*Redefining Districts under "The Licensing Act, 1873."*

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.  
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act, 1873," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, define such territorial divisions as he may think proper to be licensing districts for the purposes of the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the Districts of Tauranga, Te Papa, and Maketu were, amongst others, constituted under the said "Licensing Act, 1873:" And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the said districts:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Act, and of every power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the said Districts of Tauranga, Town of Tauranga (hitherto called Te Papa), and Maketu, as the same are defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

TAURANGA LICENSING DISTRICT.

COMMENCING at the seaward termination of the confiscated boundary-line drawn from Te Aroha Trig. Station, in a north-easterly direction, to the sea-coast. Bounded—North-easterly by the sea-coast to Trig. Station No. 17 on the said coast; thence towards the East by a right line nearly due south to its intersection with the Kaituna River; thence along the Kaituna River to its confluence with the Waiari Stream; thence by last-named stream to its con-

fluence with the Oturuturu Stream; thence by the said stream to its confluence with the Mangatoī Stream; thence towards the South following said stream until a right line intersects it bearing 106° 49' from Trig. Station on summit of Otanewainuku; thence by said line to last-mentioned Trig. Station; thence by a right line to Trig. Station on the summit of Puwhenua; thence towards the South-west and West following the water-shed line along the summit of range to the southern boundary of the Te Aroha Licensing District; thence by part of the southern and the whole of the eastern boundary of the Te Aroha Licensing District aforesaid to the confiscation line; thence by the confiscation line to the East Coast, the point of commencement. The islands of Mayor, Motiti, and Plate are included in the above, and the Town of Tauranga Licensing District, hereunder described, is excluded.

TOWN OF TAURANGA LICENSING DISTRICT.

Commencing at the southernmost angle of Allotment No. 722 of Section No. 2, Town of Tauranga. Bounded—South-westerly by a right line drawn to the westernmost corner of Allotment No. 696, Section No. 2 aforesaid, and by this line produced in a north-westerly direction till it meets the Kopurerua Stream; thence by said stream to its confluence with the Waikareao Estuary; thence by the Waikareao Estuary and the Tauranga Harbour to point of commencement.

MAKETU LICENSING DISTRICT.

Commencing at Trig. Station No. 17, on the East Coast, being the north-easternmost corner of the Tauranga Licensing District, hereinbefore described. Bounded towards the North-east by the sea to a point five miles east of the Matata River; thence by a line to Mount Edgecumbe; thence by a line to a point five miles due south of the most southerly extremity of Rerewhakaītu Lake; thence by a line till it meets the extremity of a line drawn due south for a distance of twenty-two miles from Otanewainuku

Mountain; thence by the last-mentioned line and part of the southern and the whole of the eastern boundary of the Tauranga District, hereinbefore described, to the place of commencement.

*Proclaiming North Auckland Cattle District free from Disease.—Notice No. 95.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor has received the certificate required by the twenty-fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1871" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to the effect that Lots one, two, three, four, five, and six of Section number four of the Suburbs of Panmure, being the only remaining infected places in the North Auckland Cattle District, are free from disease:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand aforesaid, by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare the said North Auckland Cattle District to be free from disease; and such district shall, from the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, on which day this Proclamation shall be deemed to come into force, cease to be an infected place within the meaning of the said Act.

*Taking of Land for the Borough of Wellington Water Supply.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and seventy-nine of the "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Council of a borough constituted

under the said Act may take any land within the borough for any of the purposes of the said Act, in the manner provided by the Second Part of "The Public Works Act, 1876." And by the two hundred and forty-fourth section of the said Act it is enacted that the Council may construct waterworks for the supply of pure water for the use of the inhabitants of the borough, or of the shipping in any harbour adjoining, and may do all things necessary thereto, and therein especially may purchase or take, under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," land and waters within or beyond the borough: And by the two hundred and forty-fifth section of the said Act it is enacted, that any land or water so taken shall be taken under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876."

