Extending Boundaries of Borough of Invercargill.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the twenty-fifth section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, incorporate into a borough any district adjacent thereto not being part of an existing borough, subject to certain conditions therein particularly specified: And whereas the Governor did, on the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, cause a notice setting forth the boundaries of the district described in the First Schedule hereto to be published in the Borough of Invercargill and in the said district that it was proposed to incorporate into the aforesaid borough the said district: And whereas two months have elapsed since the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, above-mentioned, and no petition has been presented to the Governor praying that such district or part thereof should not be incorporated into the said borough:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and of every other power and authority in that behalf me enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district the boundaries whereof are specified in the First Schedule hereto is hereby incorporated into the Borough of Invercargill and added to the North Ward of the said borough, and that the boundaries of the said borough shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, containing 200 acres, more or less, being Section No. 22 of Block I., Invercargill Hundred; and bounded on the North by Section No. 24 of said

block, 914 links, and Section No. 23 of aforesaid block, 3079 links; on the East by a public road, 5008 links; on the South by a public road, 3993 links; and on the West by a public road, 5008 links.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and the House of Representatives of the said colony, No. 57, of 1880, entitled "An Act to legalize the Marriage of a Man with the Sister of his Deceased Wife," was presented to the Governor of the said colony for Her Majesty's assent, and the said Bill was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, do, by this Proclamation, signify and proclaim to all whom it may concern that the said Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-nine of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that, where the Trustees of any public cemetery, or the Trustees, Managers, or other persons having the care and control of any other cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial heretofore established, shall be desirous of adopting the provisions of this Act, or any of them, in the place of any Act or Ordinance, or any provisions of such Act or Ordinance, heretofore regulating the management of any such last-mentioned cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial, the said Trustees, Managers, or other persons may apply to the Governor in Council in that behalf, who may thereupon cause inquiry to be made in such manner as he shall think fit as to the desirability of granting such petition, and the Governor may, by Order in Council, direct that the provisions of this Act, or any of them, shall come into force in

respect of any such cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial, or he may reject any such application :

And whereas the Trustees of the Marton Public Cemetery have applied to the Governor to bring the said cemetery under the provisions of the said Act, and due inquiry has been made in pursuance of the said thirty-ninth section as to the desirability of granting such petition :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and direct that all provisions of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," shall come into force in respect of the public cemetery at Marton, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and known as the Marton Cemetery, as the same is described in the Schedule hereto; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me, I do, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, order and direct that this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof.

Further Rules under the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1877.

THE following rules, issued by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of section 152 of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1877, are published for general information.

THOMAS DICK.

Rules by Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner of the Western Pacific, with the advice and assistance of the Chief Justice of Fiji, under Section 152 of the Western Pacific Order in Council, 1877, in regard to Arbitration and Reconciliation, and other Purposes.

WHEREAS it is desirable to promote the objects contemplated by sections 131, 132, 133, and 134 of the Western Pacific Order in Council, 1877, and also the practical working of other sections of the said order, the following rules are hereby made by Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, with the advice and assistance of the Chief Justice of Fiji, as authorized by section 152 of said order:—

1. When any British subject within the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner's Court, and in an island where there is no Deputy Commissioner, desires to take advantage of the sections of the Western Pacific Order in Council before recited regarding arbitration and reconciliation, and to leave the settlement of disputes and reconciling of differences to the arbitration or friendly settlement of the officer commanding any of Her Majesty's ships or schooners cruising within the waters of the Western Pacific, such officer, upon receiving from the person who would be plaintiff in an action, a writing under his hand intimating the nature of his claim and his willingness to refer the matter to the arbitration of the said officer, shall have the powers of a Registrar of the High Commissioner's Court to issue a writ of summons under section 59 of the said order to be served on the defendant.

2. If the defendant, being a British subject, shall, upon such writ of summons being served, intimate by writing under his hand that he accepts of the arbitration of the said officer, then the questions at issue between the parties shall be held to have been referred by the Court to the arbitration of such officer, but it shall not be held to have been so referred by a rule of Court so as to make sections 310 to 321 of the Schedule to the said order apply to the proceedings.

