*Land reserved for Primary Education.*

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.  
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Education Reserves Act, 1877," it is, among other things, enacted that, in order to provide an endowment for primary education in the North Island, at least five per centum of the waste lands in each district therein open for sale on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and a like per centum out of all land over which the Native title may thereafter be extinguished in each such district, and which should from time to time be acquired or purchased by or on behalf of the Crown, should be reserved and set apart as an endowment for the maintenance of primary education within the education district in which the land is situated:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said recited Act, and of every other power and authority me thereunto enabling, do hereby reserve and set apart the several blocks or parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto as endowments for the maintenance of primary education within the education districts in which such blocks or parcels of land are respectively situated.

*Land taken for a Portion of the Wellington-Napier Railway (Napier Workshops.)*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of a portion of the railway from Napier to a junction with the railway from New Plymouth to Waitara, at Sentry Hill, passing by Pakipaki, Waipawa, Waipukurau, Takapau, &c., being one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1876," was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the fourteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Napier, in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said portion of the aforesaid line of railway (for Napier workshops) and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas the line of railway from Wellington to Napier is the same railway as that referred to in the Proclamation hereinabove recited, and is one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1879," and it is enacted

by the Act last named that such of the railways mentioned therein as are unfinished may be completed under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and "The Public Works Act, 1879: And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for the said portion of the railway from Wellington to Napier, viz., for Napier workshops:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the sixth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of every power and authority in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the said portion of the line of railway herein last above named.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 16 acres and 25 perches, more or less, situate in the Town of Napier, Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, commencing at a point in Munroe Street distant from Concrete Block B 134 links, on a bearing of 250° 48'. Wellington.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The

Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road in Block IX, Waitohu District, Wellington:

And whereas the Otaki Highway Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the persons entitled to vote at the election of a member for the One-Tree Point Subdivision of the Oteramika Road District failed to hold an election on the day appointed by "The Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871," and it is expedient to appoint a day for holding the said election, as is provided by the tenth section of "The Otago Roads Ordinance 1871 Amendment Ordinance, 1874:"

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Ordinances, and by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," do hereby proclaim and appoint that an election of a member for the One-Tree Point Subdivision of the said road district shall be held at noon, on Saturday, the thirteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, at the Schoolhouse, Oteramika.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by the fourteenth section of "The Counties Act, 1876," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim and declare that all that area in the Provincial District of Taranaki, bounded towards the North-west from the ocean, by the Taungatara River to its source; thence by a right line to the summit of Mount Egmont; towards the North-east by a right line to the source of the Patea River, and by that river to the point where it last crosses the confiscation boundary; towards the South-east by a right line to the source of the Manawapou River, and by that river to the sea; towards the South-west by the ocean to the mouth of the Taungatara River, the starting point, being portion of the County of Patea, shall con-

stitute a new county, with the before-mentioned boundaries, under the name of the County of Hawera.

*Alteration of Boundaries of Selwyn and Ashley Counties.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section thirty of "The Counties Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, alter the boundaries of any counties, and declare that, from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation, the new boundaries set forth in such Proclamation shall be the boundaries of such counties: And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the Council of the County of Selwyn, praying him to alter the boundaries of such county, and to declare that the boundaries of such county shall be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and a petition has also been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the Council of the County of Ashley, praying him to alter the boundaries of such last-mentioned county, and to declare that the boundaries of such county shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the County of Selwyn, and declare that, from and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the new boundaries set forth in the First Schedule hereto shall be the boundaries of such county, and doth hereby alter the boundaries of the County of Ashley, and declare that, from and after the said first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the new boundaries set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be the boundaries of such county.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

COUNTY OF SELWYN.

