Land taken for a Portion of the Waitaki-Bluff Railway—Branch Line from Waipahi to Heriot Burn (Tapanui Section, further portion of).

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of a portion of the branch line of railway from Waipahi to Heriot Burn, from the main line, Waitaki to Bluff, being one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1879," was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the sixteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Dunedin, in the Provincial District of Otago, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said portion of the said line of railway and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas "The Public Works Act, 1879," enacts that such of the railways mentioned therein as are unfinished may be completed under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and "The Public Works Act, 1879:" And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for a part of the said portion of the said branch line of railway:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the sixth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of every power and authority in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the said part of the said branch line of railway.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 5 acres 1 rood 17½ perches, more or less, situated in the Waipahi Survey District, being portion of the land reserved for railway purposes, Township of Waipahi, Block VII. of the said survey district, and comprised within the following boundary-lines: Commencing at a point on the middle line of the main line of the Waitaki-Bluff (with branches) Railway distant 9902 links on a bearing of 35° 10' 20" from the Trig. Station A of the before-mentioned survey district, and running thence on a bearing of 31° 29' for a distance of 237 links to the boundary-line of railway reserve, and extending along that boundary 362 links; thence 65° 8', 120 links, to the south-west corner of Section No. 3, Block X., Waipahi Township; thence along the southern boundary-line of Sections Nos. 3 and 2 of said block, 300 links, to the south-easternmost corner of said Section No. 2; thence along the eastern boundary-line of said section, 100 links; thence on a line bearing 65° 8', 110 links; thence on a due north line for a distance of 670 links to the right bank of the River Waipahi; thence descending along the said bank for a distance of 1630 links; thence on a line bearing 250° 12', 110 links, to a point on the middle line of the said Waitaki-Bluff (with branches) Railway; and thence along said middle line for a distance of 1450 links, to point of commencement: the portion of land herein described being intersected by street-lines, for which allowance has been made in the acreage.

All that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 6 acres and 7 perches, more or less, situated in the Waipahi Township, being portions of Blocks IV., VII., and VIII. of said township, and Block VII., Waipahi Survey District, and comprised within the following boundary-lines: Commencing at a point being the south-western corner or angle of Section No. 13, Block VIII., of said township, thence on lines bearing 17° 33' for a distance of 200 links, 107° 33', 250 links; 17° 33',

200 links; 107° 33', 100 links; 17° 33', 250 links; 107° 33', 100 links; 17° 33', 350 links; 107° 33', 100 links; 17° 33', 400 links; 107° 33', 300 links; 197° 33', 1200 links; 287° 33', 250 links; 197° 33', 200 links; 287° 33', 250 links, to the south-westernmost corner of Section No. 12, Block VII., of the said township, being Sections Nos. 13 and 11, Block VIII., Sections Nos. 12, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, Block VII., and Sections Nos. 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 8, and parts of Sections Nos. 17, 18, 19, 20, Block IV., of said town, and street-lines dividing said blocks; thence on a line bearing 245° 8', 490 links; to the left bank of the River Waipahi; thence ascending along the same for a distance of 244 links; thence on a line bearing 65° 8', 210 links, to point of commencement: the portion of land herein described being intersected by street-lines of the Township of Waipahi, for which allowance has been made in the acreage.

All that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 3 roods, more or less, situated in the Waipahi Survey District, being Sections Nos. 7, 6, and 4, Block IV., Waipahi Township: Commencing at the south-west corner of Section No. 7; thence on lines bearing 17° 33', 200 links; 107° 33', 50 links; 17° 33', 250 links; to Sherwood Street; thence on lines bearing 107° 33', 100 links; 197° 33', 250 links; 107° 33', 100 links, to Derwent Street; thence on lines bearing 197° 33', 200 links; 287° 33', 250 links, to the point of commencement.

on lines bearing 351° 17', 222 links; 7° 1' 30", 1131 links; 88° 30', 54 links; 352° 31', 1870 links; 315°, 50 links; to the intersection thereof with the right bank of the River Pomahaka; and thence descending along the same 2500 links; thence on lines bearing 264° 32', 132 links; 174° 32', 1232 links; to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 8; thence on the boundary-line between Sections Nos. 9 and 8 due west 300 links; thence on a line bearing 190° 31', 2485 links, to the boundary-line between Sections Nos. 9 and 17; thence on said boundary-line due east 40 links; thence on lines bearing 190° 31', 489 links (intersecting a main coach-road); 104° 15', 235 links; to the intersection with the right bank of the River Pomahaka; thence descending along same 6470 links to the produced southern boundary-line of said Section No. 18; thence along said boundary-line 200 links to the point of commencement: the parcel of land so described being intersected by a main road-line, and including, as aforesaid, portion of Crown lands, for which allowance has been made in the acreage.

THE following regulations for the management of the Oxford Cemetery, having been submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published in accordance with "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877."

THOMAS DICK.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE OXFORD CEMETERY.