And whereas by section seven of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Council of every borough may purchase or take under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," any lands outside of as well as within the borough for any purpose connected with the drainage of the borough, the maintenance and repair of the roads, streets, and public places thereof, or the public health, protection, and safety of its inhabitants, or for any other purpose for which the Council is authorized to take land within the borough:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Wellington propose to construct the following works, viz.: Waterworks for the supply of the City of Wellington, with water from a weir situated in the Wainuiomata District of the Provincial District of Wellington:

And whereas the Council aforesaid has laid before me the memorial and map required by the twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876:"

And whereas it appears to me that all things required by the said Act, "The Municipal Corporations Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1877," "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," to be done and performed to authorize the taking of the said lands have been done and performed:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by the said Acts, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are hereby taken for the purpose of such works as aforesaid; and that, from and after the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in fee-simple in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wellington, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for the purpose of such works as aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

A PARCEL of land forming part of Section No. 35, in the Wainuiomata District, containing 30 acres. Bounded on the Eastward by the eastern boundary of the said section from a point measured 2720 7 links from the point where such boundary joins the eastern boundary of Section No. 34, and extending from the first-mentioned point northerly to a point on the said eastern boundary 2780 8 links from the commencing point, and being a parallelogram extending westerly from the said eastern

boundary 1080·3 links on a bearing  $124^{\circ} 46'$  from the direction of such eastern boundary.

A parcel of land forming part of the said Section No. 35 and of Sections Nos. 34 and 67, in the said district, having a width of 100 links, the western boundaries of which commence at the point where the southern and western boundaries of the last-described parcel of land meet, and extend from thence on a bearing  $232^{\circ} 56'$ , 1060·6 links; and from thence on a bearing  $240^{\circ} 49'$ , 568·9 links; and from thence on a bearing  $211^{\circ} 16'$ , 1210·2 links, to the northern boundary of Section No. 34; and from thence on a bearing  $211^{\circ} 16'$ , 211·1 links; and from thence on a bearing  $224^{\circ} 16'$ , 438·8 links; and from thence on a bearing  $232^{\circ} 17'$ , 1908·3 links; and from thence on a bearing  $274^{\circ} 17'$ , 141·4 links; and from thence on a bearing  $229^{\circ} 17'$ , 650 links; and from thence on a bearing  $210^{\circ} 31'$ , 948·7 links; and from thence on a bearing  $280^{\circ} 5'$ , 235·3 links; and from thence on a bearing  $243^{\circ} 38'$ , 519·5 links; and from thence on a bearing  $254^{\circ} 56'$  across the boundary of the said Section No. 34 into the said Section No. 67, 700 links; and from thence on a bearing  $262^{\circ} 3'$ , 286·3 links, to the eastern boundary of Section No. 26 in the said district; and from thence southerly along the said eastern boundary a distance of 100·8 links; the eastern boundaries of the parcel of land now described being parallel to the western boundaries at a distance of 100 links measured easterly upon a line perpendicular to any part of the western boundaries thereof.

A parcel of land 61 links wide by 500 links long forming part of the said Sections Nos. 34 and 67, the western boundary thereof commencing at a point on the western boundary of the said Section No. 34, 2271·1 links from the southern corner of the said Section No. 34, and extending from thence along the western boundary of the said Sections Nos. 34 and 67, 500 links; and the eastern boundary thereof being parallel to and distant 61 links easterly from the said western boundary.

A parcel of land 25 links wide forming part of the Section No. 26, in the Wainuiomata District, and extending across the said section from the eastern to the western boundaries thereof, the southern boundary of which said parcel of land now described commences at the eastern boundary of the said Section No. 26 at a point measured 1858·6 links along such eastern boundary from the southern boundary of the said Section No. 26, and extends from thence on a bearing  $87^{\circ} 27' 33''$ , 3429·6 links to the western boundary of the said Section No. 26; and the northern boundary of which is distant northerly 25 links measured perpendicularly from such southern boundary.

A parcel of land 25 links wide forming part of the Section No. 2 in the said district, and being a direct continuation westerly of the parcel of land lastly hereinbefore described from the western boundary of the said Section No. 26, and on the same bearing, for a distance on the northern side of 1357·3 links until it reaches a road running through the said Section No. 2.

A parcel of land 25 links wide forming part of the Sections Nos. 1 and 2, in the Wainuiomata District, the northern boundary of which commences at a point measured westerly 1011·1 links along the northern boundary of the said Section No. 1 from the north-east corner thereof, and extending easterly from thence through the said Section No. 1 on a bearing  $312^{\circ} 16' 8''$ , 511·7 links; and from thence on a bearing  $293^{\circ} 58'$ , 1212 links, through the said Sections Nos. 1 and 2 to the road running through the said Section No. 2; the southern boundary of the parcel of land now described being formed by lines parallel to and distant southerly 25 links

measured as aforesaid from the said northern boundary-line.

