Revised Regulations for Purchase, Control, and Issue of Working Railway Stores.

> ARTHUR GORDON, GOVETNOR. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of D&ember, 1881. Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOE IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS by Order in Council bearing date the twenty.tthird day of September, one thousand sight hundred and seventy-nine, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-fifth day of Sepember, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, certain amended regulations relating to railway stores were made under the eighty-fifth section of 'The Public Revenues Act, 1878 : " And whereas t is expedient that the said regulations should be repealed and revoked, and revised regulations made:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir Arthur Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred upon nim by the said eighty-fifth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony. toth hereby repeal and revoke the aforesaid regulations of the said twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and doth also hereby make the new regulations for the purchase, control, and issue of Working Railway stores, and for accounting for the same, contained in the Schedule hereto; and it is hereby also, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, ordered that this Order in Council, and tho regulations hereby made, shall have the full farce of law from and after the thirteenth day of December. one thousand eight hundred and eightyone.

SCHEDULE.

SUPPLIES shall be purchased under contract whenever practicable and advantageous, tenders being publicly called

2. The purchase, control, and issue of stores, and accounting for the same, shall be performed by such officers as the Minister for Public Works may appoint, and subject to such instructions and orders as may be issued by the General Manager of Rail-ways in conformance with these regulations.

3 Accounts shall he passed on the certificate of the Stores Manager, or on that of some person duly authorized, who, if the stores are bought under contract, shall certify that. they are in accordance with contract, or, if not under contract, that the price is reasonable.

4. Stores shall be issued only on the requisition of duly-authorized officers.

5. An invoice-book, a day-book of issues, and a ledger of quantities shall be kept in each depôt.

6 An account of all transactions connected with receipts and issues of stores in each depôt shall be made out at intervals of not less than four weeks.

7. The Storekeeper in each depôt shall take stock annually as directed, under the supervision of a duly. appointed officer, who shall certify to the correctness of the stock list, and shall audit the local accounts.

8. The Stores Manager shall keep a ledger at the head office of tho quantities and values of stores at each depôt, which shall be compiled from the returns from the local depôts, and which shall be periodically compared and. balanced with the general account kept by the Railway Accountant.

9. A debtor and creditor general account shall be kept by the Railway Accountant, embracing the transactions of all the stores depôts.

10. The coat of stores purchased shall be defrayed from the moneys from time to time appropriated for Working Railways by the General Assembly, and credit shall be taken in the Working Railway accounts for the value of sales to the public or to other Government departments, and for the value of stock in hand at the end of each financial gear.

11. The accounts and books shall be open for the inspection and audit of the Controller and Auditor. General

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

Weinington, 18th May, 1881. NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under :---

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (\pounds 500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first ten thousand (10,000) gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

On CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first fifty tons of oil cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A **bonus** of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first fifty tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be **given** by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' ($\pounds 1,000$) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (\$50) nor more than one hundred pounds ($\pounds 100$) produced hy any one person.

SULPHURIC ACID.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) per annum will be given for three years in succession for the production each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than fifty tons of sulphuric acid, of good marketable quality. The producer to the satisfaction of the Colonial Secretary of the first fifty tons shall be also entitled to the payments of the two following years if he fulfils the conditions.

SUGAB-REFINING.

A bonus of fire hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than one hundred tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must ha what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery, The firm refining the first one hundred tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

GUNPOWDER.

The Government are prepared to receive proposals from any person willing to establish a factory for tha manufacture of blasting and sporting ponder. The proposer to state what amount of bonus he would require to induce him to undertake the manufacture.

The place where the factory is to be erected to be subject to the approval of the Government, the plans and specifications of the building to be also approved by Government.

All the internal fittings and the arrangements for carrying on the manufacture of the gunpowder to be subject to the inspection of an officer appointed by the Government.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds ($\pounds 500$) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tom of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk), which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

MEAT.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given on the first 100 tons of fresh meat exported from $N_{\rm GW}$ Zealand in vessels fitted with refrigerating machinery. Such meat must have been collected in a refrigerating chamber in this colony, and must have been landed in Europe in sound marketable condition.

CONDITIONS.

NOTICE of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1881. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1882.

RETURN of the Number of Births, with the actual Mortality of Males and Females, and the Proportion of Deaths to Population, in the under-mentioned Boroughs, during the Month of November, 1881.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 447, against 458 in October, being a decrease of 11. The deaths amounted to 134 in November, an increase of 4 on the number for October. Of the above deaths, males contributed 75; females, 59. 63 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 47.01 per cent. of the whole number; 41 of these were of children under one year of age.

THE following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each cause in the Boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christ-ohurch, and Dunedin that were registered during the Month of November, 1881.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs :--The births were 245 in November, against 257 in October, a decrease of 12. The deaths in November were 83, against 72 in October, an increase of 11. There were 5 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards : a male of 68 and 2 females of 72 and 75 died at Auckland; a male of 73 at Wellington; and a male of 82 at Christchurch. Zymotic Diseases.-These diseases caused 18 deaths in November, against 17 in October. There was a slight increase in the deaths from scarlatina : 8 in November, 4 in October; five of these deaths in November occurred in Dunedin. Three deaths from diphtheria occurred in Wellington. There was not any death from typhoid fover. *Constitutional Diseases.*-The deaths from these causes were 17 in November, against 15 in October. There were 11 deaths from phthisis in November. *Local Diseases.*-There were 35 deaths from these causes in November, against 32 in October. Diseases of the digestive organs caused 7 deaths in November, against 4 in October.
