Defining the Middle Line of Portion of the Foxton to New Plymouth Railway — Waverley to Patea Section.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Foxton to New Plymouth is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twentytwo, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point on the western boundary of Section number three hundred and thirty-six, in the Wairoa Highway District, Provincial District of Wellington, to a point in Section number one hundred and ten, in the Patea East Highway District, Carlyle Survey District, in the Provincial District of Taranaki, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 8826, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable John Hall, Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Ply-mouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki.

John Hall, Minister Acting for the Minister for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Plymouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki; the total distance being 8 miles 18 chains.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign Power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given,

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen (not being Danish subjects) who desert from British merchant ships in territories belonging to His Majesty the King of Denmark will be given under an agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Denmark, signed at

London on the 21st of June, 1881:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that, from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, seamen, not being slaves (and not being British subjects), who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of the King of Denmark within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships; provided always that, if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions, he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence, if any, has been fully carried into effect.

And Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of her Privy Council, is further pleased to order and declare that, upon and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to the subjects of the King of Denmark made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 13th day of June, 1853, and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of June, 1853, shall be revoked, and the same is hereby revoked accordingly.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give

the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AGREEMENT between the Governments of Great Britain and Denmark relative to Merchant Seamen Deserters.—Signed at London, 21st June, 1881.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, being desirous, for the benefit of the commerce of the two countries, to facilitate the discovery, apprehension, and surrender of seamen who may desert from merchant vessels of either country, on the basis of a full and entire reciprocity, have agreed as follows:

It is mutually agreed that if any seamen or apprentices, not being slaves, should desert from any ship belonging to a subject of either of the contracting parties, within any port in the territories or in the possessions or colonies of the other contracting party, the authorities of such port and territory, possession or colony, shall be bound to give every assistance in their power for the apprehension and sending on board of such deserters, on application to that effect being made to them by the Consul of the country to which the ship of the deserter may belong, or by the deputy or representative of the Consul.

It is understood that the preceding stipulations

shall not apply to subjects of the country where the

desertion shall take place.

Each of the two high contracting parties reserves to itself the right of terminating this agreement at any time, on giving to the other a year's notice of its wish to that effect.

In witness whereof the undersigned, duly authorized for that purpose, have signed the present agreement, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details

3. The English language, English history, and modern geography.

4. Mathematics.

5. Natural philosophy.

6. Chemistry

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of Loudon, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for June, 1882, are Livy, Book II.; and Homer, Iliad, Book XVIII.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1883, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1883, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first ex-amination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 401, against 447 in November, being a decrease of 46. The deaths amounted to 155 in December, an increase of 21 on the number for November.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 84; females, 71. 74 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 47.74 per cent. of the whole number; 53 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—
The births were 238 in December, against 245 in November, a decrease of 7.
The deaths in December were 104, against 83 in November, an increase of 21.
There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: three males aged respectively 81, 76, and 68 years, and a female of 70, died at Auckland; a male of 86, and two females of 82 and 70, at Wellington; two males of 78 and 65, and a female of 68, at Christchurch; and a female of 76 at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases increased in number from 18 in November to 24 in December, the deaths from dysentery and diarrhea having caused 9 deaths in December, against 2 in November. The deaths from these causes in December of the previous year were 20, as compared with 5 in the preceding month. Scarlatina caused 6 deaths last month, against 8 in November: of these deaths, 4 occurred in Dunedin.

Constitutional Diseases.—There were 14 deaths from these diseases in December, against 17 in November. The deaths from cancer were 4 in December, and 2 in November. Deaths from phthisis decreased from 11 in November to 6 in December.

Local Diseases.—These diseases caused 36 deaths in December, against 35 in November. Of these, the diseases of the respiratory organs caused 5 deaths in December, against 11 in November; and diseases of the digestive system caused 4 deaths in December, against 7 in November. Diseases of the urinary organs caused 5 deaths in December, against 2 in November.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition
