 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881," (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act: And, in further pursuance and exercises of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Outram Town District," and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners of the said district shall consist of five in number.

WHEREAS by the fortieth section of "The Fencing Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is amongst other things enacted that if the Council of any county in which the whole of "The Counties Act, 1876," is in operation shall by resolution request the Governor to suspend the operation of the said Act within such county, the Governor shall by Proclamation suspend the said Act accordingly:

And whereas the whole of "The Counties Act, 1876," is in operation in the County of Hutt:

And whereas the Council of the County of Hutt did, on the tenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution requesting the Governor to suspend the operation of the said Act within the County of Hutt:

Now therefore I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore recited power and authority, do hereby proclaim and declare that the operation of the said Act is suspended within the County of Hutt, as the same is constituted and described by "The Counties Act, 1876."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Hawke's Bay did, on the thirtieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Monday, the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at Napier, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in that office.

In pursuance of section four of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby declare that subsection four of the sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," shall not apply to any of the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like matter set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the land specified in the Schedule hereto was, with other lands, on the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, proclaimed as set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on

the twenty-fifth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be withdrawn from the deferred-payment system:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation:

*Regulations and Charges for use of Telephones.*

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventh day of February, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Electric Telegraph Act, 1875," and "The Electric Telegraph Act 1875 Amendment Act, 1881," and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, make the regulations contained in the Schedule hereto in relation to the charges to be made for the use of telephones wherever established in this colony in connection with the telephone exchanges, and doth further order and declare that such regulations shall take effect on and after the date of the gazetting hereof.

SCHEDULE.

THROUGHOUT this regulation, "exchange" means any telegraph office to which a number of private telephone wires are led in for the purpose of intercommunication amongst the subscribers.

A "bureau station" means any ordinary telegraph station connected by telephone with an exchange.

The following shall be the charges to be paid by the public for the use of Government telephones

wherever established in the colony at a bureau station in connection with an exchange:—

Where the line used is not more than four miles long, a uniform charge of 6d. for the use of same for any period not exceeding five minutes, and a further charge of 6d. for every additional five minutes or portion of five minutes.

Where the line used is over four miles long, the charges will be 1s. for the use of same for any period not exceeding five minutes, and a further charge of 1s. for every additional five minutes or portion of five minutes.

Any message telephoned by a subscriber through an exchange to a bureau station, and received and delivered by the department within the ordinary circuits of delivery, will be charged 6d. in addition to the above rates.

Messages outside of the limits described above will be subject to special charges for delivery, according to the extra expense incurred in such delivery.

*"Westland and Nelson Coal Fields Administration Amendment Act, 1881."—Empowering Minister to run Trains, &c., over certain Private Lines.*

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

IN pursuance of the powers given by "The Westland and Nelson Coal Fields Administration Amendment Act, 1881," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby empower the Minister for Public Works for the time being to run trains and rolling-stock, at such times and in such manner as the Minister may think fit, for conveying goods and passengers on the railways named below, being railways constructed or deemed to be constructed under the authority of "The Westland and Nelson Coal Fields Administration Act, 1877," and to do all things necessary in connection with running such trains and rolling-stock.

SCHEDULE.

THE Koranui Coal-Mining Company's line, Waimangaroa Valley, from its junction with the Westport-Ngakawau line to its junction with Westport Colliery Company's line.

The Westport Colliery Company's line, from its junction with the Koranui Coal-Mining Company's line to the foot of the Westport Colliery Company's incline, comprehending the sidings at the foot of the said incline.

THE following regulations for the management of the Kaikoura Suburban Cemetery, having been submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published in accordance with "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877."

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR KAIKOURA SUBURBAN PUBLIC CEMETERY, COUNTY OF KAIKOURA.

1. The Kaikoura Suburban Public Cemetery, containing by admeasurement 12 acres, more or less, being Section No. 264 in the District of Kaikoura Suburban, and placed under the care and management of the Cemetery Board of Trustees by Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor, dated the 20th January, 1881, under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," is laid off into blocks, which are reserved by the Board of Trustees for the use of the several denominations, subject to His Excellency the Governor permanently setting the same aside for such purpose in the following order, viz. : Block A1 for the use of the Episcopalians, and the conditional use of the Presbyterians; Block I., for exclusive use of the Episcopalians; Block II., for the exclusive use of the Catholics; Block III., for the exclusive use of the Wesleyans and Methodists; Block IV., for the exclusive use of the Presbyterians; Block V., for the use of any denomination or denominations, sect or sects, not otherwise provided for; as shown by the plan of the divisions deposited in the Crown Lands Office at Blenheim. The several blocks will be subdivided into burial-plots 9 feet by 4 feet, and open for selection by any person requiring the same.

