Defining the Middle Line of further Portion of the Foxton to New Plymouth Railway (further Portion of Waingongoro Section).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Foxton to New Plymouth is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point situate on the railway reserve marked seven miles fifty chains to a point on the left bank of the Mangawhero River, all within the Provincial District of Taranaki, Colony of New Zealand, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 8612, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable John Hall, the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and which said

map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Plymouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point 7 miles 50 chains on the centre line of railway, as proclaimed in a Proclamation dated the 31st August, 1880, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 84, of the 2nd September, 1880; proceeding thence in a generally northerly direction for a distance of 13 chains, passing in, through, or over Section No. 41, Block X., Ngairu Survey District, and terminating at a point on the left bank of the Mangawhero River, all within the Provincial District of Taranaki, Colony of New Zealand; and including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; in the manner delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 8612, signed by the Honorable John Hall, the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Plymouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki: the total distance being 13 chains or thereabouts.

"Army Discipline and Regulation Act, 1879."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the forty-fourth section of "The Militia Act, 1870," it is enacted that, during the time that any part of the Militia shall be on actual service, all things contained in any Act of the Imperial Parliament, which shall then be in force in New Zealand, for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the army and their quarters, and in the Articles of War, made in pursuance of such Act, shall apply to, and the powers thereby created shall be exercised by, such part of the Militia in all cases not otherwise provided for in "The Militia Act, 1870," or in any regulations that may from time to time be issued under its authority: Provided that no militiaman shall be liable to any corporal punishment, except death or imprisonment, for any offence against any such Act of the Imperial Parliament: Provided also that no such Act of the Imperial Parliament shall be deemed to be in force in New Zealand until a Proclamation shall have been published in the *New Zealand Gazette* stating that the Governor has received a copy thereof:

And whereas by the second section of the Act of the Imperial Parliament intituled "The Army Discipline and Regulation Act, 1879," it is enacted that the same shall not come into force except in pursuance of an annual Act of Parliament, to be thereafter passed, bringing the same into force, and shall continue in force only for such time and subject to such provisions as may be specified in such last-mentioned Act:

And whereas by the second section of an Act of the Imperial Parliament intituled "The Army Discipline and Regulation (Annual) Act, 1880," it is provided that "The Army Discipline and Regulation Act, 1879," shall be and remain in force until the dates therein mentioned; that is to say, as to New Zealand, from the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one:

And whereas I have received a copy of both the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the requirements of "The Militia Act, 1870," aforesaid, and in exercise of the powers thereby vested in me, do hereby proclaim and declare that a copy of each of the said hereinbefore in part recited Acts of the Imperial Parliament has been received by me in the colony aforesaid.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir James Prendergast, Chief Justice, the Administrator of the Government of Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section seventeen of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any district in New Zealand to be a borough under the said Act, from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted, as from the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, a borough under the said Act, and that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Patea, and that the boundaries of such borough shall be those described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Taranaki, containing by admeasurement 1,420 acres, more or less. Defining Te Pukeroa-o-Ruawhata Block a District under "The Thermal-Springs Districts Act, 1881".

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the second section of "The Thermal-Springs Districts Act, 1881," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may issue Proclamations from time to time defining districts of the colony to be subject to the said Act, being localities in which there are considerable numbers of the ngawha, waiariki, or hot or mineral springs, lakes, rivers, or waters: And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that, until otherwise ordered by the General Assembly, the said Act shall be in force within the Counties of Tauranga and East Taupo only: And whereas the territory described in the Schedule hereto is situate in the said County of Tauranga, and is a locality in which there are considerable numbers of ngawha, waiariki, or hot or mineral springs and waters, and it is expedient that such territory should be defined as a district subject to the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the said colony described in the Schedule hereto, being a locality in which there are considerable numbers of the ngawha, waiariki, or hot or mineral springs and waters, shall be and the same is hereby defined to be a district subject to "The Thermal-Springs Districts Act, 1881."

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land situated in the Horohoro and Tarawera Survey Districts, Provincial District of Auckland, containing by admeasurement about 3,200 acres, more or less, and being called or known as Te Pukeroa-o-Ruawhata Block. Bounded towards the North-east by Rotorua Lake from the mouth of the Utuhina to the mouth of the Puarenga Stream; thence towards the East and South-east by the Puarenga Stream aforesaid to Rua-kio-koko; thence towards the South-west and South by lines, 6960 links and 8614 links, to Ngatautara Pa; and thence towards the West by a line, 2395 links, to Te Rere and the Utuhina Stream, to the point of commencement: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, bearing date this thirteenth day of October, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto for sale as village settlements:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlements shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be disposed of as small-farm allotments.

2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for application shall be Thursday, the twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, at the Land Office, Nelson.

3. The lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be sold for cash immediately on purchase.

4. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one section.

5. The prices stated in the Schedule hereto shall be the prices at which the lands shall be open for application.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE
GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence the Governor in Council may authorize any person to construct harbour works (other than the reclamation of land from the sea in any harbour, or the construction of any graving-dock or breakwater in any harbour or in the sea), and to use and occupy such part of the foreshore or of any tidal land or tidal waters as may be necessary for the construction or use of such harbour works; and by the seventeenth section of the said Act it is provided that in and by such Order in Council it may be prescribed what dues or rates shall be taken by the persons by whom such harbour works shall be constructed for the use thereof, and that such may be made upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And whereas William Henry Colbeck, of Pahi, desires to build a wharf at Batley, at the junction of the Otamatea and Arapaoa Rivers, Kaipara Harbour, a place where no Harbour Board is in existence:

Now, therefore, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize the said William Henry Colbeck to build, for the use and benefit of the public, a wharf at Batley, at the junction of the Otamatea and Arapaoa Rivers, Kaipara, in accordance with the plans marked M.D. 502 and 568, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, and to use and occupy such portion of the foreshore, or of any tidal land or tidal water, as may be necessary for the construction and use of such wharf, subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and, in pursuance of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, I do hereby fix the dues to be charged for the use of the said wharf as set forth in the Second Schedule hereto: Provided always that the aforesaid conditions and other rights and privileges hereby conferred may from time to time be altered,

revoked, or modified by the Governor in Council, as is provided by the said seventeenth section.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon.

