 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Gore Town District," and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five in number.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, known as the Town of West Gore. Bounded by a line commencing at the north-western angle of Section No. 57, Block XVI., said Town of West Gore, and proceeding due east through Trig. Station C, Hokonui Survey District, to the west bank of the Mataura River; thence southerly along said west bank of the Mataura River to its intersection by a right line running due east through Trig. Station B, Hokonui Survey District; thence westerly along last-mentioned line through said Trig. Station B to its intersection by a line running due south from the north-western angle of Section No. 57, Block XVI., Town of West Gore aforesaid; thence due north along the last-mentioned line to the place of commencement: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Invercargill.

Town District of Alexandra, Waikato, constituted.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act: And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Alexandra Town District;" and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners of the said district shall consist of five in number.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland comprising the Townships of Alexandra East and

Setting apart Land in Westland for Agricultural Leases.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-fourth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown lands situate within a gold field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor, or for alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments under any law for the time being in force in the land district in which such mining district is situate:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto are Crown lands subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said Act, and it is deemed expedient to set the same apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby select and set apart, for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto; and do fix the

eleventh day of April next ensuing, at the Warden's office at Ross, as the day and place on which the said land shall be open for application in allotments, as surveyed and marked on the survey map in the office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, Hokitika.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Thursday, the thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at Dunedin, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection maps in that office.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described

shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

Industrial School at Kohimarama.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Neglected and Criminal Children Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any province to establish industrial schools for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," all the powers, duties, and functions vested in or to be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any province are now vested in and are to be exercised by the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim all that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement twenty-nine acres two roods twenty-three perches, more or less, situate at Kohimarama, in the Parish of Waitemata, in the Provincial District of Auckland, and being part of Lot thirty-two, in the said Parish of Waitemata, with all the buildings thereon erected, which land and buildings have been lately occupied as a naval training school, to be an industrial school within the meaning of the said "Neglected and Criminal Children Act, 1867."

Powers delegated to the Wangaloa Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1881."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of March, 1882.

Present:

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, made and issued under the authority of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," "The Public Domains Act, 1865," and "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," certain powers were, in respect of certain lands referred to in a further Order in Council of the same date, made and issued under "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," aforesaid, delegated to Edward Boyd, Colin McLaughlin, John Welsh, James Brown, James Darling, Thomas Johnstone, and Robert Beattie:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke the Order in Council delegating the Governor's powers to the above-named persons; and do hereby further delegate, in respect of the lands referred to in the aforesaid Orders in Council, all the powers conferred by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Wangaloa Domain Board:—

EDWARD BOYD,
JAMES BROWN,
JAMES DARLING,
THOMAS JOHNSTONE,
ALEXANDER MITCHELL,
JOHN HAGGART, and
ROBERT DARLING

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Saturday in each month, at six o'clock p.m., at the Schoolhouse, Wangaloa, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Saturday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Regulations for Special Licensing Districts.

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of March, 1882.

Present:

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers granted to the Governor in Council by the sixteenth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," and of all other powers and authorities enabling the Governor in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations for the administration of the said Act within the Special Districts of Waingaroa, Kawhia, East Taupo, West Taupo, Pukorokoro, Sounds, Fiord, and Stewart Island.

REGULATIONS.

1. Licenses may be issued for the sale of alcoholic liquors within the Special Licensing Districts of Waingaroa, Kawhia, East Taupo, West Taupo, Pukorokoro, Sounds, Fiord, and Stewart Island, upon payment of a fee not exceeding forty pounds nor less than ten pounds.

2. All such licenses shall be made to expire on the thirty-first day of December next following the date of granting the same.

3. The house and premises in respect of which any such license may be granted shall not be opened before six o'clock in the morning, and shall be closed at ten o'clock at night; provided that, upon payment at the time of issue of license of an extra fee of five pounds, permission may be given to keep open the licensed premises till twelve o'clock p.m.; but the restrictions in this regulation contained shall not apply to the supply of refreshments to *bonâ fide* travellers.

4. No such licensed house or premises shall be opened for the sale of alcoholic liquors on Sundays, except in the case of *bonâ fide* travellers as aforesaid.

5. The accommodation to be provided in respect of any house or premises for which a license shall be applied for hereunder shall be such as shall be approved of by the person or persons empowered to grant such license.

6. Applications for licenses must be in writing, addressed to the person or persons empowered to grant the same, and must specify the locality for which the license is asked, and the accommodation provided or intended to be provided for the public, and the hours during which it is proposed such house and premises shall be open.

7. Every license granted hereunder shall be subject to be forfeited if in the opinion of the person empowered to grant licenses hereunder it shall be necessary or desirable to do so; and such forfeiture shall be deemed to be complete when notice thereof under his hand shall have been delivered to the licensee or affixed to the licensed premises.

8. All provisions of "The Licensing Act, 1881," which are in contradiction of any of the foregoing

regulations are hereby excluded from operation within any special district wherein such aforesaid regulations are for the time being in force.

Land temporarily reserved in the Land Districts of Otago and Westland.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which, in his opinion, are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the land in the Land Districts of Otago and Westland, described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purposes in the said Schedule specified.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by admeasurement 10 acres, more or less, situate in the Otama District, and being Section No. 13, Block II., Otama District. No. 3 is a design printed on a tea-wrapper, and consists of a large black eagle with outspread wings, his talons grasping a banner upon which is inscribed the words "The Eagle Blend;" on each side are representations of the pitcher-plant with fan-palms and plantain; the background is occupied by representations of Indian architecture.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first 50 tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not

less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 30th June, 1882.

The claim must be made before the 31st December, 1882.

The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

NAVIGATION OF THE WEST CHANNEL.—KNOLL NEAR THE SWAN LIGHTSHIP.

PILOTS, masters of vessels, and others are informed that a shoal has again formed in the vicinity of the lightship at the Swan Spit. It bears N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. (magnetic) from the lightship, from which it is distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables' length. This knoll is a cable's length to the westward of that reported in a Notice to Mariners dated the 18th February, 1874.

The shallowest water now found on this knoll is 14 feet 4 inches at low-water springs. Te Makarini Scholarships.

THREE scholarships, to be held at the Native College, Te Aute, Hawke's Bay, are offered by the Trustees of the fund instituted in memory of the late Sir Donald McLean for promoting the higher education of Maori youths.

Two of these scholarships are open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 31st March, 1882, shall not exceed fifteen years, and who shall have attended a Native college or school for the preceding twelve months. The remaining scholarship is open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 31st March, 1882, shall not exceed thirteen years, and who shall have attended a Native village school for the preceding twelve months.

The scholarships are of the annual value of £35, and are tenable for a year and a half from the 1st July, 1882.

The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 27th and 28th April, 1882.