BOUNDED towards the North and East by Ashley County, hereinafter defined, from the saddle near the source of the Hurunui to the mouth of the Waimakariri River; towards the East by the ocean and Lyttelton Harbour to the south-west corner of the Lyttelton Municipality; thence by the western boundary of the said municipality; thence by a line due north to the summit of the Port Hills; thence Westerly by a line along the summit of the Port

Hills to the highest of Cooper's Knobs; thence to and by the centre of a stream rising on the western side of Cooper's Knobs to its junction with the Halswell; thence along the left bank of the Halswell River to Lake Ellesmere; thence South-westerly by a right line to the ocean at Taumutu; thence by the ocean to the mouth of the Rakaia River; thence by a line along the centre of that river to its source near Whitcombe Pass; thence by a line to and along the summit of the Southern Alps to the saddle of the Teremakau, the starting point.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

COUNTY OF ASHLEY.

BOUNDED towards the North by the Amuri and Cheviot Counties, from the source of the Hurunui to its mouth; towards the East by the ocean to the mouth of the Waimakariri River; towards the South by a line along the centre of that stream to a point in line with the northern boundary of Run No. 653; thence by said line and boundary, the Puketirake Range, and the summit of the range leading from Ashley Head to the saddle; and thence by a right line to the source of the Hurunui, the starting point.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of July, 1881.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear that certain things required to be done by "The Counties Act, 1876," in connection with the making and revision of the county roll of the County of Hobson, cannot be done by or within the times required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the two hundred and eleventh section of the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby extend the time for the doing of the said things in connection with the county roll of the said County of Hobson, and doth declare that the time for the doing of such several things shall be those which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. For the preparation of the county roll: On or before the 1st August, 1881.
2. Roll shall be open for inspection: From the 2nd August, 1881, until the 16th August, 1881.
3. Objections to roll received: Until the 23rd August, 1881.
4. Day appointed for revision of roll: Some day on and after the 24th August, 1881, but Revision Court shall not sit after the 14th September, 1881.
5. Roll shall come into force: On the 1st October, 1881.

*Appointing Trustees under Maori Real Estate Management Acts, 1867 and 1877.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of July, 1881.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last-recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

**LINSEED OIL.**

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first ten thousand (10,000) gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

**OIL CAKE.**

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first fifty tons of oil cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

**STARCH.**

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

**SILK.**

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

**SULPHURIC ACID.**

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per

annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

#### EARTHENWARE.

A bonus of two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) will be given on the first £1,000 worth of household earthenware manufactured in the colony, on proof that it has been sold at such prices as to show that it is of good marketable quality.

The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first one hundred tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

#### GUNPOWDER.

The Government are prepared to receive proposals from any person willing to establish a factory for the manufacture of blasting and sporting powder. The proposer to state what amount of bonus he would require to induce him to undertake the manufacture.

The place where the factory is to be erected to be subject to the approval of the Government, the plans and specifications of the building to be also approved by Government.

All the internal fittings and the arrangements for carrying on the manufacture of the gunpowder to be subject to the inspection of an officer appointed by the Government.

#### BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk), which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

#### MEAT.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given on the first 100 tons of fresh meat exported from New Zealand in vessels fitted with refrigerating machinery. Such meat must have been collected in a refrigerating chamber in this colony, and must have been landed in Europe in sound marketable condition.

#### CONDITIONS.

NOTICE of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1881.

The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1882.

The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

#### Alterations and Additions to the Rates for the Conveyance, Delivery, and Storage of Goods, Parcels, &c., on the New Zealand Railways.

IN accordance with the By-laws for the New Zealand Railways, fixed by Order in Council dated the 6th January, 1881, the following alterations and additions to the rates for the conveyance, delivery, and storage of goods, parcels, &c., on all the New Zealand Railways, are hereby declared to be fixed and to come into force from the 1st August, 1881.

All articles intended for the Industrial Exhibition to be held at Invercargill during 1881 shall be conveyed free over all the New Zealand Government Railways, provided that, in the event of such exhibits being sold, the railway charges shall be paid by the consignor. The packages must be clearly and legibly marked by exhibitors, "For Invercargill Industrial Exhibition."
