 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the twenty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time establish, and define, abolish, alter, or reconstitute local districts for the sale or disposal of land, and in like manner from time to time may appoint Land Officers or other persons for conducting sales of land in such local districts, and for receiving applications for the sale, letting, disposal, or occupation of Crown lands, and for generally carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby appoint

JACKSON KEDDELL

to be a Land Officer for conducting sales of land, and for receiving applications for the sale, letting, and disposal or occupation of Crown lands, and for generally carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act within the Naseby Local Land District, as established by Proclamation under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, dated the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

Land taken for Road through Section No. 2, Petone, Belmont Survey District, Wellington.

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road through Section number two, Petone, Belmont Survey District, Provincial District of Wellington:

And whereas the Minister for Public Works has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the twelfth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges,

claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Rangiora High School Act, 1881," and "The Akaroa High School Act, 1881," it is respectively provided that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners appointed under "The Education Reserves Act, 1877," for the Provincial District of Canterbury, to select and set apart certain reserves for the maintenance of the high schools respectively established under the provisions of the said Acts; and that, on the Proclamation of the Governor that such reserves have been selected and set apart for the said high schools, such reserves respectively shall absolutely vest in the Boards of Governors in the said Acts respectively mentioned:

And whereas Henry Porcher Lance, Esquire, John Marshman, Esquire, George Lilly Mellish, Esquire, James Edward Parker, Esquire, and Henry Richard Webb, Esquire, are the School Commissioners appointed under the said "Education Reserves Act, 1877," for the Provincial District of Canterbury, and they have selected the reserves described in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the terms of the respective Acts hereinbefore mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said recited Acts, do hereby proclaim and declare that the reserves, particulars whereof are described in the First Schedule hereto, have been selected and set apart for the Rangiora High School, as provided by "The Rangiora High School Act, 1881;" and that the reserves, particulars whereof

are described in the Second Schedule hereto, have been selected and set apart for the Akaroa High School, as provided by "The Akaroa High School Act, 1881."

WHEREAS by section nine of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," it is enacted that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired under "The Public Works Act, 1876," or "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and Acts amending the same, or otherwise howsoever, for Government works, is not required for such works, the Governor may cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein set forth:

And whereas the Minister for Public Works has laid before the Governor the memorial referred to in the twenty-ninth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," praying the Governor, by an Order in Council, to cause such land to be sold:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities aforesaid, do hereby order

and authorize the land described in the Schedule hereto to be sold and dealt with in the manner and subject to the conditions of the twenty-ninth and following sections of "The Public Works Act, 1876."

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserves made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and known as the Woodend Recreation-grounds, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same are hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1881;" and such domains shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

SCHEDULE.

WOODEND Recreation-ground No. 1: All that parcel of land in the Rangiora Survey District, Provincial District of Canterbury, containing 6 acres and 23 perches, more or less, being part of Reserve No. 94 (in red). Powers delegated to the Woodend Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1881."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this tenth day of January, 1882.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Woodend Domain Board:—

EDWARD JAMES PATEMAN,
FREDERICK HORRELL,
ALFRED CATCHPOLE,
ROBERT SPENCER TURNER, and
JAMES JUDSON

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the school-room, Woodend, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Tuesday in January in every succeeding year, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made by warrant published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 84, and dated the twentieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, for public recreation in the Provincial District of Canterbury, as an extension of the Timaru Public Park, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1881;" and the same shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with by the Timaru Public Park and Garden Domain Board, constituted by Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

WHEREAS the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto were reserved for municipal purposes

Appointing Trustees under Maori Real Estate Management Acts, 1867 and 1877.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last-recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

The light, a fixed white one of the third order, in lat. 34° 54' S., and long. 137° 1' E. (approximately), having the focal plane 98 feet above ordinary sea-level, will be visible from a vessel's deck, in clear weather, at a distance of fourteen miles, and illuminate an arc of the sea-horizon of 200° from S. 45° W. round by the W. and N. to N. 65° E.

These bearings (magnetic) are from the lighthouse.

The light-tower, keepers' cottages, and store-room are painted white.

The University of London and the Gilchrist Scholarship.

Education Department,

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University June Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the June examination for New Zealand will be held some time in the month of June, 1882, or as soon after as the examination papers arrive in the colony, and at such place or places as may be hereafter fixed, having regard to the candidates' places of abode.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin.
2. Any two of the following languages: (a) Greek, (b) French, and (c) German.
3. The English language, English history, and modern geography.
4. Mathematics.
5. Natural philosophy.
6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for June, 1882, are *Livy*, Book II.; and *Homer*, Iliad, Book XVIII.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1883, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1883, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.

Notice of entry, with satisfactory testimonials as to personal character, and the London matriculation fee of £2, must be sent to the Secretary for Education, Wellington, so as to reach his office not later than the 1st June, 1882.
