WHEREAS by the fifty-fourth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown lands situate within a gold field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor, or for alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments under any law for the time being in force in the land district in which such mining district is situate:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto are Crown lands subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said Act, and it is deemed expedient to set the same apart for the purpose of granting

agricultural leases thereon and therefor:

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say, -

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Saturday in each month, at six o'clock p.m., at the Schoolhouse, Wangaloa, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a Any meeting may be adjourned from time quorum.

- 4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Saturday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his
- 5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a

meeting.

Regulations for Special Licensing Districts.

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of March, 1882.

Present:

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

N exercise and pursuance of the powers granted to 1 the Governor in Council by the sixteenth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," and of all other powers and authorities enabling the Governor in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the administra-tion of the said Act within the Special Districts of Waingaroa, Kawhia, East Taupo, West Taupo, Pukorokoro, Sounds, Fiord, and Stewart Island.

REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses may be issued for the sale of alcoholic liquors within the Special Licensing Districts of Waingaroa, Kawhia, East Taupo, West Taupo, Pukorokoro, Sounds, Fiord, and Stewart Island, upon payment of a fee not exceeding forty pounds nor less than ten pounds.

2. All such licenses shall be made to expire on the thirty-first day of December next following the date

of granting the same.

3. The house and premises in respect of which any such license may be granted shall not be opened before six o'clock in the morning, and shall be closed at ten o'clock at night; provided that, upon payment at the time of issue of license of an extra fee of five pounds, permission may be given to keep open the licensed premises till twelve o'clock p.m.; but the restrictions in this regulation contained shall not apply to the supply of refreshments to bond fide travellers.

4. No such licensed house or premises shall be opened for the sale of alcoholic liquors on Sundays, except in the case of bond fide travellers as aforesaid.

5. The accommodation to be provided in respect of any house or premises for which a license shall be applied for hereunder shall be such as shall be approved of by the person or persons empowered to grant such license.

6. Applications for licenses must be in writing, addressed to the person or persons empowered to grant the same, and must specify the locality for which the license is asked, and the accommodation provided or intended to be provided for the public, and the hours during which it is proposed such house and premises

shall be open.

7. Every license granted hereunder shall be subject to be forfeited if in the opinion of the person empowered to grant licenses hereunder it shall be necessary or desirable to do so; and such forfeiture shall be deemed to be complete when notice thereof under his hand shall have been delivered to the licensee or affixed to the licensed premises.

8. All provisions of "The Licensing Act, 1881,"

which are in contradiction of any of the foregoing

regulations are hereby excluded from operation within any special district wherein such aforesaid regulations are for the time being in force.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first 50 tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not

less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

Te Makarini Scholarships.

THREE scholarships, to be held at the Native College, Te Aute, Hawke's Bay, are offered by the Trustees of the fund instituted in memory of the late Sir Donald McLean for promoting the higher

education of Maori youths.

Two of these scholarships are open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 31st March, 1882, shall not exceed fifteen years, and who shall have attended a Native college or school for the preceding twelve months. The remaining scholarship is open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 31st March, 1882, shall not exceed thirteen years, and who shall have attended a Native village school for the preceding twelve months.

The scholarships are of the annual value of £35, and are tenable for a year and a half from the 1st

July, 1882.

The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 27th and 28th April, 1882. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send Candidates notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 20th March.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice will shortly be distributed among the teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions. Copies may also be obtained from the Secretaries to Education Boards or from the Secretary to the Education Department.
