*Proclamation reducing Jurisdiction of Resident Magistrate's Court for the Okarito District.*

**A PROCLAMATION.**

WHEREAS by the twenty-second section of "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, at any time to abolish the extended jurisdiction which he is by the said Act authorized to confer upon any Resident Magistrate's Court: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the limit of jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrate's Court hereinafter mentioned was extended to one hundred pounds: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the extended jurisdiction given to the said Court by the said Proclamation, and to declare that the limit of jurisdiction of the said Court shall be extended to fifty pounds:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, proclaim and declare that, on and after the first day of October next, the extended jurisdiction so given as aforesaid to the Resident Magistrate's Court for

THE OKARITO DISTRICT

shall be abolished, and that, from and after the said first day of October, the jurisdiction of the said Court shall be extended to fifty pounds.

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of September, 1881.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear that certain things required to be done by "The Counties Act, 1876," in connection with the making and revision of the county roll of the County of Amuri, cannot be done by or within the times required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the two hundred and eleventh section of the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby extend the time for the doing of the said things in connection with the county roll of the said County of Amuri, and doth declare that the time for the doing of such several things shall be those which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. For the preparation of the county roll: On or before the 23rd September, 1881.
2. Roll shall be open for inspection, and objections thereto received: From the 24th September, 1881, to the 8th October, 1881.
3. Day appointed for revision of roll: Some day on or after the 9th October, 1881; but Revision Court shall not sit after the 31st October, 1881.
4. Roll shall come into force: On the 8th November, 1881.

*Warrant fixing Intervals of Sittings at New Plymouth of District Court of Taranaki.*

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is made lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to fix the times and places within the district at which every District Court shall be held:

And whereas by "The District Courts Act Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that, as to the times of holding such Courts, it shall be sufficient for the Governor, if he shall so think fit, to fix the interval only within which such Courts shall be held at each place; and it shall in such case be lawful for the Judge of such Court to fix the particular times and days for the holding of such Courts, and from time to time to alter the same, provided that such time and days shall fall within the interval so fixed by the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, fix that, from and after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, sittings of the District Court of Taranaki shall be held at New Plymouth at intervals of not less than six days, nor more than seventeen days, between the first day of each sitting of such Court, in lieu of those previously fixed and appointed.

*Conditions for Trout Fishing in Maitai and Waimea Rivers, Nelson.*

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand doth hereby make the following regulations for the Provincial District of Nelson:—

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. Any holder of a license, as hereinafter mentioned, may fish with rod and line for trout in the Maitai and Waimea Rivers, and their affluents, from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, but only between the hours of five o'clock in the morning and ten o'clock in the evening.

3. Licenses to fish with rod and line in the said waters will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Nelson Acclimatisation Society, and for every license a fee of ten shillings will be charged.

4. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only with rod and line.

5. Any person fishing without a license, or any person who shall on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any police officer or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, police officer, or constable his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. All trout not exceeding seven inches in length taken by any person fishing as aforesaid shall be immediately returned alive to the water; and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling, and his license shall thereupon become void.

7. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the Provincial District of Nelson; and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

8. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river or stream in the said Provincial District of Nelson, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

*Conditions for Trout Fishing in Canterbury.*

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand doth hereby make the following regulations for that part of the Provincial District of Canterbury lying to the north of the Rangitata River.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1881.

2. Licenses to fish for trout in all the rivers, streams, and lakes in the Provincial District of Canterbury north of the Rangitata River will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Canterbury Acclimatisation Society at Christchurch, and for every such license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged. Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said Secretary to issue a license in case he shall have sufficient good reason for refusing the same.

3. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in any of the said rivers, streams, and lakes, from the 1st day of October, 1881, until the 31st day of March, 1882, between the hours of 5 a.m. and 10 p.m. only, but no such license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

4. Every such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish with rod and line only, and any person who shall use any ground-bait, or any net (except a landing net), or other engine, instrument, or device, or shall use or employ either of the methods known as "cross-line fishing," or "stroke-hauling," or any other unsportsmanlike device, or shall use as bait salmon-roe or any bait prepared with any chemical or medicated dressing whatever, for taking fish in any of the said rivers, streams, or lakes, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50; and every such net, or other engine, instrument, or device used contrary to these regulations shall be forfeited.

5. Any person fishing without a license, and any person who shall, on the demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any police officer or constable, or of any officer of the said Acclimatisation Society, fail to produce and show to such person, police officer, constable, or

officer his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

6. Every trout not exceeding eight inches in length taken by any person shall be immediately returned alive into the water from which the same is taken, and any person infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

7. Any person who shall put, throw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, or placed, into any river, stream, or lake in the said Provincial District of Canterbury any poisonous, deleterious, or noxious material, with intent to destroy any fish therein, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £100.

