 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto were, *inter alia*, taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," for a certain public work, to wit, the construction of a portion of the railway from Greymouth to Brunnerton: And whereas it is now desired to except the said lands from the effect of the said Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of every power and authority in me vested for the purpose, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 8416, are excepted from the effect of the aforesaid Proclamation.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Otago.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, pass a resolution recommending that the lands described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Tuesday, the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at Dunedin, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in that office.

And, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by "The Petty Sessions Act, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor, from time to time, by Order in Council, whereof notice shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, may constitute and define districts within and for which Courts of Petty Sessions respectively shall be held, and such districts, or any of them, may from time to time in manner aforesaid abolish:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the District of Whangarei was defined to be a district within and for which Courts of Petty Sessions should be held for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said district:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power in this behalf vested in him as aforesaid, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, abolish, from and after the first day of August next, the District of Whangarei aforesaid.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, made and issued under the

authority of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," "The Public Domains Act, 1865," and "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," certain powers were, in respect of certain lands referred to in a further Order in Council of the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, made and issued under "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," aforesaid, delegated to William Fraser, Edward Mortimer Edgecumbe, William Kelly, Joseph Ellis, and, John Charles Young:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Domains Act, 1860," aforesaid, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke the Order in Council delegating the Governor's powers to the above-named persons; and do hereby further delegate, in respect of the lands referred to in the aforesaid Orders in Council, all the powers conferred by "The Public Domains Act, 1860," except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five, and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Tauranga Domain Board:—

WILLIAM KELLY,
JOSEPH ELLIS,
GEORGE BENTHAM MORRIS,
ROBERT CAMPBELL FRASER, and
ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL TURNER

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the office of the Chairman, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, at the office of Mr. A. C. Turner, on the Strand, Tauranga.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in February in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Immigrants Land Act Amendment Act, 1875," it is enacted that, in any case where any person, who, since the passing of "The Immigrants Land Act, 1873" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and prior to the coming into operation of the now reciting Act, has paid his own passage to the colony with the intention of settling upon and cultivating land therein, and who has omitted to obtain any certificate or to do any other act by the said Act required to entitle him to a free grant of land thereunder, whether such omission shall have occurred prior to or after arrival in the colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, on receiving proof that such person had a *bonâ fide* intention to comply with the said Act, to direct and declare that such person shall have and be entitled to all the privileges and benefits which he would have had under the said Act but for such omission as aforesaid; and, further, that every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the omission in respect of which such order shall be made, and shall be forthwith published in the *New Zealand Gazette*; and thereupon the person named in such Order in Council shall have all the privileges and benefits which he would have had but for such omission as aforesaid:

And whereas proof has been received by the Governor that the person mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto has paid his own passage to the colony with the intention of settling upon and cultivating land therein, and also that he had a *bonâ fide* intention to comply with the said Act, but has omitted to do the acts mentioned in the second column of the said Schedule by the said Act required to entitle him to a free grant of land thereunder:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, and in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the said "Immigrants Land Act Amendment Act, 1875," doth hereby direct and declare that the person mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall have and be entitled to all the privileges and benefits which he would have had under the said Act but for such omission as aforesaid.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 446, against 453 in May, being a decrease of 7. The deaths amounted to 171 in June, being the same number as in May.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 84; females, 87. 91 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 53.22 per cent. of the whole number; 47 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 239 in June, against 249 in May, a decrease of 10.

The deaths in June were 94, against 98 in May, a decrease of 4.

There were 6 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: a male of 78 died at Auckland, a male of 71 at Wellington, two males of 68 and 66 respectively and a female of 78 at Christchurch, and a male of 74 at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The diseases in this class caused 23 deaths or 24.47 per cent. of the total deaths in June, against 29 deaths or 29.59 per cent. in May. The deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea fell from 11 to 3 in number, and the deaths from measles increased from 5 to 11. All these deaths from measles occurred in Dunedin. There were 2 deaths from scarlatina, and one from typhoid fever at Auckland, and 2 deaths from diphtheria at Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 15 deaths in June, against 14 in May. Of these 15 deaths, 4 were from cancer and 9 from phthisis.

Local Diseases.—The deaths from these causes were 40 in June, against 36 in the previous month. The deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs increased from 10 to 18; bronchitis having caused 12 deaths in June, against 2 in May.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
