

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue of the power vested in me by the third section of "The Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Act shall come into force, in respect of all the elective offices of the Templeton Road Board, within the district known as the Templeton Road District.

Approving Rule of Native Land Court.

A. GORDON, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL. At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of April, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Native Land • Court Act, 1880," that it shall be lawful for the Judges, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make rules to regulate the sittings, practice, forms, and procedure of the Native Land Court, and for the government of all persons acting under the said Act, and also for fixing the fees to be paid, the time and mode of payment, and for enforcing the payment thereof, and such rules from time to time by other rules to alter and revoke:

Now, therefore, we, the Judges of the said Court, do hereby, in pursuance of the said power, make the rule following, that is to say,—

RULE.

Solicitors and their Costs.

Assent shall not be given to the appearance of any counsel or solicitor in Court in any case until he has filed therein a statutory declaration containing a statement of the terms of his engagement or contract with his employers, and the amount of money already received or promised, and concluding with a declaration that he does not expect to receive, and will not receive, on account of the case on which his employment arises, any land, money, fee, or reward, other than those set forth.

Regulations under "The Chinese Immigrants Act, 1881."

ABTHUE GORDON, GOVERNOR. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of April, 1882. Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOE IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Chinese Immigrants Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as he shall deem necessary for giving effect to the said Act :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby make the following regulations for giving effect to the said Act, that is to say,—

1. The form of certificate to be given to each Chinese person under the seventh section of the said Act, on whose behalf the prescribed sum of ten pounds has been paid under the fifth section thereof, shall be as follows :---

2. The form of certificate of exemption to be given to each Chinese person, under the thirteenth section of the said Act, shall be as follows, or to the like effect :---

Palmerston North Public Cemetery brought under "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877."

ARTHUR GORDON, GOVERNOR. ORDER IN COUNCIL. At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of April, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOE IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-nine of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that, where the Trustees of any public cemetery, or the Trustees, Managers, or other persons having the care and control of any other cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial heretofore established, shall be desirous of adopting the provisions of this Act, or any of them, in the place of any Act or Ordinance, or any provisions of such Act or Ordinance, heretofore regulating the management of any such last-mentioned cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial, the said Trustees, Managers, or other persons may apply to the Governor in Council in that behalf, who may thereupon cause inquiry to be made in such manner as he shall think fit as to the desirability of granting such petition, and the Governor may, by Order in Council, direct that the provisions of this Act, or any of them, shall come into force in respect of any such cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial, or he may reject any such application :

And whereas the Trustees of the Palmerston North Public Cemetery have applied to the Governor to bring the said cemetery under the provisions of the said Act, and due inquiry has been made in pursuance of the said thirty-ninth section as to the desirability of granting such petition:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and direct that all provisions of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," shall come into force in respect of the public cemetery at Palmerston North, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and known as the Palmerston North Cemetery, as the same is described in the Schedule hereto; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me, I do, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, order and direct that this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof.

Hen-Pheasants not to be shot within the County of Tauranga.

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

WHEREAS by a warrant made under "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," dated the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, it was notified that pheasants and Calfornian and Australian quail might be taken or killed within the Auckland District: And whereas it is expedient that cock-pheasants and Californian and Australian quail, but not hen-pheasants, should be taken or killed within the County of Tauranga:

within the County of Tauranga: Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said "Animals Protection Act, 1880," do hereby notify that cockpheasants only and Californian and Australian quail may be taken or killed in the said County of Tauranga under the conditions set forth in the aboverecited warrant.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

Colonial Secretary's Office,

Wellington, 1st February, 1882. NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be naid on articles product in the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under :-

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first 50 tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' $(\pounds 1,000)$ worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (\pounds 50) nor more than one hundred pounds (\pounds 100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zea-land, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 30th June, 1882.

2. The claim must be made before the 31st December, 1882.

3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.