A parcel of land containing 3 roods 16 perches forming part of the Section No. 8, in the Lowry Bay District. Bounded on the Southward by part of the southern boundary of the said section for a distance of 356·8 links measured from the point where the northern side of the Wainuiomata Road crosses the said southern boundary; and from thence north-westerly on a bearing  $312^{\circ} 16' 8''$  for a distance of 782·7 links; and from thence southerly along the said Wainuiomata Road 540·8 links to the commencing point.

A parcel of land 25 links wide forming part of the Section No. 7, in the Lowry Bay District; the northern boundary of which commences at a point measured 980·3 links westerly along the Wainuiomata Road from the point where the western side of a district road running through the said section joins the said Wainuiomata Road, and extending from thence north-westerly on a bearing  $152^{\circ} 31' 40''$  a distance of 2523·9 links; the southern boundary of the said parcel of land being distant from the northern boundary thereof 25 links measured as aforesaid.

A parcel of land containing 2 acres 1 rood forming part of the said Section No. 7, Lowry Bay District. Bounded on the South-west by part of the south-western boundary of the said section, such boundary commencing at a point measured south-easterly 459·5 links from the north-western extremity of such boundary; and from thence south-easterly 700 links along such boundary; from thence north-easterly on a bearing  $246^{\circ} 24'$ , 642·8 links; and from thence easterly on a bearing  $293^{\circ} 51'$ , 950·2 links to the commencing point.

A parcel of land 25 links wide, the northern boundary of which starts from a point measured 488·9 links from the north-western extremity of the south-western boundary of the said Section No. 7, Lowry Bay District, and extending westerly therefrom on a bearing  $299^{\circ} 4'$  through the Sections Nos. 19 and 16, Lowry Bay District, and Section No. 21, in the Harbour District, and across the northern boundary of the said last-mentioned section to a point on Section No. 77, in the Hutt District, measured 3792·7 links from the starting point; and from thence easterly on a bearing  $299^{\circ} 22'$  further through the said Section No. 77, in the Hutt District, to the western boundary thereof, 2449·4 links; the southern boundary of the said parcel of land now described being distant from the northern boundary thereof 25 links measured as aforesaid.

A parcel of land 25 links wide and formed by the extension westerly on a bearing  $299^{\circ} 22'$  of the northern and southern boundaries of the parcel of land lastly described from the western boundary of the said Section No. 77, Hutt District, through Section No. 15, Hutt District, to a point on the Hutt Racecourse measured on the north side 1641·4 links from the eastern boundary of the said racecourse, and extending from thence westerly on a bearing  $288^{\circ} 30'$  to a point in Section No. 11, Hutt District, measured on the northern side 883·4 links from the eastern boundary of the said Section No. 11; and from thence on a bearing  $81^{\circ} 39'$  across the two branches of the river Hutt to the south-western corner of Section No. 10, Hutt District. HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by "The Land Transfer Act 1870 Amendment Act, 1880" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, ordered that there should be paid to the several persons in respect of the several matters and things specified in the Schedule thereto the fees specified in the said Schedule: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Order in Council in manner hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council aforesaid, doth hereby revoke and annul so much of the recited Order in Council as provides for the payment of fees to Registrars of the Supreme Court under the provisions of the said Act; and in further exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council aforesaid, doth hereby order that there shall be paid to the District Land Registrar, to and for the use of Her Majesty, in respect of the registration of any transfer executed by any Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court under the provisions of the said Act, in addition to the registration fees payable under "The Land Transfer Act, 1870," the following fees, that is to say,—

If not exceeding £200, 1 per cent. on purchase-money expressed in such transfer.

If exceeding £200, 1 per cent. on £200, and  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. on remainder of purchase-money.

*Terms and Conditions of Sale of the Village Settlement of Mount Hyde, Otago Land District.*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, bearing date this nineteenth day of May, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exer-

cise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be disposed of as small-farm allotments.

