*Defining the Middle Line of further Portion of the Foxton to New Plymouth Railway (further Portion of Waingongoro Section)—Waingongoro Ballast-pit.*

**A PROCLAMATION.**

**WHEREAS** the line of railway from Foxton to New Plymouth is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point situate at a point four miles ten chains on the centre line of railway, as proclaimed on the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, to a point on the left bank of the Waingongoro River (within Section number thirty-one, Block thirteen, Ngaire Survey District), all within the Provincial District of Taranaki, Colony of New Zealand, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 8883, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Harry Albert Atkinson, the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Plymouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki.

**SCHEDULE.**

COMMENCING at a point 4 miles 15 chains on the centre line of railway, as proclaimed in a Proclamation dated the 31st August, 1880, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 84, of the 2nd September, 1880; proceeding thence in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of 90 chains, passing in, through, or over Sections Nos. 32 and 31, Block XIII., Ngaire Survey District, and terminating at a point in Section No. 31 aforesaid on the left bank of the Waingongoro River, all within the Provincial District of Taranaki, Colony of New Zealand; and including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and water-courses; in the manner delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 8883, signed by the Honorable Harry Albert Atkinson, the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Plymouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki: the total distance being 90 chains or thereabouts.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, proclaim and define the several parts of the colony mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto to be special licensing districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that each such district shall be known by the name by which it is designated in the said Schedule.

## SCHEDULE.

## RAGLAN COUNTY.

*Whaingaroa*.—Being part of that area known as Raglan County. Bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Waikato River, and proceeding along the centre of that river to its confluence with the Waipa River; thence along the centre of the last-mentioned river to its intersection by the northern boundary-line of Allotment No. 21 produced; thence westerly to and along the northern boundary-lines of said Allotment No. 21 and Allotment No. 17, to and across a road-line, thence along the northern boundary-line of Allotment No. 28, to and across a road-line, thence along the northern boundary-lines of Allotments Nos. 42, 41, 40, 39, to and across a road-line, and thence along the northern boundary-line of Allotment No. 43, all of the Parish of Karamu, and along the northern boundary-line of the last-named allotment produced to the summit of the Tena Ranges; thence southerly along the summit of the said Tena Ranges to a point near the source of the Waitetuna River; thence to the source and along the centre of said Waitetuna River to its confluence with the Otonga; thence by the centre of the latter river to part of the eastern boundary-line of Allotment No. 173; thence along other part of said eastern boundary-line of Allotment No. 173 aforesaid and the eastern boundary-line of Allotment No. 167, Parish of Karamu aforesaid, to the north-eastern angle of last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by a right line to north-east corner of Allotment No. 55, Parish of Waipa; thence along the north-eastern and north-western boundary-lines of said Allotment No. 55, and by lines so as to include Allotments Nos. 74, 73, 71, 72, 33, 56, 59, and 60, all of the Parish of Waipa aforesaid, to the Whaingaroa Harbour; thence by said harbour and the ocean to the place of commencement: including all islands in the Waikato River from its mouth to its confluence with the Waipa River.

## KAWHIA COUNTY.

*Kawhia*.—Being all that area known as Kawhia County. Bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Pakoko Creek, in the Aotea Harbour, and proceeding along the centre of said creek to the Matau (old pa); thence by a right line to the south-easternmost angle of Allotment No. 101, Parish of Karioi; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary-line of said Allotment No. 101 and the south-eastern boundary-lines of Allotments Nos. 100, 97, 103, and 104 to the easternmost angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a right line to the

southernmost angle of Allotment No. 63, Parish of Whaingaroa; thence along the south-easternmost boundary-line of last-mentioned allotment and the south-easternmost boundary-lines of Allotments Nos. 62, 61, 61A, and 60, all of the Parish of Whaingaroa aforesaid, to the Waitetuna River; thence southerly along the centre of said Waitetuna River to its source; thence by a right line to the summit of the Teriki Range, where the Native track crosses the said range; thence by a right line to Mount Tahuani; thence by a right line to Mount Pirongia; thence easterly along the confiscation boundary-line to the confluence of the Waipa and the Puniu Rivers; thence by a line passing over the summit of Kakepuka to the summit of Mount Rangitoto; thence westerly by a right line to the most northerly source of the Mokau River, and along the centre of that river to the ocean; thence by the ocean to Pakoko Creek, in Aotea Harbour, the place of commencement.

