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Altering Boundaries of Resident Magistrate's District of Whangarei, and abolishing other Districts.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish, and the boundaries to define and alter, and in any such Proclamation to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished, as the case may be:

And whereas by Proclamation bearing date the second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in him, did proclaim and constitute the Districts of Whangarei Heads, Whangarei, Mangapai, and Waipu, as described in the said Proclamation, to be Resident Magistrates' districts within the meaning and for the purpose of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said Districts of Whangarei Heads, Mangapai, and Waipu, and to alter the boundaries of the said District of Whangarei so constituted as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby abolish the said Districts of Whangarei Heads, Mangapai, and Waipu, and alter the boundaries of the said District of Whangarei, as described in the Schedule hereto, as and from the first day of June next.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Auckland, bounded towards the North by a right line drawn from the Hauru River at the easternmost corner of the Parish of Hikurangi to the head of Rocky Bay; thence towards the East by the sea to the Parish of Mangawai; thence towards the South

by the said Parish of Mangawai and the Parish of Kaiwaka, Wairau, and Paparoa; towards the South-west by the Parish of Matakoho to the Manganui River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Tauraroa River; thence towards the North-west by that river to the Parish of Maungakaramea; thence again towards the South-west by lines forming the south-western boundaries of the said parish to the Waionepe River; thence by a right line to the confluence of the Mangakahia River with the Wairua River; thence again towards the North-west by the said Wairua River to the north-eastern corner of the Parish of Hikurangi aforesaid; and thence towards the North-east by a line forming the north-eastern boundary of the said parish to the Hauru River: including the adjacent islands.

Land withdrawn from the Deferred-payment System in Otago.

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall

think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the land specified in the Schedule hereto was, with other lands, on the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, proclaimed by the Superintendent of Otago as set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on the eighteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be withdrawn from the deferred-payment system:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the above-named Acts, do hereby revoke the Proclamation above referred to, so far as it relates to the sections therein mentioned and included in the Schedule hereto, and do proclaim and declare that the said sections are hereby withdrawn from the operation of the deferred-payment system.

WHEREAS by the twenty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time establish and define, abolish, alter, or reconstitute local districts for the sale or disposal of land, and in like manner from time to time may appoint Land Officers or other persons for conducting sales of land in such local districts, and for receiving applications for the sale, letting, disposal, or occupation of Crown lands, and for generally carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby appoint

to be a Land Officer for conducting sales of land, and for receiving applications for the sale, letting, and disposal or occupation of Crown lands, and for generally carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act within the Hawera Land District, as established by Proclamation under my hand, dated the nineteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

Naseby, County of Maniototo, proclaimed a Borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is

enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare any of the several places specified in the Third Schedule to the said Act in which a Municipal Corporation has been established under the provisions of an Ordinance of the Province of Otago intituled "The Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," from a day to be named in such Proclamation; subject, however, to certain conditions in the said section mentioned:

And whereas the Town of Naseby, in the Provincial District of Otago, is one of the places specified in the said Third Schedule, and a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, by fifty of the ratepayers of such town, praying him to constitute such town into a borough under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and such petition was, on the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, publicly notified, and no petition from an equal or greater number of such ratepayers was presented to His Excellency within two months after such public notification praying him not to assent to the prayer of such first-mentioned petition:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date of this Proclamation, the said Town of Naseby shall be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and shall be called the Borough of Naseby; and that the boundaries of such borough shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by admeasurement 112 acres 3 roods 32 perches, more or less, situate in the Naseby Survey District. IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Gold-Mining Districts Act, 1873," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon,

the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby exempted from occupation for mining purposes, or for water-races, dams, or reservoirs, or for machine, business, or residence sites.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Petty Sessions Act, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor, from time to time, by Order in Council, whereof notice shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, may constitute and define districts within and for which Courts of Petty Sessions respectively shall be held, and such districts, or any of them, may from time to time in manner aforesaid abolish:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the District of Auckland was defined to be a district within and for which Courts of Petty Sessions should be held for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said district:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power in this behalf vested in him as aforesaid, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, abolish, from and after the first day of July next, the District of Auckland aforesaid.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to divide the colony into judicial districts for the purposes of the said Act, and the limits of such districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require, and that the Governor in Council shall assign every such district to a Judge or Judges of the Supreme Court, who shall have, within the same, all the powers and jurisdiction thereby given to the said Court:

