Taking of Land for the Borough of Timaru Water Supply.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and seventy-nine of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Council of a borough constituted under the said Act may take any land within the borough for any of the purposes of the said Act, in the manner provided by the Second Part of "The Public Works Act, 1876:" And by the two hundred and forty-fourth section of the said Act it is enacted that the Council may construct waterworks for the supply of pure water for the use of the inhabitants of the borough, or of the shipping in any harbour adjoining, and may do all things necessary thereto, and therein especially may purchase or take, under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," land and waters within or beyond the borough: And by the two hundred and forty-fifth section of the said Act it is enacted that any land or water so taken shall be taken under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876:"

And whereas by section seven of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Council of every borough may purchase or take under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," any lands outside of as well as within the borough for any purpose connected with the drainage of the borough, the maintenance and repair of the roads, streets, and public places thereof, or the public health, protection, and safety of its inhabitants, or for any other purpose for which the Council is authorized to take land within the borough:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Timaru proposes to construct the following works,

viz., waterworks for the supply of pure water for the use of the inhabitants of the borough:

And whereas the Council aforesaid has laid before me the memorial and map required by the twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876:"

And whereas it appears to me that all things required by the said Act, "The Municipal Corporations Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1877," "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," to be done and performed to authorize the taking of the said lands have been done and performed:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by the said Acts, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are hereby taken for the purpose of such works as aforesaid; and that, from and after the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in fee-simple in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Timaru, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for the purpose of such works as aforesaid.

Lands declared to be Waste Lands of the Crown.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands described in the Schedule hereto have been purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and Acts amending the same, to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, and it is expedient that the said lands should be declared to be waste lands of the Crown:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the seventeenth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," and the twenty-eighth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," and all other authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the said lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as in the first-mentioned Act provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown in force in the land districts in which they are respectively situated.

SCHEDULE.

OTUHI.

ALL that parcel of land in the District of Whangarei, in the Provincial District of Auckland, known by the name of Otuhi, containing by admeasurement 150 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the East and North-east by Allotment No. 57, Parish of Maungatapere, and the termination of a road-line 100 links wide, 2300 links and 2010 links, by a line 2860 links, and by the Waionepu Stream; towards the South-west by a line, the termination of a road-line of width aforesaid, and again by a line 10630 links; and towards the North-west by a line, 2901 links.

PAKIRI No. 3.

RUNANGA No. 2.

All those two pieces of land in the District of Taupo, in the Provincial District of Auckland, being portions of the Runanga No. 2 Block. One piece containing by admeasurement 5,020 acres, more or less; bounded towards the East by the Otamatea Stream; towards the South by other portion of the Runanga No. 2 Block, 16569 links; and towards the West and North by the Rangitaiki River. WAIHOANGA No. 3C.

WAIARAPA RESERVE.

All that parcel of land reserved from the original sale of the Wairarapa Block, situate at Otaki, in the District of Otaki, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and containing by admeasurement 1,050 acres, more or less. MAUNGANUI.

All that parcel of land at Waikanae, in the District of Otaki, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known as Maunganui, being a portion of the Ngarara Block, and containing by admeasurement 15,750 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North-east by the Ngawahakangutu No. 2 and the Ngakaroro No. 2A Blocks; on the South-east by the Tararua Block;

on the South-west by waste lands of the Crown; and on the North-east by other portion of the Ngarara Block.

KIRIKAU.

All that parcel of land at Tuhua, in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Kirikau, containing by admeasurement 17,933 acres, more or less. KAREWAREWA No. 1.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Karewarewa No. 1, containing by admeasurement 3,243 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North-east by Native land and the Otamo No. 2 Block, 9227 links; towards the South-east by Karewarewa No. 2 Block 19694 links, and by the Upokongaro Stream; towards the West by Native land, 21023 links; and towards the North-west by Native land, 18367 links.

KAREWAREWA No. 2.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Karewarewa No. 2, containing by admeasurement 436 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North-west by the Karewarewa No. 1 and the Otamo No. 1 Blocks, 20926 links; towards the North-east by the Otamo No. 2 Block, 1435 links; towards the South-east by the Otamo No. 2 Block aforesaid; and towards the South-west by the Otamo No. 2 Block aforesaid, 1589 links.

TE PARAPARA BLOCK.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known as Te Parapara, containing by admeasurement 915 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North by the Omorehu Stream; towards the East by Native land, 16051 links, more or less; and towards the South-west by the Otaupari Stream and by Native land, a distance of 5134 links, more or less.

