty-eighth section of the said Act; and also that any land shall cease to belong to either of the said classes, provided that no land which has been declared to be town or suburban land shall cease to belong to such classes respectively, without the consent previously obtained of the Governor in Council:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago is desirous of declaring that the lands specified in the Schedule hereto, which have been heretofore classed as town lands, shall cease to belong to such class, and shall be classed as suburban lands:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby consent to the Land Board aforesaid declaring that the lands specified in the Schedule hereto shall cease to be classed as town lands, and doth hereby approve and consent to the said Board declaring that such lands shall be classed as suburban lands.

*Regulations for the Licensing and Management of Slaughterhouses and Inspection thereof, and of Cattle intended for Slaughter, in the County of Eden.*

THE following regulations made by the Bench of Magistrates under "The Slaughterhouses Act, 1877," for the County of Eden, are published for general information.

THOMAS DICK.

IN pursuance of the provisions of "The Slaughterhouses Act, 1877," the Bench of Magistrates of the County of Eden do hereby order as follows, that is to say,—

*Interpretation.*

1. Wherever in these regulations any of the terms mentioned in section 5 of the said Act are used, such terms shall, in the construction hereof, have the meaning to them assigned by the said section of the said Act as amended by the second section of "The Slaughterhouses Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," unless there be something in the context or subject-matter repugnant thereto.

*Fee for Slaughterhouse License.*

2. There shall be paid to the Clerk of the Bench in respect of every license issued by the Bench for a slaughterhouse the sum of ten pounds, and a like sum in respect of the renewal of such licenses.

*New Licenses.*

3. Applications for new licenses shall be in the form given in the Schedule hereto annexed, and shall be posted or delivered to the Clerk to the Bench at least five weeks before the day fixed for hearing the same.

*Hearing Applications for New Licenses.*

4. On receipt of the application as aforesaid, the Resident Magistrate having jurisdiction to hear the said application shall appoint a time and place for the hearing thereof, and shall return the application with notification of time and place of hearing to the applicant: Provided that the date fixed for hearing the application shall allow the applicant time to advertise notice as required by section 24 of the said Act.

*Renewal of Licenses.*

5. Every applicant for the renewal of any license shall deposit an application in writing, in the form given in the Schedule annexed, with the Clerk to the Bench, at least fourteen clear days before the sitting of the Bench at which such application for renewal shall be heard and determined.

*Transfer of License.*

6. Any license to slaughter may be transferred by the Bench to another licensee on payment of a sum of two pounds, the same notice to be given as is hereinbefore provided in the case of application for renewals.

No Slaughterhouse within Three Chains of the Road.

7. No license shall be granted for any slaughterhouse situated within three chains of any main or district road, used as a public road.

Cattle fed and watered.

8. Every slaughterhouse shall at all times be provided with a sufficient supply of fresh water, and all cattle confined in the premises thereof, or in any yard or enclosure connected therewith, shall be properly fed and watered at least once in every twenty-four hours.

Slaughterhouses, &c., to be kept Clean.

9. Every keeper of a slaughterhouse shall at all times keep the same, and the premises connected therewith, and the appurtenances thereto belonging, in a clean state, and free from offensive effluvia; and shall cause the internal walls and doors of any building used for slaughtering in to be scraped and lime-washed at least once each month, and in all respects to the satisfaction of any Inspector appointed or to be appointed under the said Act; and every such keeper of a slaughterhouse shall so dispose of the blood, offal, drainage, and other refuse-matter therefrom, that the same shall not create a nuisance, nor be offensive to persons residing or being in or passing through the neighbourhood of such slaughterhouse; and no such keeper shall permit any blood, offal, drainage, or refuse-matter to accumulate in, upon, or about the same, or on the premises connected therewith, or to flow, fall, or be thrown, or put into any river, stream, drain, or watercourse.

Vehicles to be kept clean.

10. All carts or other vehicles used for carrying meat from any slaughterhouse shall be kept clean, and be provided with suitable cloths for covering any meat therein. The Inspector shall have power to forbid the placing of meat in any unfit cart or vehicle.

Persons employed subject to control of Inspector.

11. All persons employed in any slaughterhouse licensed by the Bench shall be bound to obey the reasonable orders of the Inspector.

Fees for Inspection of Cattle.

12. There shall be paid to such Inspector as aforesaid by every keeper of a slaughterhouse in respect of cattle slaughtered therein the fees following, that is to say: For all large cattle, the sum of three-pence for every head thereof; and for all small cattle, the sum of fourpence for every dozen head, or fractional part thereof, in each week.

Inspector may forbid killing any Cattle.

13. The Inspector may forbid the slaughtering of any animal in any licensed place in case such animal shall not be in a fit state for being slaughtered through disease or otherwise.

Penalties.

14. Every person who shall commit a breach of these regulations shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

WITH reference to the existence of a shoal reported in lat.  $1^{\circ} 12\frac{1}{2}'$  S., long.  $108^{\circ} 43\frac{1}{2}'$  E, on which the British ship "Gwalia" was totally wrecked on 15th February, 1880, the British Hydrographic Office has notified that the following further particulars have been received from Lieutenant and Commander W. H. J. Nowell, H.M. ship "Foxhound," resulting from an examination of the locality made in May, 1880:—

This danger (Gwalia Reef) is of coral formation, nearly circular in shape, and about half a mile in diameter; the general depths over it are from 3 to 4 fathoms, but there are two patches, breaking at low water, on which the least depth found was 4 feet. The reef lies with the following bearings, viz.:

Carinata Peak, S. 34° E.; Panambungan North Peak, S. 81° E. Position as given, lat. 1° 3' S.; long. 108° 33' E.

During the "Foxhound's" stay the current set W.S.W. from one to two knots per hour; the rise of tide was observed to be about 7 feet, one high and one low water occurring in the twenty-four hours.

POPULATION.—In the case of Nelson the population is given according to the estimate for January, 1879, as the local authorities have not yet supplied the information necessary to enable the estimate to be corrected. In the other cases the estimates are for the 1st January, 1880.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 453, against 497 in October, being a decrease of 44. The deaths amounted to 127 in November, an increase of 8 on the number for October.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 74; females, 53. 50 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 39.37 per cent. of the whole number; 34 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 239 in November, against 268 in October, a decrease of 29.

The deaths in November were 74, against 77 in October, a decrease of 3.

There were 9 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards, viz., 1 male of 72 and 1 of 80 years, also 1 female of 93, at Auckland; 2 males of 70 and 79 at Wellington; 1 male of 80 at Christchurch; and 1 male of 69, with 2 females of 65 and 67, at Dunedin.

*Zymotic Diseases.*—The deaths from these diseases increased from 8 in October to 14 in November, and the percentage to the total deaths from 10.39 to 18.92. There was 1 death from scarlet fever (at Christchurch) in November, but no death occurred in the four boroughs from typhoid fever. The deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea increased from 2 to 5. These diseases may be expected to prove more fatal during the ensuing hot months of the year.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—The deaths from these causes decreased from 13 to 14; of these, deaths from phthisis decreased from 15 to 8. There were 3 deaths from cancer in November.

*Local Diseases.*—These diseases caused 29 deaths in November, against 34 in October. There was a slight decrease in deaths from diseases of the nervous system, and a decrease of 6 in the deaths from diseases of the respiratory system.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
