Town District of Mataura, County of Southland, constituted.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall hereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have

concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Mataura Town District," and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners of the said district shall consist of five in number.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, bounded towards the South and West by the Waimumu Stream from its outflow into the Mataura River to the north-west angle of Section No. 34, Block VII., Township of Mataura; thence towards the North by a line due east to the Mataura River; thence towards the South-east by the Mataura River aforesaid to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 74, Block XVII., Town of Mataura Bridge; thence towards the North-east by a right line across the Mataura River aforesaid to and along the said north-eastern boundary-line of said Section No. 74 and that boundary-line produced to the east boundary of the said Town of Mataura Bridge; thence again towards the East and towards the South by the eastern and southern boundary-lines of said Town of Mataura Bridge to the Mataura River; thence by a right line to the place of commencement: as the

Defining the Middle Line of Portion of the Nelson to Greymouth Railway, Bellgrove Section (further Portion of).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Nelson to Greymouth is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point in Section number one hundred and fifty-nine, and terminating at a point in said section, as also from a point in Section number one hundred and sixty to a point in said section, all within the Survey District of Wai-iti, Provincial District of Nelson, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 8775, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Harry Albert Atkinson, Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Nelson, in the Provincial District of Nelson.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point marked 1 mile 18 chains on the portion of the Amberley to Cook Strait Railway, as proclaimed on the 11th June, 1879, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 67, of the 19th June, 1879, and proceeding thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 832 links, passing in, into, through, or over the following lands: Section No. 159, and terminating at a point in said section.

Also commencing at a point marked 2 miles 40 chains on the portion of the Amberley to Cook Strait Railway, in Section No. 160, as quoted above, and proceeding thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 7 chains, and terminating at a point on the bank of the Wai-iti; all within the Survey District of Wai-iti, Provincial District of Nelson,

Colony of New Zealand; and including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; in the manner delineated upon the plan marked P.W.D. 8775, signed by the Honorable Harry Albert Atkinson, Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Nelson, in the Provincial District of Nelson, Colony of New Zealand.

Land taken for a Portion of the Nelson to Greymouth Railway, Bellgrove Section (further Portion of).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of a portion of the line of railway from Nelson to Greymouth, being one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1879," was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the fourteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and on the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Nelson, in the Provincial District of Nelson, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said portion of the said line of railway and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas "The Public Works Act, 1879," enacts that such of the railways mentioned therein as are unfinished may be completed under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and "The Public Works Act, 1879:" And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for the said portion of the said line of railway:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the sixth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of every power and authority in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the said portion of the said line of railway.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 3 roods 20 perches, being portion of Section No. 159, commencing at a point on the south-

eastern side of road to Tophouse about 11 chains distant from its intersection with the north-western boundary of said section. Bounded as follows: Easterly and North-easterly by lines, 145 and 620 links respectively; South-easterly by a line, 111 links; South-westerly and Southerly by lines, 620 and 145 links respectively; North-westerly by road to Tophouse, 300 links.

All that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 1 rood 5 perches, being portion of Section No. 160, commencing at a point on the north-eastern boundary of parcel of land described in a Proclamation taking land, dated the 17th February, 1880, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 18, of the 26th February, 1880, with the Wai-iti River. Bounded as follows: South-westerly by a line, 569 links; North-easterly by a line, 577 links; South-westerly by the Wai-iti River to commencing point, 100 links.

All that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 1 acre and 38 perches, being portion of Section No. 160, commencing at a point at the intersection of the north-westernmost side of Pretty Bridge Creek with the south-westernmost side of a road. Bounded as follows: North-easterly by said road; South-easterly by part of Sections Nos. 160 and 169; South-westerly by a line, 150 links; North-westerly by Section No. 160 to commencing point, said parcel of land being the old bed of Pretty Bridge Creek: the several parcels of land being situate in the Survey District of Wai-iti, Provincial District of Nelson, and are more particularly delineated upon the plans marked P.W.D. 8749, deposited in the office of the Minister for Public Works, at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation made under "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," bearing date the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the fifth day of April of that year, certain regulations were made for the Cardrona Depasturing District, including, in regulation number one of the said regulations, the appointment of certain persons as a Board of Wardens for the said depasturing district:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said regulations:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and

1. John Kerin, John Tripp, Richard Walsh, John O'Callaghan, and Robert Millar, all of Cardrona, or such other persons as the Governor may from time to time appoint, shall be and are hereby appointed the Board of Wardens for the above-named Cardrona Depasturing District.

WHEREAS by section ten of an Act of the Parliament of New South Wales passed in the thirty-fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "The Imported Stock Act, 1871," and numbered six, the Governor in Council is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government *Gazette*, to restrict or absolutely prohibit, for any specified time, the importation or introduction of any horned cattle or sheep, fodder, or fittings from any other colony or country in which there is reason to believe that any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas by Proclamation dated the fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, it was declared that cattle and sheep might be imported or introduced from Great Britain, Ireland, Canada, and the United States of America, under certain conditions and regulations therein set forth: And whereas foot-and-mouth disease is known to be prevalent in Great Britain:

Now, therefore, I, Lord Augustus William Frederick Spencer Loftus, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, except as regards horned cattle or sheep which shall have been shipped from London previous to the notification in the *London Gazette* of the issue of this Proclamation, hereby revoke all former Proclamations under the above-named Act, and absolutely prohibit for a period of two years from this date the importation of all horned cattle or sheep, fodder, or fittings from any colony or country other than the Colonies of Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, Western Australia, Tasmania, and New Zealand.

BY-LAW of the COUNCIL of the CITY of WELLINGTON, made under "The Wellington Waterworks Act, 1871."

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them in this behalf, the Council of the City of Wellington ordain as follows:—

That, in all cases where any business requiring a supply of water for the purposes of the said business is carried on in premises which are also used for the purposes of a dwelling-house, the whole of the water supplied to such premises shall only be supplied through a meter. That, in consideration of such water-supply, the party liable for the same shall pay for the whole of such supply at such price per gallon as shall be fixed by the Council from time to time for water supplied by meter, and in addition a further rate per centum of £2 10s. on the assessed annual value of the whole of the said premises.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

Colonial Secretary's Office,

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first 50 tons of starch, manufactured

in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

Conditions.

Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 30th June, 1882.

The claim must be made before the 31st December, 1882.

The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

Further information and particulars may be obtained by application at the Colonial Secretary's Office.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.

2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.

3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1883.

4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.

5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of *bonâ fide* account sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as pig-iron.

Te Makarini Scholarships.

The data indicates a steady increase in temperature and humidity over time, with a corresponding increase in wind speed and a decrease in pressure. The temperature reached a maximum of 32.5°C at 100 minutes, while the humidity reached 100% at 60 minutes. The wind speed increased from 1.2 m/s at 0 minutes to 10.5 m/s at 100 minutes. The pressure decreased from 1013.2 hPa at 0 minutes to 1011.2 hPa at 100 minutes.