## WEST TAUPO COUNTY.

*West Taupo*.—Being all that area known as the County of West Taupo. Bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of the Waipa and the Puniu Rivers, and proceeding along the centre of the latter river to its intersection by the confiscation boundary-line; thence north-easterly along the said confiscation boundary-line to the Waikato River; thence southerly along the centre of the said Waikato River to its intersection by a right line drawn from Kopuahau across said Waikato River to Maungatautari Mountain; thence south-westerly along said right line to summit of the said Maungatautari Mountain; thence south-easterly by a right line to Uira Gorge; thence southerly by a right line to the mouth of the Waihora Stream in Lake Taupo; thence along the western shore of that lake to the mouth of the Waihi Stream; thence by a right line to the summit of Tongariro Mountain; thence westerly by a right line to the eastern corner of the Kirikau Block; thence along the northern boundary-line of said Kirikau Block to the Wanganui River; thence northerly along the centre of the last-named river, the centre of the Tuhua River, and along the centre of the Ongarue River to its source; thence by a right line to the summit of Mount Rangitoto; thence northerly along the eastern boundary-line of the Kawhia Licensing District, hereinbefore more particularly defined, to the confluence of the Waipa and the Puniu Rivers, the place of commencement.

## EAST TAUPO COUNTY.

*East Taupo*.—Being all that area known as the County of East Taupo. Bounded by a line commencing at the Uira Gorge and proceeding easterly along a right line to Waiwhakahihi Trig. Station; thence along a right line to Tawhiwhau Trig. Station; thence southerly along a right line to the summit of the Tatarakino Mountain; thence westerly along a right line to the junction of the Rangitaiki River and the main road from Napier to Tapuaeharuru; thence along a right line to the eastern boundary-line of the Tauhara South Block; thence along the centres of the Taharua and the Mohaka Rivers to where the production of a right line drawn from Trig. Station No. 65A to Trig. Station No. 68A strikes the last-named river; thence along said line to said Trig. Station No. 65A; thence westerly along a right line to Trig. Station No. 26 on Tawhekewhango; thence along a right line to Trig. Station No. 27, Patea-Taupo District; thence along a right line to the summit of Ruapehu Mountain; thence northerly by right lines from peak to peak to the summit of Tongariro Mountain; thence along the eastern boundary-lines of the West Taupo Licensing District, hereinbefore more particularly defined, to Uira Gorge, the place of commencement.

## MANUKAU COUNTY.

*Pukorokoro.*—Being all that area in the County of Manukau not included in Proclamation defining licensing districts in *New Zealand Gazette* No. 5, 20th January, 1882. Bounded by a line commencing at the easternmost corner of the Mataitai Block No. 3, in the Parish of Taupo, and proceeding southerly along the eastern boundary-lines of said Mataitai Block No. 3 and the Mataitai Blocks Nos. 4 and 6, said Parish of Taupo, to the junction of the eastern boundary-line of the last-named block with the line known as the Wairoa Confiscation boundary-line; thence north-westerly along said confiscation boundary-line to the road which forms the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 25 and part of the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 24, Parish of Otatau, to the Waimoko River; thence along the said Waimoko River to the road which forms the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 30, Parish of Otatau aforesaid; thence along said road to the Wairoa River; thence southerly along the centre of the Wairoa River aforesaid and the centre of the Mangawheau River to the southern boundary-lines of the Parish of Hunua; thence easterly along the said southern boundary-lines of said Parish of Hunua to the Wairoa River aforesaid; thence to and along the north-western boundary-line of Allotment No. 4, Parish of Otatau aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of said Allotment No. 4; thence southerly along the eastern boundary-lines of said Allotment No. 4 to and across a road-line, along the eastern boundary-lines of Allotments Nos. 8 and 38 to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence along a right line to the north-eastern corner of Allotment No. 10, Parish of Otatau aforesaid; thence along the eastern boundary-lines of said Allotment No. 10 and of Allotments Nos. 37 and 11 to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence along a right line in a south-easterly direction to the Maungatawhiri River; thence along the centre of the said Maungatawhiri River to the north-eastern boundary-line of Allotment No. 34, Parish of Otatau aforesaid; thence along a right line to the confiscation boundary-line at a point where it joins the south side of a road which forms the southern boundary of Allotment No. 36, Parish of Otatau aforesaid; thence along said confiscation boundary-line to the northern boundary-line of Allotment No. 39, Parish of Koheroa; thence westerly along said northern boundary-line to the north-western corner of Allotment No. 39 aforesaid, and continuing along the western boundary-line of Allotment No. 39 aforesaid to the centre of the Pukorokoro Road; thence along the centre of the said Pukorokoro Road to the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 37, Parish of Koheroa aforesaid; thence along the south-eastern and part of the south-western boundary-lines of said Allotment No. 37 to the centre of the Pukorokoro Road aforesaid, and continuing thence along the centre of the said road to a point on the same being the termination of a right line produced at right angles to the northern boundary of Allotment No. 59, Parish of Koheroa aforesaid; thence along the said line to the northern boundary-line of said Allotment No. 59, Parish of Koheroa aforesaid; thence along part of the northern boundary-line of Allotment No. 59 aforesaid to its north-eastern corner; thence along a right line to the north-western corner of Allotment No. 91, Parish of Koheroa aforesaid; thence along the north-eastern boundary-line of said Allotment No. 91 and along the said north-eastern boundary-line produced to the Maramarua River; thence easterly along the centre of that river to its intersection by the high road and telegraph line from Pukorokoro to Mercer; thence along said high road and telegraph line to Pukorokoro; thence by the Firth of Thames and the