2. That the exclusive right of burial in perpetuity in any plot or plots of ground (not exceeding six in contiguity) may be sold by the Trustees, to persons applying for the same, at £1 1s. per plot; and the Clerk of the cemetery for the time being shall give to the purchaser or purchasers a grant, in the form of Schedule A attached to these regulations, on payment to him of a fee of 1s., together with the cost of all necessary stamps.

3. Owner or owners of the exclusive right of burial in perpetuity in any plot or plots of ground may transfer his, her, or their interest therein to any other person or persons on payment to the Clerk of the cemetery for the time being of a fee of 5s. and the cost of the necessary stamps for such transfer, whether the same is to convey one or more plot or plots to any one and the same person. All transfers shall be in the form laid down in Schedule A annexed to these regulations.

4. The Clerk of the cemetery for the time being shall keep a book, and shall from time to time enter therein the number of every burial-plot sold, together with the name or names of the purchaser or purchasers and the date of sale, particulars of all transfers, and shall record therein all burials in the cemetery; and such record-book shall be open to the inspection of the public at all reasonable times on payment of a fee of 1s. for every such inspection.

5. No grave shall be less than 6 feet deep, and no coffin nearer the surface than 4 feet 6 inches. Owners of private burial-plots desiring a greater depth shall pay an extra charge of 2s. for every foot over and above 6 feet.

6. In all cases of intended interment the person having control of the funeral shall apply to the Clerk of the cemetery for the time being for a warrant for such interment, and the Clerk is hereby authorized to grant a warrant, in the form of Schedule B annexed to these regulations, on payment to him of the following fees, viz. :—

A part or the whole of these charges will be remitted by the Trustees on receipt of satisfactory proof that there are no funds applicable, and that no competent person is liable for the payment.

7. Orders for interment, giving the name, age, and denomination of the deceased, with the name of the officiating minister, date of funeral, and number of burial-plot, must be given to the sexton at least twelve working hours prior to the funeral, otherwise an extra charge of 5s. will be made.

8. All monuments, graves, and grave-stones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners, and any person or persons wishing to purchase a burial-plot or burial-plots in any part of the cemetery not then plotted must pay all the costs of survey by a qualified person.

9. All charges made for any matter or thing relating to the cemetery shall be paid for in advance.

10. A sexton will from time to time be appointed by the Trustees, whose duty it will be to dig and dress all graves required in the cemetery, and no other person will be allowed to dig any grave therein without express permission in writing from the Trustees.

Scholarship.*

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University June Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the June examination for New Zealand will be held some time in the month of June, 1882, or as soon after as the examination papers arrive in the colony, and at such place or places as may be hereafter fixed, having regard to the candidates' places of abode.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin.
2. Any two of the following languages: (a) Greek, (b) French, and (c) German.
3. The English language, English history, and modern geography.
4. Mathematics.
5. Natural philosophy.
6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for June, 1882, are *Livy*, Book II.; and *Homer*, Iliad, Book XVIII.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1883, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1883, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.

Notice of entry, with satisfactory testimonials as to personal character, and the London matriculation fee of £2, must be sent to the Secretary for Education, Wellington, so as to reach his office not later than the 1st June, 1882.

TERMS OF SALE.

Rents payable half-yearly, in advance. The first half-year to be paid on the day of sale.

All mineral waters, hot springs, and streams are and remain vested in the Crown.

Proposed reserves for schools, post office, telegraph office, railway, hospital, and other public objects are shown on the official map of the township, subject to such modifications or alterations as may be found advisable. Recreation-grounds are reserved for the public, and will be under the management of a local body.

A resident medical officer has been appointed by the Government.

The government of the town will be by a local body constituted under the Act.

Building sites, peculiarly suitable for residences, will be let subject to restrictions as to use for trades or shops.

All hotels and lodging-houses will be governed by regulations suitable to the exceptional character and requirements of the town.

Rents to be paid half-yearly, in Auckland, or in the Town, as may be found convenient.

Possession of the lands will be given immediately after the auction. The lots may be identified on the ground by marked pegs.

The use of the waters, and all similar arrangements, will be under the control of the doctor and a local body.

Copies of the plans and full printed particulars can be seen at any Post or Telegraph Office, Railway Station, and Athenæum, or they can be obtained from any Commissioner of Crown Lands at any Land Office in the colony.