And whereas "The Otago and Southland District," as defined by an Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, has been assigned to Joshua Strange Williams, Esquire, and to Thomas Bannatyne Gillies, Esquire, Judges of the said Court:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Otago and Southland District should also be assigned to Sir James Prendergast, the Chief Justice of the said Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of all powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, assign the said Otago and Southland District unto

Sir JAMES PRENDERGAST,

Powers delegated to the Meane Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of May, 1881.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, made and issued under the authority of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," "The Public Domains Act, 1865," and "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," certain powers were, in respect of certain lands referred to in a further Order in Council of the same date, made and issued under "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," aforesaid, delegated to James Nelson Williams, William Birch, Cecil Augustus Fitzroy, Charles Bassell Winter, and John Commons McVay:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Domains Act, 1860," aforesaid, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke the Order in Council delegating the Governor's powers to the above-named persons; and do hereby further delegate, in respect of the lands referred to in the aforesaid Orders in Council, all the powers conferred by "The Public Domains Act, 1860," except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and

ten of section five, and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Meane Domain Board:—

JAMES NELSON WILLIAMS,
WILLIAM BIRCH,
CECIL AUGUSTUS FITZROY,
CHARLES BASSELL WINTER,
JOHN COMMONS MCVAY, and
JOHN HELIER VAUTIER

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at two o'clock p.m., at the Provincial Council Chambers, Napier, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in February in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Making Provision for Election of Mayor of Borough of Queenstown.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of May, 1881.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS on the twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, one Frederick Henry Daniel was, after a poll of the burgesses of the Borough of Queenstown, declared to be duly elected as Mayor of the said borough: And whereas, in accordance with the provisions of "The Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," the said election was, on the eighteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, declared by the Resident Magistrate holding inquiry as by the said Act provided to be void: And whereas, therefore, from such said eighteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, there was an extraordinary vacancy in the said office of Mayor within the meaning of the forty-sixth section of the said Act: And whereas the Returning Officer of the said

borough failed to appoint a day for the election to fill such vacancy within the time prescribed by the said forty-sixth section: And whereas, owing to such failure by the said Returning Officer, no election has yet been held, and there is no power to hold the same except as is hereinafter provided, and no sufficient provision is made by the said Act or by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," or any amendment thereof, for such a case: And whereas by the twelfth section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is provided, *inter alia*, that, in any case in which no sufficient provision is made by that Act, the Governor may, by Order in Council gazetted and publicly notified from time to time, make provision for any such case: And whereas, therefore, it is desirable that provision should be made for the case of the election of the Mayor of the said Borough of Queenstown, as is hereinafter done:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said twelfth section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, hereby order that the Returning Officer for the Borough of Queenstown may, by public notice, appoint a day, not less than twenty nor more than twenty-five clear days from the public notification of this Order in Council, for the holding of an election for the office of Mayor of the said borough, notwithstanding that the period provided by the forty-sixth section of the said "Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," has expired, but so that such election shall be conducted in all respects as if the same had been held within the said period.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear that certain things required to be done by "The Counties Act, 1876," in connection with the making and revision of the county roll of the County of Taranaki cannot be done by or within the times required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the two hundred and eleventh section of the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby extend the time for the doing of the said things in connection with the county roll of the said County of Taranaki, and doth declare that the time for the doing of such several things shall be those which are specified in the Schedule hereto:

SCHEDULE.

1. For the preparation of the county roll: On or before the 21st May, 1881.
2. Roll shall be open for inspection: From the 26th May, 1881, until the 20th June, 1881.
3. Objections to roll received: Until the 30th June, 1881.
4. Day appointed for revision of roll: Some day on or after the 1st July, 1881, but Revision Court shall not sit after the 21st July, 1881.
5. Roll shall come into force: On the 1st August, 1881.

Appointing Trustees under Maori Real Estate Management Acts, 1867 and 1877.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of May, 1881.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last-recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

EARTHENWARE.