8. If any person shall be convicted of any offence against these regulations, the convicting Magistrate or Justices may, over and above any penalty inflicted, also declare the license of the offender to be forfeited, and thereupon his license shall become void.

*Conditions for Trout Fishing in Otago.*

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Governor doth hereby make the following regulations for the District of Otago:—

1. Any holder of a license may fish with rod and line for trout in all the streams and lakes within and forming the boundaries of the following district (except the Water of Leith), from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, both inclusive, viz.:—

All that area in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded on the East and South by the ocean, from Shag Point to the mouth of the Mataura River; on the West, South-west, and South by the Mataura River and the Counties of Southland and Wallace; on the North-west by the ocean; and on the North, North-west, and North-east by the Counties of Westland and Waitaki.

2. Any holder of a license may fish with rod and line for trout in the Water of Leith, in the months of November, December, January, and February next ensuing.

3. Licenses to fish with rod and line in the above-described district will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatisation Society at Dunedin, and for every license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged.

4. No license shall authorise any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only with rod and line, and between the hours of four o'clock in the morning and ten o'clock in the evening.

5. Any person fishing without a license, or any person who shall on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any ranger, police officer, or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, ranger, police officer, or constable his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. All trout not exceeding seven inches in length taken by any person fishing as aforesaid shall be immediately returned alive to the water, and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling, and his license shall thereupon become void.

7. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any lake, river, or stream within the

above-described district, and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

8. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed, into any lake, river, or stream in the said district, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

9. These regulations shall come into force as from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

*"The Highways Act, 1871," brought into Operation within the Woodville Highway District, County of Waipawa.*

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay intituled "The Highways Act, 1871," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Superintendent may from time to time, on the requisition of five voters, by notification in the Provincial Government Gazette, bring that Act into operation in any district, and thereupon, but not previously, that Act shall come into and remain in full operation therein; and in such notification the day, hour, and place of meeting for the first meeting of ratepayers for such district shall be appointed: And whereas, under the provisions of the said Act, a portion of the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay has been created a highway district by the name of the Woodville Highway District: And whereas the powers vested in the Superintendent by the said Act are now, by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," vested in the Governor: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand has received a requisition signed by five voters of the Woodville District, in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, requesting him to bring the said Act into operation in the said district:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of every power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do, by this notification, bring "The Highways Act, 1871," into operation within the Woodville Highway District, and do declare that the first meeting of ratepayers under the said Act shall be held at the Schoolhouse, at Woodville, on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, at four o'clock in the afternoon.

*Exchange of Land in the Provincial District of Canterbury.*

WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-eighth section of "The Land Act, 1877," power is given to the Governor to exchange any land set apart as a reserve for other land of equal value as he may think fit, and to make a Crown grant thereof accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare that the land mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be exchanged for the land mentioned in the second column of the said Schedule.

*Description of Trade Mark.*

A label printed in black ink on paper of various colours, or, in the case of transposing the same on drums and casks, a stencil-plate used with white paint on a dark ground of carbonate-of-iron paint on drums, and on the head of casks in black paint on a white ground. In the case of the labels the border is printed, and on drums the border also shows; on the heads of some casks the border is not shown, there being no room for the same.

The whole label or stencil-plate is, including a plain border (leaving spaces to keep stencil-plate together), about  $13\frac{1}{2}$  inches in width and  $13\frac{3}{8}$  inches deep, having thereon a sheep  $2\frac{3}{4}$  inches from the top of the same through which that portion of a cross enabled to be seen by the sheep standing in front of it; on the left-hand side of the cross is the letter "J" on the top, and the letter "I" at the bottom; on the right-hand side of the cross is the letter "H" at the top, and the letters "Co." at the bottom; on the left-hand side of the sheep is the word "Trade," and on the right-hand side of the sheep is the word "Mark." In these two words the letters are  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch long. Over the sheep, the cross, letters, and the words "Trade Mark," are the words "Wilson's Colonial" in a half-circle, and which letters are  $\frac{5}{8}$  inch long, and underneath the sheep is the word "Dip" in letters 1 inch long; underneath the word "Dip" the words "Sole Manufacturers," in letters  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch long; after which the name "J. Hatch & Co.," in letters 1 inch long; and at the bottom "Invercargill," in letters  $\frac{7}{8}$  inch long, are printed.

*Bonuses on Colonial Industries.*

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first ten thousand (10,000) gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first fifty tons of oil cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SULPHURIC ACID.