1. All cheques, and titles to ground, to be signed by the Chairman and two members of the Board.
2. Three members of the Board to form a quorum; the Chairman to have an original as well as a casting vote.
3. The Chairman to receive all moneys due to the Board, and to pay same to proper account.
4. The Chairman to mark the number of plots (if purchased), together with the name of deceased, or of persons to whom the plot is allotted, and colour the same in red upon cemetery map.
5. Special meetings may be called by the Chairman at any time by giving three clear days' notice.
6. The cemetery shall be placed under the care of a sexton, who shall be appointed by the Board, and shall give or receive one month's notice before retirement from office.
7. For every funeral the sexton's fee shall be 7s. 6d. for children under fifteen years of age, and a cemetery fee of 7s. 6d.; and for every adult the fee shall be 10s., and a sexton's fee of 10s.; and extra charge of 2s. 6d. per foot shall be made for every grave beyond the depth of six feet.
8. No memorial of any kind shall be erected, nor any plot considered sold, until payment of the same shall have been made at the following rates, viz.: Walled graves or vaults, 10s. per square yard, and a cemetery fee of £2. The soil to be removed at the expense of the purchaser of the plot. No hewing or working of stone permitted within the cemetery. Common graves, 5s. per square yard, and fees as stated in By-law 7.
9. No transfer of burial-plots is allowed to take place without the permission of the Board, and for any such transfer a fee of 10s. shall be paid to the Board.
10. No monument, memorial, railing, or erection of any kind shall be put up, no inscription placed on any memorial, no trees planted, without the permission of the Board; and any monument, tablet, or other erection built or erected without the written consent of the Board, or if any fees remain unpaid, or the regulations of the Board be not complied with, the Board may take down and remove such monuments, tablets, or erections.
11. No graves to be dug by any person without the consent of the Board.
12. Only when persons shall have purchased the ground shall they be allowed to choose the site; and when the ground be not purchased the graves shall be put in regular lines, as shown on plan.
13. In all cases where land is purchased a fractional part of a yard shall be charged a yard.

1. The Trustees appointed under "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," shall have the entire control and management of the Wairoa Cemetery.

2. The Trustees having power to allocate portions of the cemetery to the various religious denominations requiring the same, no interference will be permitted with such allocations. A portion of the cemetery will be set apart for purposes of general interment.

3. Persons desirous of obtaining an exclusive right in any plot of ground in the cemetery for the purpose of making graves or family vaults, or erecting monuments, may do so at the following rates:—

4. Applications for this purpose may be made to the Chairman or Trustees, or other person authorized by them to receive the same.

5. Every burial-plot shall be 10 feet by 4 feet, and every grave shall be 5 feet in depth at the least. In the event of the purchaser of private ground desiring a greater depth, an extra charge of 2s. shall be made for every foot more than 5 feet.

6. All railings or erections of any kind shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees.

7. Any purchaser of private ground may transfer his or her interest therein to any other person upon payment of a fee of 5s. for such transfer.

8. A plan of the cemetery shall be kept, showing the plots as laid off in the several divisions, and each plot shall have a separate number on the plan.

9. A book shall be kept in which shall be entered the number of every plot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of the sale or transfer of the same. A register shall also be kept of all burials in the cemetery, which register shall be open for the inspection of the public free.

10. In all cases of intended interment the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the Chairman, or other duly-authorized person, for a warrant for such interment, which warrant shall be granted upon payment of the following fees:—

11. Such portion of the foregoing fees as would accrue to the funds of the cemetery may be remitted on-proof being given to the satisfaction of the Trustees that the person for whom the application for inter-

ment is made was a pauper or in poor circumstances at the time of his or her death, and that there are not sufficient funds applicable for the purpose, and that no person is liable for payment of such costs and charges.

12. Orders for interment must be given at least six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, otherwise an extra charge of 1s. 6d. for each hour or fraction of an hour less than six hours will be made.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

Colonial Secretary's Office,
Wellington, 18th May, 1881.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first ten thousand (10,000) gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first fifty tons of oil

cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

EARTHENWARE.

A bonus of two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) will be given on the first £1,000 worth of household earthenware manufactured in the colony, on proof that it has been sold at such prices as to show that it is of good marketable quality.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than one hundred tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first one hundred tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

GUNPOWDER.

The Government are prepared to receive proposals from any person willing to establish a factory for the manufacture of blasting and sporting powder. The proposer to state what amount of bonus he would require to induce him to undertake the manufacture.

The place where the factory is to be erected to be subject to the approval of the Government, the plans and specifications of the building to be also approved by Government.

All the internal fittings and the arrangements for carrying on the manufacture of the gunpowder to be subject to the inspection of an officer appointed by the Government.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk), which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

MEAT.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given on the first 100 tons of fresh meat exported from New Zealand in vessels fitted with refrigerating

machinery. Such meat must have been collected in a refrigerating chamber in this colony, and must have been landed in Europe in sound marketable condition.

CONDITIONS.

NOTICE of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1881.

The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1882.

The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

IN pursuance of "The Wanganui Harbour and River Conservators Board Act, 1876," and under and by virtue of the powers and provisions contained in the said Act, and all other powers it thereunto enabling, the Wanganui Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") makes the following by-law, that is to say,—

1. Clause number six (6) of By-law number six (6) of the Council of the Borough of Wanganui, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of April, 1874, is hereby repealed as from the day in which the present by-law shall come into operation, and in lieu thereof the following clause is substituted:—

That all children under the age of fifteen years passing and repassing the bridge on foot on their way to or from any school which they may be attending, and all children under the age of fifteen years passing and repassing the bridge on foot on Sunday on their way to or from any Sunday-school, shall pass free: Provided that it shall be lawful for the lessee to require the production of a certificate, under the hand of a teacher or one of the teachers at any such school, that the child or children mentioned therein is or are in attendance at such school.

2. After the words "reckoning from midnight to midnight," at the end of section number one (1) in By-law number eight (8) of the Council of the Borough of Wanganui, dated the fifth day of April, 1875, the following words shall be added and be read with the rest of the section:—

or animals in harness having passed with any vehicle: Provided also that, in the case of any horse passing in harness and repassing with a vehicle, the toll paid for the horse shall be deducted from the charge attached to the vehicle.
