A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the third section of "The Dog Registration Act, 1880," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area comprised within the district described in the Schedule hereto shall be excluded from the operation of the said Act.

THE County of Stewart Island as described in "The Counties Act, 1876."

Ordinary Licensing Districts.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor

shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same: And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the Districts of Upper Waimakariri and Malvern by abolishing the District of Upper Waimakariri, and altering and redefining the boundaries of the District of Malvern, and defining the District of Coleridge:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, proclaim and declare that from and after the date of the gazetting hereof the District of Upper Waimakariri constituted under the said Act shall be and it is hereby abolished, and do further proclaim and declare that from and after the date of the gazetting hereof the boundaries of the Malvern District constituted shall be altered and redefined by being altered to those mentioned and set forth in the Schedule hereto under that name, and that the part of the colony mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto under the name of Coleridge shall be a licensing district under the said Act by the name of Coleridge.

SCHEDULE.

Malvern.—Bounded towards the North-east by the Ashley County, from the saddle between the Tere-makau and the Hurunui Rivers to Ashley Head; thence towards the South-east, and again towards the North-east by the said Ashley County to the eastern boundary of Run No. 41, Class 3; thence again towards the South-east by said eastern boundary of Run No. 41 to the Wakaepa Branch of the River Selwyn; thence towards the South-west by the said Wakaepa Branch to its junction with a creek running from the Thirteen-Mile Bush; thence by a right line

Coleridge.—Bounded towards the North, North-east, South-east, and again towards the North-east by the Malvern Licensing District, hereinbefore more particularly defined, from a point on the south-eastern boundary-line of the County of Westland due west from the head waters of the Waimakariri to the southernmost corner of said Malvern Licensing District at the intersection of the Wakaepa Branch of the Selwyn River, by the eastern boundary-line of Run No. 41, Class 3, produced, to the centre of said Wakaepa Branch; thence again towards the North-east by the centre of the Wakaepa Branch aforesaid and the centre of the River Selwyn to where the latter is crossed by the Great Southern Railway; thence towards the South-east by the said Great Southern Railway to its junction with the Great South Road; thence towards the South-west and South by the Ashburton County to the said County of Westland; and thence towards the North-west by the County of Westland aforesaid to the place of commencement.

Town District of Kaitangata, County of Bruce, constituted.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such

locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Kaitangata District," and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven in number.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North by a road-line between Blocks IV. and VIII., North Molyneux Survey District, to and across the Kaitangata Creek; towards the West by said creek and by Kaitangata Lake to Block II., South Tuakitoto Survey District; again towards the North by said Block II.; towards the East by Blocks VIII. and IX., Kaitangata Survey District, to south-east corner of Section 8 of Block II., North Molyneux Survey District; towards the South by Sections 7 and 6 of said block to the Matau branch of the Clutha River; towards the West and again towards the South by said branch and by a road-line south of Section 6 of Block IV., North Molyneux Survey District; and again towards the West by a road-line west of last-mentioned section to the commencing point: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Dunedin.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Taranaki.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the

Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Taranaki did, on the sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Thursday, the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at New Plymouth, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in that office.

In pursuance of section four of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby declare that subsection four of the sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," shall not apply to any of the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

Land taken for Roads in Parish of Kourawhero, County of Rodney.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of roads in the Parish of Kourawhero, County of Rodney:

And whereas the Rodney County Council has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

Fixing Shooting Season for Native and Imported Game, License Fee, &c., Nelson District.

And I do further notify that native game (excepting tuis) may be taken or killed within the said district from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, both inclusive.

Season for Shooting Native Game in County of Grey.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that native game (excepting tuis) may be taken or killed within the County of Grey, excepting the Borough of Grey-mouth, during the period between the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, both inclusive.

Fixing Shooting Season for Imported Game, License Fee, &c., Marlborough District.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that cock-pheasants and Californian quail may be taken or killed within the Marlborough District, consisting of the Counties of Marlborough and Sounds, excepting the area described in the Schedule hereto, from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, both inclusive (subject nevertheless to the restrictions in the said Act mentioned). And I do further notify that licenses to

take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of twenty shillings, and that licenses to sell such game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds; and that the Chief Postmaster at Blenheim is hereby appointed to issue the said licenses.

DISTRICT IN WHICH IMPORTED GAME SHALL NOT
BE TAKEN OR KILLED.

ALL that portion of the Counties of Marlborough and Sounds known as the Wairau Lagoons. IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that cock-pheasants may be taken or killed within the Waitaki District, comprising the County of Waitaki, from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, both inclusive, and that hares may be taken and killed, either by shooting or coursing, from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to the thirty-first July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, both inclusive. And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game within the said district shall be issued on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each, and that licenses to sell such game shall be issued on payment of the sum of five pounds each; and the Chief Postmaster at Oamaru is hereby appointed to issue the said licenses. And I do further notify that native game (excepting tuis) may be taken or killed within the said district from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, both inclusive.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be

then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which, in his opinion, are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the land in the Land Districts of Wellington, Canterbury, Otago, and Southland, described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purposes in the said Schedule specified.

