

Land taken for Relief Channel, Buller River.

(L.s.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a relief channel for the Buller River: And whereas the Minister for Public Works has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purpose of a relief channel for the Buller River; and that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a relief channel for the Buller River.

Defining the Middle Line of Portion of the Picton-Hurunui Railway, Vernon Contract.

## (L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Picton to Hurunui is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said portion of the said railway shall be from a point in Section number one, Omaka District, all within the Provincial District of Marlborough, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 8770, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Walter Woods Johnston, Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the

Supreme Court at Blenheim, in the Provincial District of Marlborough.

Revised Regulations for Purchase, Control, and Issue of Working Räilway Stores.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by Order in Council bearing date the twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventynine, certain amended regulations relating to railway stores were made under the eighty-fifth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878:" And whereas it is expedient that the said regulations should be repealed and revoked, and revised regulations made:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir Arthur Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred upon him by the said eighty-fifth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby repeal and revoke the aforesaid regulations of the said twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and doth also hereby make the new regulations for the purchase, control, and issue of Working Railway stores, and for accounting for the same, contained in the Schedule hereto; and it is hereby also, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, ordered that this Order in Council, and the regulations hereby made, shall have the full force of law from and after the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-

#### SCHEDULE.

Supplies shall be purchased under contract whenever practicable and advantageous, tenders being publicly called.

2. The purchase, control, and issue of stores, and accounting for the same, shall be performed by such officers as the Minister for Public Works may appoint, and subject to such instructions and orders as may be issued by the General Manager of Railways in conformance with these regulations.

3. Accounts shall be passed on the certificate of the Stores Manager, or on that of some person duly authorized, who, if the stores are bought under contract, shall certify that they are in accordance with contract, or, if not under contract, that the price is reasonable.

4. Stores shall be issued only on the requisition of duly-authorized officers.

5. An invoice-book, a day-book of issues, and a ledger of quantities shall be kept in each depôt.

6. An account of all transactions connected with receipts and issues of stores in each depôt shall be made out at intervals of not less than four weeks.

7. The Storekeeper in each depôt shall take stock annually as directed, under the supervision of a dulyappointed officer, who shall certify to the correctness of the stock list, and shall audit the local accounts.

8. The Stores Manager shall keep a ledger at the head office of the quantities and values of stores at each depôt, which shall be compiled from the returns from the local depôts, and which shall be periodically compared and balanced with the general account kept by the Railway Accountant.

9. A debtor and creditor general account shall be kept by the Railway Accountant, embracing the transactions of all the stores depôts.

10. The cost of stores purchased shall be defrayed from the moneys from time to time appropriated for Working Railways by the General Assembly, and credit shall be taken in the Working Railway accounts for the value of sales to the public or to other Government departments, and for the value of stock in hand at the end of each financial year.

11. The accounts and books shall be open for the inspection and audit of the Controller and Auditor-

General.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Wellington, 18th May, 1881.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

#### SUGAR

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

#### LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first ten thousand (10,000) gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

#### OIL CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first fifty tons of oil cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

#### STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

#### SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

## SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

#### SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than one hundred tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first one hundred tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

#### GUNPOWDER.

The Government are prepared to receive proposals from any person willing to establish a factory for the manufacture of blasting and sporting powder. The proposer to state what amount of bonus he would require to induce him to undertake the manufacture.

The place where the factory is to be erected to be subject to the approval of the Government, the plans and specifications of the building to be also approved by Government.

All the internal fittings and the arrangements for carrying on the manufacture of the gunpowder to be subject to the inspection of an officer appointed by the Government.

## BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk), which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

#### MEAT.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given on the first 100 tons of fresh meat exported from New Zealand in vessels fitted with refrigerating machinery. Such meat must have been collected in a refrigerating chamber in this colony, and must have been landed in Europe in sound marketable condition.

#### CONDITIONS.

Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1881.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 447, against 458 in October, being a decrease of 11. The deaths amounted to 134 in November, an increase of 4 on the number for October.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 75; females, 59. 63 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 47.01 per cent. of the whole number; 41 of these were of children under one year of age.

The births were 245 in November, against 257 in October, a decrease of 12.
The deaths in November were 83, against 72 in October, an increase of 11.
There were 5 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: a male of 68 and 2 females of 72 and 75 died at Auckland; a male of 73 at Wellington; and a male of 82 at Christchurch.

Zymotic Diseases.—These diseases caused 18 deaths in November, against 17 in October. There was a slight increase in the deaths from scarlatina: 8 in November, 4 in October; five of these deaths in November occurred in Dunedin. Three deaths from diphtheria occurred in Wellington. There was not any death from typhoid fever.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths from these causes were 17 in November, against 15 in October. There were 11 deaths from phthisis in November.

Local Diseases.—There were 35 deaths from these causes in November, against 32 in October. Diseases of the digestive organs caused 7 deaths in November, against 4 in October.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
