#### ARTHUR GORDON, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fifty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any Crown lands within any mining district not held under license or lease at the date of such Proclamation, or over which the license or lease has been cancelled, to be open for sale or selection, in sections of such size and form, and on such date, as he may determine; and any land so proclaimed may hereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be, as Crown lands of the same class not within a mining district, and the Governor may from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the land specified in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale by public auction on such day as may be fixed by the Land Board of the Land District of Westland.

Land withdrawn from the Deferred-payment System in Otago.

#### ARTHUR GORDON, Governor. (L.s.) A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like matter set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the land specified in the Schedule hereto was, with other lands, on the tenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventyfour, proclaimed as set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on Honorable Arthur Hamilton Gordon, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and recommending that the land described in the

Schedule hereto annexed should be withdrawn from the deferred-payment system:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the

aforesaid recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the above-named Acts, do hereby revoke the Proclamation above referred to, so far as it relates to the sections therein mentioned and included in the Schedule hereto, and do proclaim and declare that the said sections are hereby withdrawn from the operation of the deferred-payment system.

Vesting the Management of the Raglan Wharf in the Raglan Town Board.

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of April, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf the property of Her Majesty in any local governing body or person upon such towns and governing body or person upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest the wharf at Raglan in the Raglan Town Board, on the terms

and conditions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said fourteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the Raglan Wharf in the Raglan Town Board, subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the seventeenth section of the said Act, prescribe that the dues and rates to be taken by the Raglan Town Board for the use of the said wharf shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto: Provided always that the rights hereby granted shall only be for the period of fourteen years, and this Order in Council may at any time be altered, modified, or revoked.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the abovementioned wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon.
2. That Her Majesty or the Governor, and all

officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of

the wharf without payment.
3. That the said Town Board shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been

approved of by the Marine Department.

4. That any person authorized by the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any officer acting with his approval, may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repairs thereof; and that, upon his leaving at the last known address of the said Board a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring it, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the said Board shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That the said Board will not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Marine

Department.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the said Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.

7. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified,

or revoked.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor, on giving to the said Board six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor or the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at the last known address of the said Board, its successors, administrators, or assigns. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of April, 1882.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), VV it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last-recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation

of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

WHEREAS the Union Steam Saw Moulding Sash and Door Company (Limited), (hereinafter referred to as "the said Company"), was, by Order in Council dated the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy eight, authorized to construct wharves on a portion of the foreshore of the Tairua River described in the Schedule thereto: And whereas the said Company is desirous of constructing an addition to the said wharves, and, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited at the office of the Marine Department a plan in duplicate showing the details of

in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

#### SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

#### SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

MIDDLE CHANNEL, MORETON BAY.

Br attending to the following directions, a depth of not less than 17 feet at low-water springs can now be carried through the Middle Channel.

From seaward cross the East Banks with the leading lights in line, and when about half-way through the channel haul up gradually and open them to the northward, rounding the spit of the Thoms and Hill, Amberley

Venus Bank with them open a distance of about three-quarters of the difference between their heights.

SOUTH PASSAGE, MORETON BAY.

The North Break having extended further to the south-east, vessels, when the state of the bar will admit of their hauling up with the sea abeam, can carry through this entrance a depth of 141 feet at low water, as follows:-

After crossing the outer edge of the bar with the leading beacons open to the northward from three to four times their own width, haul up S. ½ W. and steer for the hill shown on the coast chart as 490 feet high. This, in line with the lowest part of ridge at the back of the beach, will lead clear of the spit off the North Break. When the spit is rounded, the beacons being open to the southward some ten times their own width, a course can be steered between the North and South Breaks.

A knoll, having only  $7\frac{1}{2}$  feet upon it at low water, has now formed on the outer edge of the bar, with

the leading beacons in line.

With the beacons open to the southward from five to eight times their own width, and with Amity Point touching, and just open of the south-east end of Mount Petrie, a depth of from 111 to 12 feet will be found at low water.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 432, against 387 in February, being an increase of 45. The deaths amounted to 158 in March, an increase of 24 on the number for February.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 83; females, 75. 77 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 48.73 per cent. of the whole number; 57 of these were of children under one year of age.

The births were 246 in March, against 210 in February, an increase of 36.

The deaths in March were 84, against 87 in February, a decrease of 3.

There were 7 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: a male of 65 died at Auckland; 2 females of 69 and 71 at Wellington; 2 males of 65 and 77 at Christchurch; and a male of 78 and a female of 90 at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases were 26 in March, or 30.95 per cent. of the total deaths, against 28, or 32.19 per cent., in February. There were 6 deaths from scarlet fever in each month, of which 5 occurred each month in Auckland. Typhoid fever caused 1 death in Wellington, and 1 in Dunedin.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 11 deaths in March, against 15 in February; the deaths from phthisis having been 6 in March, against 9 in February.

Local Diseases.—There was a slight increase in the number of deaths from these diseases in March (27) as compared with the previous month (24). Diseases of the heart caused 5 deaths in March, against 2 in February.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health,