2. That Her Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

3. That the said William Henry Colbeck shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at his own cost any such lights: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Marine Department.

4. That any person authorized by the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any officer acting with his approval, may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repairs thereof; and that, upon his leaving at the last known residence of William Henry Colbeck a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring him, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the said William Henry Colbeck shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That William Henry Colbeck will not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Marine Department.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize William Henry Colbeck to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.

7. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor, on giving to William Henry Colbeck six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor or the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at the last known residence of the said William Henry Colbeck, his administrators or assigns.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf, the property of Her Majesty, in any local governing body or person, upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said fourteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," do hereby vest the management of the Queenstown Wharf in the Queenstown Borough Council, subject, however, to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto: Provided always that the aforesaid conditions, and other rights and privileges hereby con-

ferred, may from time to time be altered, revoked, or modified by the Governor in Council.

SCHEDULE.

1. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon.

2. That Her Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government Service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

3. That the said Borough Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights; and shall also maintain the necessary leading lights: all the said lights to be maintained to the satisfaction of the Minister having charge of the Marine Department: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister having charge of the Marine Department.

4. That any person authorized by the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any officer acting with his approval, may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected thereon and view the state of repair thereof, and upon his leaving at the last known office of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the said Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That the Council will not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister having charge of the Marine Department.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.

7. That the said Council shall keep a separate account of the revenue derived from and expenditure on the said wharf, and shall devote any profits made therefrom to the improvement of the wharfage accommodation at Queenstown.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked.

9. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the Queenstown Borough Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor or the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at the last known office of the said Council, their successors or assigns. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last-recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first ten thousand (10,000) gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first fifty tons of oil cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

EARTHENWARE.

A bonus of two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) will be given on the first £1,000 worth of household earthenware manufactured in the colony, on proof that it has been sold at such prices as to show that it is of good marketable quality.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than one hundred tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first one hundred tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

GUNPOWDER.

The Government are prepared to receive proposals from any person willing to establish a factory for the manufacture of blasting and sporting powder. The proposer to state what amount of bonus he would require to induce him to undertake the manufacture.

The place where the factory is to be erected to be subject to the approval of the Government, the plans and specifications of the building to be also approved by Government.

All the internal fittings and the arrangements for carrying on the manufacture of the gunpowder to be subject to the inspection of an officer appointed by the Government.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer,

subject to certain conditions, may send his milk), which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

MEAT.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given on the first 100 tons of fresh meat exported from New Zealand in vessels fitted with refrigerating machinery. Such meat must have been collected in a refrigerating chamber in this colony, and must have been landed in Europe in sound marketable condition.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND SWEDEN AND NORWAY, FOR THE MUTUAL RELIEF OF DISTRESSED SEAMEN.

[Signed at London, 12th July, 1881.]

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, being desirous to make arrangements for the relief of distressed seamen of the respective nations in certain cases, the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect, have agreed as follows:—

If a seaman of one of the Contracting States, after serving on board a ship of the other Contracting State, remains behind in a third State or in its colonies, or in the colonies of that State whose flag the ship carries, and the said seaman is in a helpless condition in consequence of shipwreck, or from other causes, then the Government of that State whose flag the ship bears shall be bound to support the said seaman until he enters into ship-service again, or finds other employment, or until he arrives in his native State or its colonies, or dies.

But this is on condition that the seaman so situated shall avail himself of the first opportunity that offers to prove his necessitous condition, and the causes thereof, to the proper officials of the State whose support is to be solicited, and that the destitution is shown to be the natural consequence of the termination of his service on board the ship; otherwise the aforesaid liability to afford relief lapses.

The said liability is also excluded if the seaman has deserted, or has been turned out of the ship for any criminal act, or has left it on account of disability for service in consequence of illness or wounding resulting from his own fault.

The relief includes maintenance, clothing, medical attendance, medicine, and travelling expenses; in case of death the funeral expenses are also to be paid.

The present agreement shall come into operation on the 1st September, 1881, and shall continue in force until one of the Contracting Parties shall announce to the other, one year in advance, its intention to terminate it.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND DENMARK RELATIVE TO MERCHANT SEAMEN DESERTERS.

[Signed at London, 21st June, 1881.]

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, being desirous, for the benefit of the commerce of the two countries, to facilitate the discovery, apprehension, and surrender of seamen who may desert from merchant vessels of either country, on the basis of a full and entire reciprocity, have agreed as follows:—

It is mutually agreed that if any seamen or apprentices, not being slaves, should desert from any ship belonging to a subject of either of the Contracting Parties, within any port in the territories or in the possession or colonies of the other Contracting Party, the authorities of such port and territory, possession, or colony shall be bound to give every assistance in their power for the apprehension and sending on board of such deserters, on application to that effect being made to them by the Consul of the country to which the ship of the deserter may belong, or by the deputy or representative of the Consul.

It is understood that the preceding stipulations shall not apply to subjects of the country where the desertion shall take place.

Each of the two High Contracting Parties reserves to itself the right of terminating this agreement at any time, on giving to the other a year's notice of its wish to that effect.