ATUAHAE.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Atuahae, containing by admeasurement 4,650 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North by lines, 14471 links; towards the East by the Mangaetoroa Stream; towards the South-east and South by lines 21200 links, and by the Pongarauhao Stream; towards the North-west by the Ararimu Stream; and towards the West by the Mangaiohi Block, 13473 links: excepting out of the hereinbefore-described area the unsold interests of Pio Hemoata, Warena te Riaki, and Mioriana Tiehu, containing by admeasurement 498 acres, more or less.

PUKETOTARA No. 2.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Puketotara No. 2, containing by admeasurement 5,178 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North by the Maungaporau Block;

towards the West by the Mangapapa No. 1 and Manganui-o-tahu Blocks; towards the South by the Manganui-o-tahu Block; and towards the East by Puketotara No. 1 Block.

UMUMORE.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Umumore, containing by admeasurement 842 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North-west by the Mangawhero River; towards the East by the Rangataua Block, 13970 links; and towards the South by the Tawhito Ariki Block 1250 links, and by the Makaranui Stream.

RANGATAUA NORTH No. 1.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Rangataua North No. 1, containing by admeasurement 8,448 acres, more or less. Bounded on the North-east by Native land, 7204 links; on the South-east by lines, about 70490 links, separating this block from Rangataua North No. 3; on the West and South-west by Rangataua Block South 21542 links, and Rangataua Block North No. 2 about 5950 links; and on the North-west by Rangataua North No. 2, 12300 links, also by the Mangawhero and Mangaiti Streams, and also by lines separating this block from Native land about 34762 links.

RANGATAUA NORTH No. 3.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Rangataua North No. 3, containing by admeasurement 2,112 acres, more or less. Bounded on the North-east by Native land, 1848 links; on the South-east by the Maungahuehu River; on the Westward by the Otawa Stream and a line, about 4100 links, separating this block from Rangataua South; and on the North-west by lines, about 70490 links, separating this block from Rangataua North No. 1.

RANGATAUA WEST.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Rangataua West, containing by admeasurement 574 acres, more or less. Bounded on the North-west by the Umumore Block, a distance of about 14000 links; on the North-east by the Mangawhero River; and on the South-east by a line, a distance of about 14900 links, separating this block from Rangataua South.

RANGATAUA SOUTH.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Rangataua South, containing by admeasurement 11,127 acres, more or less. Bounded on the North and North-east by Rangataua Block North a distance of 31900 links, also by the Otawa Creek and the Maungahuehu River; on the South-east by lines, a distance of 36700 links, passing by Trig. Station Kopurutuku to Ruakuku No. 2; on the South-west by lines from Ruakuku No. 2 to the Mangahouhou Stream a distance of about 5427 links, by the Mangahouhou Stream, and by lines 7557 links, to the junction with Tawhito Ariki boundary; and on the North-west by the Tawhito Ariki Block, also by a line a distance of about 14900 links separating this block from Rangataua West, and by the Mangawhero River.

TARUAMOUKU.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Taruamouku, containing by

admeasurement 214 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North by unsurveyed Native territory, 3367 links; towards the East by a stream and by lines, a distance of 784 links and 5488 links; towards the South by lines 872 links, and by the Weratupua Stream; and towards the West by unsurveyed Native territory, 10147 links.

HUIKUMU.

All that parcel of land in the District of Whanganui, in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Huikumu, containing by admeasurement 1,206 acres, more or less. Bounded on the North by the Huikumu Stream; on the East by lines, 7147 links; on the South by lines, 15830 links; and on the West by lines, 11409 links: excepting out of the hereinbefore-described boundaries the Onewhakahorohoro burial-ground, containing by admeasurement 2 acres, more or less.

KAITANGIWHENUA.

All that parcel of land in the District of Patea, partly in the Provincial District of Taranaki and partly in the Provincial District of Wellington, known by the name of Kaitangiwhenua, containing by admeasurement 93,630 acres, more or less, namely, 91,630 acres in the Provincial District of Taranaki, and 2,000 acres in the Provincial District of Wellington. Bounded towards the North by the Mangaotuku Block, 103189 links; towards the East by lines 116609 links, by the Waitotara Stream, and by lines 64003 links; towards the South by the Confiscation boundary-line, 86070 links; and towards the West by the Whenuakura Stream, and by the Kaharoa No. 2 Block, the Kaharoa No. 1 Block, and the Matemateaonga Block, 139959 links.

KAHAROA No. 1.

All that parcel of land at Patea, in the District of Patea, in the Provincial District of Taranaki, known by the name of Te Kaharoa No. 1, containing by admeasurement 8,750 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North and East by Native land and the Whenuakura River, 45350 links; towards the South-east by Native land, 14379 links; towards the South-west by Native land, 41225 links; and towards the North-west by Native land, 20190 links.