Tamaki Strait to the place of commencement: including the Islands of Great Barrier, Little Barrier, Kawau, Waiheke, Ponui, Rangitoto, the D'Haussez Group, Mayor, and Motiti, and all adjacent islands.

## SOUNDS COUNTY.

*Sounds.*—Being all that area known as Sounds County. Bounded towards the South-west by a right line bearing north 45° west from the southernmost point of White's Bay to the summit of the watershed between Cloudy Bay and Waitohi Valley; thence towards the West by that watershed to the north-east boundary of the Waikawa Native Reserve, and by that boundary to the sea; thence by the sea to the northern boundary of a block of land granted to one Joseph Toms at a point 1870 links from a stream called Te Awa; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 21, Pelorus Sound; thence by the sea-coast to Watanihi Point; thence by the watershed from Watanihi Point to Mount Elliott; thence towards the West by the summit of the Examiner Ridge to Elaine Bay, Tennyson Inlet; thence by a line due west to the waters of Croixelles Harbour; thence towards the North and East by the sea to White's Bay: including D'Urville Island, Kapiti, Mana, and all adjacent islands.

## FIORD COUNTY.

*Fiord.*—Being all that area known as the Fiord County. Bounded by a right line commencing at the nearest arm of George Sound and proceeding to Barrier Peaks; thence by lines from peak to peak to and over Mount Lyell, the Murchison Mountains, the Kepler Mountains, the Hunter Mountains, and the Billow Mountains to the Hump; thence by the summit of the watershed from the Hump to Sandhill Point; thence by the ocean to George Sound, the place of commencement: including the Auckland Islands and adjacent islands.

## STEWART ISLAND COUNTY.

*Stewart Island.*—Being all that area known as Stewart Island County, which includes the Islands of Stewart and Ruapuke and other adjacent islands.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section seventeen of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any district in New Zealand to be a borough under the said Act, from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pur-

suance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted, as from the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, a borough under the said Act, and that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Tauranga, and that the boundaries of such borough shall be those described in the Schedule hereto.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Auckland, being the Town of Tauranga, and containing by admeasurement 1,000 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North and East by high-water mark of the Tauranga Harbour; towards the South-west by a line along the south-west side of Hospital Street and that line produced to the Kopurererua River; and towards the West by that river and high-water mark of the Waikareao Estuary to the Tauranga Harbour: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Auckland.

THREE scholarships, to be held at the Native College, Te Aute, Hawke's Bay, are offered by the Trustees of the fund instituted in memory of the late Sir Donald McLean for promoting the higher education of Maori youths.

Two of these scholarships are open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 31st March, 1882, shall not exceed fifteen years, and who shall have attended a Native college or school for the preceding twelve months. The remaining scholarship is open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 31st March, 1882, shall not exceed thirteen years, and who shall have attended a Native village school for the preceding twelve months.

The scholarships are of the annual value of £35, and are tenable for a year and a half from the 1st July, 1882.

The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 27th and 28th April, 1882. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 20th March.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice will shortly be distributed among the teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions. Copies may also be obtained from the Secretaries to Education Boards or from the Secretary to the Education Department.
