ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of December, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Education Act, 1877," the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, doth

make the regulation hereto annexed in relation to the employment in schools of pupil-teachers who have passed their final examination but are not certificated; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this order shall take effect from the date hereof.

REGULATION.

THE Minister of Education may, on application being made to him by any Education Board, grant to any person who shall have served as pupil-teacher under such Board for a term of three years or more, and who shall have passed the final examination of the pupil-teachers' course as prescribed by such Board, a district license tenable for two years from the date at which the aforesaid final examination was passed, and during such two years such district license shall, within the education district of the Board by which such application shall have been made, have the force of a certificate granted under "The Education Act, 1877."

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto was reserved as a site for a pound: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, it is expedient to vest the said land in the Wallace County Council:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the sixth section of "The Public Reserves Act Amendment Act, 1878," doth hereby declare that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the said reserve shall become vested in the Chairman, Councillors, and inhabitants of the Wallace County, in trust, for a pound.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eleventh section of "The Public

Reserves Act, 1877," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Auckland, and known as the Palmerston North Recreation-ground, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," and its amending Acts; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of December, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860.":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five, and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Palmerston North Domain Board:—

GEORGE MATTHEW SNELSON,  
HENRY MCNEILL,  
JOHN JAMES WALDEGRAVE,  
JAMES LINTON, and  
JOHN RICHTER

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the Town Hall, Palmerston North, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall

be held on Monday, the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME,  
AND TO THE HONORABLE SIR WILLIAM FOX,  
K.C.M.G., GREETING:

WHEREAS for the purpose of giving effect to "The West Coast Settlement (North Island) Act, 1880," it is expedient that a Commission should issue, and that some fit and proper person should be appointed with the powers and authorities hereinafter particularly set forth: Now, therefore, know ye that I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, having full confidence in your knowledge, ability, and integrity, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, appoint you, the said William Fox, to be a Commissioner for the purposes and with the several powers and authorities hereinafter mentioned.

1. Within the confiscated territory, as the same is defined by the hereinbefore-mentioned Act, to allocate and set aside such lands as may be legally available in satisfaction of all or any awards made by the Compensation Courts held under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," or any amendment thereof, in so far as in your judgment such awards or any of them have not been performed and are still unsatisfied: Provided, however, that the authority hereby conferred upon you shall not extend to cases where the lands in respect of which such awards were made have been returned to the former Maori owners, nor where the interests of any such former owners in or under any such awards have been purchased by or on behalf of the Crown, or where such interests have been released or extinguished; but this proviso shall not be held to prevent you from subdividing between the hapus or individuals interested in it any block of land heretofore set apart, reserved, returned to, or promised to any tribe or section of a tribe.

2. Also within the said territory to allocate and set aside such lands as may be legally available in satisfaction of all promises or engagements made by or on behalf of Her Majesty or the Government of the colony which have formed the subject of inquiry by the Commissioners appointed under "The Confiscated Lands Inquiry and Maori Prisoners Trials Act, 1879."

3. In respect of such lands, or any of them, to define and mark out such reserves as may be necessary to give effect to any such award, promise, or engagement, and to indicate the purposes and objects of such reserves, and whether the same should be alienable or inalienable.

4. In all cases in which you shall exercise the powers conferred by these presents, you are required to define and ascertain with certainty the particular lands in respect of which action is taken by you, and the name or names of the person or persons to whom such lands are to be granted: Provided that where the intended grantees of such lands are not the persons originally entitled or intended to be benefited, or where they are representatives of the persons originally entitled or intended to be benefited, then that it shall be clearly apparent in what character or capacity such persons are to take the lands dealt with.

5. And, in further pursuance of the power aforesaid, where lands are proposed to be vested in Trustees on behalf of any tribe or subdivision thereof, that you distinctly ascertain and name the persons who are to be Trustees or to whom any grant of such land is to be made, and the trusts to which the same ought to be subject, or any conditions or limitations which ought to be provided for to render such grant effectual.

6. And generally in the premises you are hereby empowered to make all such inquiries and investigations, and to hear and determine all such questions, as may be necessary to give full effect to this Commission.

7. And for the purposes of this Commission you are hereby empowered to call before you and examine on oath or otherwise, as may be allowed by law, all such person or persons as you may think able to afford you any information in relation to the premises; and also to require any person or persons to bring before you and produce in evidence (saving all just exceptions) any books, papers, deeds, plans, or documents of which any Court of law might compel the production.

8. You shall also have full power and authority to employ such surveyors, clerks, interpreters, and other persons as you may deem necessary for your assistance in the premises.

9. And you are hereby required from time to time to report to me in writing under your hand the several acts and proceedings done and taken by you under the authority of these presents.

