WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:" Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by

1. 2. The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. POPULATION.—In the case of Nelson the population is given according to the estimate for January, 1879, as the local authorities have not yet supplied the information necessary to enable the estimate to be corrected. In the other cases the estimates are for the 1st January, 1880. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 400, against 439 in January, being a decrease of 39. The deaths amounted to 162 in February, an increase of 8 on the number for January. Of the above deaths, males contributed 92; females, 70. 101 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 62:35 per cent. of the whole number; 91 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs :--The births were 210 in February, against 232 in January, a decrease of 20. The deaths in February were 50, against 87 in January, an increase of 3. There were 5 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: a male of 65 and a female of 72 died at Auckland; a male of 66 at Wellington; a female of 79 at Christchurch; and a male of 65 at Dunedin. Zymotic Diseases.--The deaths from these diseases increased from 31 in January to 40 in February. Of these, the deaths from dysentery and diarrhœa increased from 19 to 28. The deaths in Wellington from that cause increased from 5 to 12; all of the 12 deaths were of children not exceeding 1 year. Diphtheria caused one death at Dunedin; measles one death in Wel-lington; and scarlatina 1 death in Auckland. There were two deaths from typhoid fever, 1 at Auckland and 1 at Christchurch. *Constitutional Diseases.*--These diseases caused 11 deaths in February, against 12 in January. Of the 11 deaths, 8 were attributed to phthisis.

attributed to phthisis. Local Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases were less numerous by 2 than in the previous month: 25 in January, 23 in February. Heart disease, however, caused 6 deaths in February, against 3 in January, and diseases of the digestive organs caused 8 deaths in February, against 4 in January; but diseases of the respiratory organs caused 1 death in February, against 6

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the sensor on health. condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