MANGAERE.

All those two parcels of land at Patea, in the District of Patea, in the Provincial District of Taranaki, known by the name of Mangaere, containing together by admeasurement 6,250 acres, more or less. One piece containing 5,520 acres; bounded towards the North by lines, 33705 links; towards the South-east by the Mangaotuku Block, 33036 links; towards the South by the said Mangaotuku Block, 23885 links; and towards the West by Te Wera Block, 27732 links. The other piece containing 730 acres; bounded towards the North-east and East by lines, 18156 links; towards the South by the Mangaotuku Block, 7750 links; and towards the West by the said Mangaotuku Block, 16800 links.

RAORAOMOUKU.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Taranaki, known by the name of Raoraomouku, containing by admeasurement 8,697 acres, more or less. Bounded on the North and North-west by the Aratawa Block and by lines, a distance of about 7700 links; on the North-east by the Whanganui River; on the South-east by the Maungapukatea Block; and on the South and South-west by the Mangapapa Stream and by lines, a distance of about 32599 links.

ARATAWA.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Taranaki, known by the name of Aratawa, containing

by admeasurement 4,207 acres, more or less. Bounded on the North and North-west by the Mangamingi Creek; on the East by lines, a distance of 18996 links, to Ngatokorua Trig. Station; and on the South by the Raoraomouku Block, a distance of about 51003 links, round Iringahuru Trig. Station, to the Mangamingi Creek.

MAUNGAPUKATEA.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Taranaki, known by the name of Maungapukatea, containing by admeasurement 2,495 acres, more or less. And whereas the Auckland Timber Company (Limited) (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), desires to build a wharf at Mongonui, a place where no Harbour Board is in existence:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize the Company to build, for the use and benefit of the public, a wharf in the Harbour of Mongonui, in accordance with plans marked MD 580 and 581, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, and to use and occupy such portion of the foreshore or of any tidal land or tidal water as may be necessary for the construction and use of such wharf, subject to the following conditions, that is to say,—

1. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon.

2. That Her Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

3. That the Company shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Marine Department.

4. That any person authorized by the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any officer acting with his approval, may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repairs thereof; and that, upon his leaving at the last known address of the Company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Company, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the Company shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That the Company will not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Marine Department.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the Company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Customs, or with any provisions of "The

Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.

7. That it shall be lawful for the Company to levy wharfage on all goods landed or shipped from the said wharf at such rates as may from time to time be approved of by the Governor in Council: Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall authorize the Company to charge with wharfage—

Any stores or goods required for the use of Her Majesty's naval or military forces, or for any ship in the naval service of any foreign power:

Goods of or for the service of Her Majesty in the colony:

Any goods under seizure of officers of revenue: The baggage of any person in the service of Her Majesty whilst travelling on duty.

8. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister having charge of the Marine Department.

9. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked.

10. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Company six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor or the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at the last known address of the Company, its administrators or assigns.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council of the 15th July, extending the provisions of "The Foreign

Deserters Act, 1852," to the crews of Danish ships when within Her Majesty's dominions.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign Power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such Power when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen (not being Danish subjects) who desert from British merchant ships in territories belonging to His Majesty the King of Denmark will be given under an agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Denmark, signed at London on the 21st of June, 1881:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that, from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves (and not being British subjects), who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of the King of Denmark within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships; provided always that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence, if any, has been fully carried into effect.

And Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of her Privy Council, is further pleased to order and declare that, upon and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to the subjects of the King of Denmark, made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 13th day of June, 1853, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 14th day of June, 1853, shall be revoked, and the same is hereby revoked accordingly.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first ten thousand (10,000) gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first fifty tons of oil cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than one hundred tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first one hundred tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

GUNPOWDER.

The Government are prepared to receive proposals from any person willing to establish a factory for the manufacture of blasting and sporting powder. The proposer to state what amount of bonus he would require to induce him to undertake the manufacture.

The place where the factory is to be erected to be subject to the approval of the Government, the plans and specifications of the building to be also approved by Government.

All the internal fittings and the arrangements for carrying on the manufacture of the gunpowder to be subject to the inspection of an officer appointed by the Government.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk), which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

MEAT.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given on the first 100 tons of fresh meat exported from New Zealand in vessels fitted with refrigerating machinery. Such meat must have been collected in a refrigerating chamber in this colony, and must have been landed in Europe in sound marketable condition.

CONDITIONS.

NOTICE of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1881.

The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1882.