THOMAS DICK.

BY-LAWS.

1. Any person or persons guilty of any of the following offences within the limits of the Riwaka Highway District shall, on conviction of any such offence, be liable to forfeit and pay any penalty not exceeding the sum of 40s. for any one offence.

2. No person shall place, or cause to be placed, any obstruction in or upon any roadway, street, or footpath, by allowing any vehicle or animal to remain in, upon, or across the same, or by placing thereon any goods or material of any kind, or by erecting fences in, upon, or across any roadway, street, or footpath, without having previously obtained the written consent of the Secretary of the Board.

3. No person shall place any obstruction in, upon, or across any ditch, drain, creek, river, or watercourse of any kind, when the same runs alongside or abuts on a public road, by throwing therein any material whatsoever.

4. No person shall set fire to timber, scrub, bush, or other combustible matter which may be liable to damage any road, street, footpath, or reserve.

5. No person shall remove, or cause to be removed, any soil, gravel, sand, stone, or timber from any roadway, street, footpath, nor from the bed or banks of any creek or watercourse, when the same runs alongside or abuts on a public road, without having previously obtained the written consent of the Secretary of the Board.

6. No person shall permit any cattle to stray or depasture, whether under the tendence or control of any person or persons or not, in or upon any road or street, or the sides thereof, within the limits of the Riwaka Highway District.

7. The word "cattle" shall for the purpose of these by-laws be deemed to include horses, mules, asses, sheep, goats, and swine of all ages and of either sex, and to apply to any one of such animals as well as to a mob or herd.

8. The words "street," "road," shall mean a public road or street used for general traffic.

9. The word "pathway" shall mean all that portion on each side of every street reserved for foot passengers, including a space of 10 feet towards the roadway, measured from the line of sections.

*Importation of Stock into New Zealand.—Notice
No. 119.*

THE attention of intending importers of stock into New Zealand is called to the provisions of the following sections of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1881," which require that, before any cattle shipped from any foreign port can be landed in New Zealand, the owner must produce at the port of arrival a certificate, duly attested, that such cattle were free from any infectious or contagious disease when shipped:—

34. No cattle shipped to New Zealand from any foreign district shall be landed in New Zealand unless the owner of such cattle, or his agent, shall produce to the Cattle Inspector at the port or place in New Zealand where the same shall arrive a certificate in writing, signed by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, to the effect that such cattle were inspected and examined by him immediately before shipment, and that they were at the time of such examination and shipment free from any contagious or infectious disease whatever which would be likely to be propagated amongst men or animals, or any other disease.

35. Every such certificate of inspection or examination shall be attested before a Justice of the Peace or a notary public. Every such certificate so attested shall, for all purposes, be receivable in the colony as sufficient evidence of compliance with the provisions of this Act.

Cattle Inspectors at the various ports have been instructed to strictly enforce the provisions of the Act above referred to.

The word "cattle," as interpreted by the Act, includes horses, sheep, goats, and swine.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first 50 tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

Conditions.

Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 30th June, 1882.

The claim must be made before the 31st December, 1882.

The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

Further information and particulars may be obtained by application at the Colonial Secretary's Office.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.

2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.

3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1883.

4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.

5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of *bona fide* account sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as pig-iron.

APPROACHES TO NELSON HARBOUR.

Marine Department,
Wellington, 30th March, 1882.

FROM recent survey of entrance to Nelson Harbour, it was found that the bar in the direction of the old course had much shallowed: Notice is therefore given that, on and after the 1st May next, the position of the fairway and bar buoys will be altered.

The fairway buoy will be shifted 3 cables nearer to the lighthouse, and will be distant from it $5\frac{3}{4}$ cables, with the following bearings: Lighthouse, E. by N. (as before); Magazine, S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; Arrow Rock, S.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

The bar buoy will be shifted a bare cable due east, and will be off the east end of a bank in 7 feet water at low-water springs, with the following bearings: Lighthouse, N.E.; Magazine, E. by N. $\frac{3}{4}$ N.; Arrow Rock, S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Vessels bound in may pass fairway buoy on either hand, but the bar buoy should be left on the starboard side, as the channel lies between these buoys and the Boulder Bank, with its narrowest part $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables opposite the bar buoy, and with not less than 7 feet at low-water springs, 17 feet at high-water neaps, and 20 feet at high-water springs. A chart will shortly be issued showing the various changes; bearings magnetic.