2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for application shall be Tuesday, the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, at the Land Office, Dunedin.

3. The lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be sold on deferred payments, subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1877," and to the provisions of section nine of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879."

4. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one section upon deferred payments.

5. The price stated in the Schedule hereto shall be the price at which the lands shall be open for application.

6. If there should be more than one application for any allotment the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

7. Each applicant will be required to make the declaration prescribed by section sixty-two of "The Land Act, 1877," and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the Otago Land District one-tenth of the price if the area of the allotment is twenty acres or under. Such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee for the six months ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

8. Upon the fulfilment of the terms and conditions prescribed by "The Land Act, 1877," and "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," relating to land on deferred payments, the purchaser will be entitled to his Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way upon payment of the fees prescribed by law.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet grown in the colony.

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first ten thousand (10,000) gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first fifty tons of oil cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per

annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

#### EARTHENWARE.

A bonus of two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) will be given on the first £1,000 worth of household earthenware manufactured in the colony, on proof that it has been sold at such prices as to show that it is of good marketable quality.

#### SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than one hundred tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first one hundred tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

#### GUNPOWDER.

The Government are prepared to receive proposals from any person willing to establish a factory for the manufacture of blasting and sporting powder. The proposer to state what amount of bonus he would require to induce him to undertake the manufacture.

The place where the factory is to be erected to be subject to the approval of the Government, the plans and specifications of the building to be also approved by Government.

All the internal fittings and the arrangements for carrying on the manufacture of the gunpowder to be subject to the inspection of an officer appointed by the Government.

#### BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk), which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

#### MEAT.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given on the first 100 tons of fresh meat exported from New Zealand in vessels fitted with refrigerating machinery. Such meat must have been collected in a refrigerating chamber in this colony, and must have been landed in Europe in sound marketable condition.

#### CONDITIONS.

NOTICE of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1881.

The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1882.

The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

#### SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR VESSELS OF HEAVY DRAUGHT ENTERING PORT PHILLIP HEADS.

*Present Entrance.*—The present entrance to Port Phillip having shoal patches of 27, 28, and 29 feet of water, which are considered dangerous to vessels of heavy draught now entering the port, it has been deemed advisable to define another fairway.

*Beacons.*—Two beacons (the outer red and the inner white) have therefore been erected in Lonsdale Bight (1 mile  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cables from Point Lonsdale, and 1 mile 6 cables from Queenscliffe low light), and these kept in line will lead about midway between the Lightning and Corsair Rocks, on a bearing N.N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. (magnetic), with not less than 42 feet of water at low-water springs.

*Caution.*—Vessels approaching the entrance from the westward, before bringing the beacons in Lonsdale Bight in line, should keep the lighthouse well open to the left of the flagstaff on Point Lonsdale, to insure clearing the Lightning Rocks.

Vessels approaching the entrance from the eastward will know, when the beacons in Lonsdale Bight are in line, that they are to the eastward of the Lightning Rocks.

#### SOUTH ENTRANCE TO MORETON BAY.

THE extremity of the North Spit having grown further to the south-eastward, the bar should now be crossed with the beacons open to the northward twice their own width. The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 424, against 460 in March, being a decrease of 36. The deaths amounted to 158 in April, a decrease of 25 on the number for March.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 82; females, 76. 76 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 48.10 per cent. of the whole number; 57 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 236 in April, against 258 in March, a decrease of 22.

The deaths in April were 98, against 103 in March, a decrease of 5.

There were 7 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: two males of 65 and 74, and two females of 81 and 87, died at Auckland; a female of 73 at Wellington; and two males of 74 and 76 at Christchurch.

*Zymotic Diseases.*—The number of deaths from these diseases fell from 42 in March to 32 in April, the reduction being attributable to the large decrease in deaths from diarrhoea and dysentery, these deaths having amounted to 39 in March and 15 in April. Of these 15 deaths, 10 occurred in Wellington (the same number as in March), 6 of the deaths having been of children under 1 year of age. There were 7 deaths during April in these boroughs from typhoid fever; of these, 5 occurred in Wellington.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—These diseases caused 18 deaths in April, against 15 in March.

*Local Diseases.*—The deaths from these diseases were 29 in April, against 26 in March. Of these, the deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs increased from 8 in March to 11 in April.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
