HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOE IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, bearing date this third day of November, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto for sale as a village settlement: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Stamp Fee Act, 1880," it W was provided that all regulations made under "The Stamp Fee Act, 1875," should continue in force until altered or repealed in the manner therein pro-vided: And whereas by the fourth section of "The Stamp Fee Act, 1880," it was provided that the Governor in Council might alter or repeal regulations not contrary to that Act for the due administration thereof: And whereas by divers Orders in Council made under "The Stamp Fee Act, 1875," dated respectively the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, the l

February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty- | eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, the seventeenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, the third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, a number of regulations were thereby made providing, inter alia, for the use of stamps in payment of fees and other matters, and especially that certain fees and payments should be made by stamps marked Law Court Stamps, and others by stamps marked Land and Deeds Stamps: And whereas it is expedient to provide for the use of any kind of stamp for the payment of any such fees or other matters:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pur-suance of the powers vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and declare that, from and after the making of this order, it shall and may be lawful to use any kind of stamps issued by the Government of the said colony (except those issued under "The Beer Duty Act, 1880") in payment of any matters or things which, under "The Stamp Fee Act, 1880," or the said regulations, or any other regulations made under "The Siamp Fee Act, 1875," or "The Stamp Fee Act, 1880," are required to be paid or denoted by stamps, anything to the contrary in any such regulations notwithstanding: And, further, that penny postage stamps may, from and after the making of this Order, be used for stamping receipts under "The Stamp Act, 1875."

Commissioner may require. The form of certificate upon the statement L, required by section 6 of the said Act, shall be that at foot of Form L, and shall be signed by the person holding the office for the time being of Secretary for Stamps.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act") it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

shall be vested in trustees as the Governor in Council shall think fit: And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last-recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery esta-blished in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. \mathbf{The} producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.
