Altering Boundaries of Resident Magistrate's District of Manawatu, and abolishing District of Otaki.

(L.S.) A. GORDON, Governor.
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish, and the boundaries to define and alter, and in any such Proclamation to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished, as the case may be:

And whereas by Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in him, did proclaim and constitute the Districts of Otaki and Manawatu, as described in the said Proclamation, to be Resident Magistrates' districts within the meaning and for the purpose of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said District of Otaki, and to alter the boundaries of the said District of Manawatu so constituted as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby abolish the said District of Otaki, and alter the boundaries of the said District of Manawatu, as described in the Schedule hereto, as and from the first day of March next.

SCHEDULE.

THIS district is bounded towards the North by a right line from a point on the West Coast five miles north of the mouth of the Rangitikei River to the Manawatu Gorge; towards the South-east and South

by the Taranua Range, by the summit of the watershed between Porirua Harbour and the Hutt River to a point in line with the production of the northern boundary-line of Section No. 34, Tukapu District; thence by a right line to said boundary-line, by said section to its north-western corner; thence by a right line to the Porirua Ferry, and by the waters of Porirua Harbour to the ocean; and towards the West by the ocean: including the adjacent islands; as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Wellington.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Taranaki.

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on

deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Taranaki did, on the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at New Plymouth, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in that office.

In pursuance of section four of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby declare that subsection four of the sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," shall not apply to any of the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto was set apart as a site

for a public library: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, it is expedient to exchange the said land for that mentioned in the second column hereto, being land of equal value therewith, which, by conveyance or transfer executed prior to the passing of the Order in Council, has been vested in Her Majesty the Queen: And whereas it is further desirable, in the opinion of the Governor, to dedicate the said land so vested in Her Majesty for the same purpose, to wit, as a site for a public library, and further to vest the same, from the date of the gazetting hereof, in the body corporate known as the Wairoa Mechanics' Institute as trustees:

Authorizing the St. Heliers Land, Building, and Investment Company (Limited) to build a Wharf in Auckland Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of January, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence the Governor in Council may authorize any person to construct harbour works (other than the reclamation of land from the sea, or any harbour, or the construction of any graving dock, dock, or breakwater in any harbour or in the sea), and to use and occupy such part of the foreshore, or of any tidal land or tidal waters, as may be necessary for the construction or use of such harbour works in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence: And whereas by the seventeenth section of the said Act it is also enacted that every such Order in Council shall be made upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit, and the rights thereby conferred shall only be granted for a limited period

not exceeding in any case fourteen years, and may at any time be altered, modified, or revoked: And whereas by the one hundred and fifty-second section of the said Act it is further enacted that, where it shall appear to the Governor in Council that any harbour works are required for the use, benefit, or convenience of the public within a harbour under the control of a Harbour Board, and that such Board cannot conveniently execute or carry out such works, then, and in any such case, the Governor in Council may exercise the powers vested in him by the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth sections of the said Act:

And whereas the St. Heliers Land, Building, and Investment Company (Limited) (hereinafter termed "the Company"), desire to build a wharf, for the use, benefit, and convenience of the public, in Auckland Harbour, which harbour is within the control of the Auckland Harbour Board; but the said Board cannot conveniently execute or carry out such work; and the Company have applied to the Governor in Council for the issue of this order:

And whereas the said Company have deposited plans of the said wharf (marked M.D. 598 and 597) at the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in the manner prescribed by the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of the said Act, and, it having been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, the Governor in Council hath this day approved of the said deposited plans without any modification or addition, and subject to the conditions set forth in this Order in Council:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize the Company to build in Auckland Harbour, for the use, benefit, and convenience of the public, a wharf, in accordance with the said plan marked M.D. 598, and in the position shown on the said plan marked M.D. 597, and to use and occupy such portion of the foreshore or of any tidal land or tidal water as may be necessary for the construction and use of such wharf, subject to the following conditions, that is to say,—

1. That all persons shall, at all reasonable times, either in the daytime or at night, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, after the same shall have been completed in accordance with the said plans, and to have ingress to and upon the said wharf, and egress therefrom, and regress thereto, as occasion may require.

2. That every person, authority, or thing exempt from harbour dues under the one hundred and thirty-second section of the said Act shall also be exempt from all dues or payments in respect of the said wharf or the use thereof.

3. That the Company shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

4. That any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repairs thereof; and that, upon such Minister leaving at the last known address of the Company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Company, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the Company shall,

with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That the Company will not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the Company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Auckland Harbour Board.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

9. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Company six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at the last known address of the Company.

10. The Company shall not sell, mortgage, lease, or otherwise part with, charge, or encumber the said wharf or any right or privilege hereby conferred upon it without the consent in writing of the Minister.

11. Nothing contained in this Order in Council shall be deemed to prevent its revocation at any time and without any notice in case the Company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (3.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf.

And publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Company, and to all persons concerned or interested in the said wharf, that this Order in Council and the rights and privileges thereby conferred have been revoked and determined.

12. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which, in his opinion, are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the land in the Land Districts of Welling-

ton and Nelson, described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purpose in the said Schedule specified.

And whereas by the one hundred and forty-fifth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said one hundred and forty-fourth section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by the several warrants the dates of which are specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and the notifications of which were published in the *Gazettes* specified in the fourth column, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the lands so temporarily reserved as aforesaid, and enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule, being the same purposes for which the said lands were so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

Shooting Season for Deer in Nelson.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1881," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that stags may be taken or killed within the Nelson District from the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, both inclusive. And I do hereby notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of one pound each; and that licenses to sell such game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each, and the Commissioner of Crown Lands at Nelson is hereby appointed to issue the said licenses.

The University of London and the Gilchrist Scholarship.

Education Department,

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University June Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the June examination for New Zealand will be held some time in the month of June, 1882, or as soon after as the examination papers arrive in the colony, and at such place or places as may be hereafter fixed, having regard to the candidates' places of abode.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin.
2. Any two of the following languages: (a) Greek, (b) French, and (c) German.
3. The English language, English history, and modern geography.
4. Mathematics.
5. Natural philosophy.
6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for June, 1882, are *Livy*, Book II.; and *Homer*, Iliad, Book XVIII.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1883, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1883, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.

Notice of entry, with satisfactory testimonials as to personal character, and the London matriculation fee of £2, must be sent to the Secretary for Education, Wellington, so as to reach his office not later than the 1st June, 1882.