3. It shall be the duty of the said officer at the earliest available opportunity to transmit to the Registrar of the High Commissioner's Court a duplicate of the writ of summons issued by him, and the award made by him, and any application by the parties to have a decree of the Court in conformity with the award.

4. The said officer shall, for the purposes of section 133 of said order, be a Commissioner of the High Commissioner's Court in any island where no Deputy Commissioner resides, with full powers to promote the reconciliation, and encourage and facilitate the settlement of the cases contemplated in the said section.

5. Where a British subject within the jurisdiction of the Court has a complaint to make of assault, or of any other offence not amounting to felony, and being of a private or personal character, such as is contemplated by section 133, which he is willing to have settled under the powers of said section, he may apply to such officer for a summons under section 198 against the person complained of, and such officer shall have the powers of a Registrar of the High Commissioner's Court to issue such summons, and, on the defendant appearing, to proceed as a Commissioner of the High Commissioner's Court to promote reconciliation and settle the difference in an amicable way, upon such terms of compensation as may appear just, or to withdraw the summons should the complaint appear to be frivolous or not proved, or the defendant be unwilling to have the matter settled under the provisions of said section.

6. It shall be the duty of the said officer to transmit, at the earliest opportunity, to the Registrar of the High Commissioner's Court, all documents in cases dealt with by him under this section, and to report his proceedings to the High Commissioner or Assistant High Commissioner.

7. The said officer shall also be a Commissioner of the High Commissioner's Court for the purposes of sections 96, 97, and 98 of the said order; and it shall be his duty to communicate to the High Commissioner, or Assistant High Commissioner, or to the Deputy Commissioner within the district, should one be appointed, notice of the death of any British subject, and such information respecting his affairs as he may be able to obtain.

8. He shall have power to take such steps for the preservation of the personal property as he may deem expedient, reporting the same forthwith to the High Commissioner, or Assistant High Commissioner, or to the Deputy Commissioner as aforesaid.

9. Such officer shall be a Commissioner, and, as such, an officer of the Court for the purpose of administering oaths, taking affidavits, declarations, and affirmations under subsection 2 of section 15 of said order.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

ON SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

ON SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

ON EARTHENWARE.

A bonus of two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) will be given on the first £1,000 worth of household earthenware manufactured in the colony, on proof that it has been sold at such prices as to show that it is of good marketable quality.

ON SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than one hundred tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first one hundred tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

GUNPOWDER.

The Government are prepared to receive proposals from any person willing to establish a factory for the manufacture of blasting and sporting powder. The proposer to state what amount of bonus he would require to induce him to undertake the manufacture.

The place where the factory is to be erected to be subject to the approval of the Government, the plans and specifications of the building to be also approved by Government.

All the internal fittings and the arrangements for carrying on the manufacture of the gunpowder to be subject to the inspection of an officer appointed by the Government.

CONDITIONS.

Auckland.—Weather cool and showery; wind uniformly moderate and chiefly from N.E. and W., strong from latter quarter on 18th and 19th; thunder on 2nd; maximum rain recorded on 18th, .835 in.

Wellington.—Showery up to 6th, 1.14 in. rain recorded on 3rd, the maximum for the month; very fine, bright, warm S.E. weather to 17th; showery on night of 17th; stormy from 18th to 23rd, N.W., reaching a gale on 21st; remainder of month warm and pleasant, chiefly from N.W.; prevailing S.E. and N.W. winds; heavy thunder on night of 2nd, vivid lightning, and heavy rain; lightning on night of 4th, with rain.

Lincoln.—Generally fine, with prevailing S.E. and N.E. winds; stormy from latter quarter on 27th, 28th, and 29th; thunder on 17th; hail on 20th; maximum rain registered on 19th, 1.37 in.

Dunedin.—Pleasant, warm weather, but with frequent light showers, the maximum fall recorded on 4th, .490 in.; moderate variable winds, frequent calms; on 21st rather fresh breeze from N.W.