10. And, lastly, it is hereby declared that this Commission shall continue in force for the period of twelve calendar months from the date hereof (unless the same shall be previously determined by the disposal of the matters herein intrusted to you, or by the revocation of these presents), and that you may proceed in the execution of this Commission at any place or places in the colony, and although any inquiry be not regularly continued from time to time by adjournment

*Authorizing the taking and laying down of Roads in Wellington.*

A. GORDON, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Crown Grants Act, 1866," it is enacted that whenever roads or rights of roads have been or hereafter may be reserved in any Crown grants, but such roads or the particular part or portions of the land comprised in the grant over which the road is to be or may be taken have not been or may not be specifically described in the body of the grant and laid down from survey on the plan in the margin thereof, or endorsed thereon or attached thereto, such Crown grants, if otherwise duly and legally executed, shall be and be taken to have been as valid and effectual to all intents and purposes as if the said road or part of the land over which the right of road was to be taken had been specifically described and laid down as aforesaid on the said grant before the execution of the same, any law or practice to the contrary notwithstanding; and it is also thereby enacted that all such reservations made before or after the passing of the said Act shall be valid and effectual to all intents and purposes, provided always that the right of taking a road through any section shall only be exercised within five years after the issue of the grant, and, with regard to grants issued before the passing of the said Act, within three years from the coming into operation of the said Act; and it is also thereby enacted that in any case where allowances have been or shall be made in land or remission of purchase-money in respect of such reservation of road, the road to be taken shall in no case exceed the amount of land allowed or the amount the purchase-money whereof shall have been or shall be remitted as aforesaid; and it is also thereby enacted that whenever such road or roads shall have been taken and laid down in manner aforesaid on the land comprised in any such grant by any person legally authorized in that behalf, the land conveyed by the grant shall be deemed, from the date of the laying down of such road, to be all the land therein described to be granted, with the exception of the part thereof taken for such road, which part shall be deemed to be vested in Her Majesty, her heirs and successors:

And whereas it is expedient that a fit and proper person should be authorized to take and lay down roads over the lands specified in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby authorize

JOHN COOM,

Engineer, of Wellington, to take and lay down roads over the lands specified in the Schedule hereto, and for that purpose to exercise all such powers as by the said sections of the said Act may be exercised by a person legally authorized in that behalf under the said sections of the said Act.

*Alterations and Additions to the Rates for the Conveyance, Delivery, and Storage of Goods, Parcels, &c., on the New Zealand Railways.*

IN accordance with the By-laws for the New Zealand Railways, fixed by Order in Council dated the 17th December, 1878, the following alterations and additions to the rates for the conveyance, delivery, and storage of goods, parcels, &c., on all the New Zealand Railways, are hereby declared to be fixed and to come into force from the 3rd January, 1881 :—

## CLASS K.—TIMBER.

*Sawn Timber, Squared Logs, and Mouldings.*

Timber carried in single wagons, minimum quantity, 1,200 superficial feet for distances of 75 miles and under; 2,000 superficial feet for distances over 75 miles. Where a check wagon is used it will be charged for. Timber carried in timber trucks, minimum, 2,000 superficial feet per pair of trucks for distances of 75 miles and under; minimum, 4,000 superficial feet per pair of trucks for distances over 75 miles. Where a check wagon is used it will be charged for.

Any less quantity which can be carried in one truck will be charged as such minimum, or at 1d. per 100 superficial feet per mile; where this rate is charged, the minimum quantity will be 100 feet; and the minimum charge 1s. 3d. per 100 superficial feet, without further charge for loading or unloading.

The minimum charge for each consignment will be 2s. 6d.

Instead of the classified rates, timber for 225 miles and over will be charged as follows, viz. : 4s. 6d. per 100 superficial feet for distances of 225 miles, and  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per 100 superficial feet per mile will be added for every additional mile, subject to all conditions and regulations applying to the conveyance of timber.

Mouldings will be carried solely at owners' risk.

In computing the charges for timber, 25 feet or under in excess of any multiple of 100 are to be foregone; over 25 feet to be charged as the next 100.

Australian and Tasmanian timbers will be charged at a rate and a half; any quantity less than the minimum will be charged as such minimum at a rate and a half, or as ordinary timber at the rate for small lots.

Round timber, measurement, as follows :—The average girth in inches to be squared and divided by 152, the result to be multiplied by length in feet which will give the contents of the log in superficial feet. No allowance to be made for bark by "ringing" or otherwise, or for tops, butts, or unsound wood.

All sawn timber from half-inch to one will be taken as inch stuff in computing the measurement.

Half-inch and under will be taken as half the amount of inch stuff.

One hundred palings, or 1,000 shingles, as 100 feet timber.

All loading and unloading must be done by the owner.

For each loading or unloading done by the railway, 3d. per 100 feet additional will be charged.

Where senders who do their own loading require a receipt for number of pieces, 3d. per 100 feet superficial additional will be charged, as if loading had been done by the Department.
