Declaring "Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," in force within the Templeton Road District, County of Selwyn.

A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue of the power vested in me by the third section of "The Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Act shall come into force, in respect of all the elective offices of the Templeton Road Board, within the district known as the Templeton Road District.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Honorable Arthur Hamilton Gordon, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Native Land Court Act, 1880," that it shall be lawful for

the Judges, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make rules to regulate the sittings, practice, forms, and procedure of the Native Land Court, and for the government of all persons acting under the said Act, and also for fixing the fees to be paid, the time and mode of payment, and for enforcing the payment thereof, and such rules from time to time by other rules to alter and revoke:

Now, therefore, we, the Judges of the said Court, do hereby, in pursuance of the said power, make the rule following, that is to say,—

RULE.

Solicitors and their Costs.

Assent shall not be given to the appearance of any counsel or solicitor in Court in any case until he has filed therein a statutory declaration containing a statement of the terms of his engagement or contract with his employers, and the amount of money already received or promised, and concluding with a declaration that he does not expect to receive, and will not receive, on account of the case on which his employment arises, any land, money, fee, or reward, other than those set forth.

Regulations under "The Chinese Immigrants Act, 1881."

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this
twenty-first day of April, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Chinese Immigrants Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as he shall deem necessary for giving effect to the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby make the following regulations for giving effect to the said Act, that is to say,—

1. The form of certificate to be given to each Chinese person under the seventh section of the said Act, on whose behalf the prescribed sum of ten pounds has been paid under the fifth section thereof, shall be as follows:—

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-nine of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that, where the Trustees of any public cemetery, or the Trustees, Managers, or other persons having the care and control of any other cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial heretofore established, shall be desirous of adopting the provisions of this Act, or any of them, in the place of any Act or Ordinance, or any provisions of such Act or Ordinance, heretofore regulating the management of any such last-mentioned cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial, the said Trustees, Managers, or other persons may apply to the Governor in Council in that behalf, who may thereupon cause inquiry to be made in such manner as he shall think fit as to the desirability of granting such petition, and the Governor may, by Order in Council, direct that the provisions of this Act, or any of them, shall come into force in respect of any such cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial, or he may reject any such application:

And whereas the Trustees of the Palmerston North Public Cemetery have applied to the Governor to bring the said cemetery under the provisions of the said Act, and due inquiry has been made in pursuance of the said thirty-ninth section as to the desirability of granting such petition:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and direct that all provisions of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," shall come into force in respect of the public cemetery at Palmerston North, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and known as the Palmerston North Cemetery, as the same is described in the Schedule hereto; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me, I do, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, order and direct that this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof.

Hen-Pheasants not to be shot within the County of Tauranga.

WHEREAS by a warrant made under "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," dated the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, it was notified that pheasants and Californian and Australian quail might be taken or killed within the Auckland District: And whereas it is expedient that cock-pheasants and Californian and Australian quail, but not hen-pheasants, should be taken or killed within the County of Tauranga:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said "Animals Protection Act, 1880," do hereby notify that cock-pheasants only and Californian and Australian quail may be taken or killed in the said County of Tauranga under the conditions set forth in the above-recited warrant.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

Colonial Secretary's Office,
Wellington, 1st February, 1882.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first 50 tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 30th June, 1882.
2. The claim must be made before the 31st December, 1882.
3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.
4. Further information and particulars may be obtained by application at the Colonial Secretary's Office.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.
2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.
3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1883.
4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.
5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of *bond fide* account sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as pig-iron.

OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk), which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

1. Notice of intention to claim either of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1882.
2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1883.

NOTES FOR JANUARY, 1882.

Auckland.—Cool weather, with heavy falls of rain, the maximum on 4th, 2.30 in.; prevailing S.W. wind, and strong on 8th to 14th; thunder on 4th and 8th.

Wellington.—First few days fine; showery on 3rd, with thunder; then fine but stormy from N.W. to 9th, occasional rain; fine from S.E. from 10th to 16th; then stormy to 22nd, with rain; 1.25 in. recorded on 20th, maximum for month; generally fine remainder of month, though frequently strong N.W. wind.

Lincoln.—Showery, except latter part; 2.20 in. recorded on 21st, maximum for month; prevailing S.W. and N.W. winds, and strong on 27th and 28th from latter quarter; thunder on 18th.

Dunedin.—Showery weather prevailed, the maximum fall being 1.34 in. on 22nd; prevailing N.E. and S.W. winds, and stormy on 23rd from latter.

Waitangi, Chatham Islands.—Fine beginning and end, but wet middle of month; maximum rain on 9th, .64 in.; prevailing S.W. and N.W. winds, and often strong.

GENERAL REMARKS.—A wet month, with strong S.W. and N.W. winds; temperature generally lower than the average. Earthquakes at Wellington, on 9th, at 2.20 a.m., and on 17th, at 10.45 p.m., slight.

NOTES FOR FEBRUARY, 1882.

Auckland.—Generally fine and strong at commencement of month, then light, chiefly from S.W. and W.; maximum rain on 28th, 8.45 in.; fog on 9th and 24th.

Wellington.—Generally fine and pleasant throughout; small rainfall, the maximum recorded on 2nd, .820 in.; prevailing N.W. wind, and stormy from that quarter on 6th, 7th, 14th, and 18th; a few pleasant cool S.E. days; thunder on 21st, and lightning on night of 11th.

Lincoln.—Fine weather with moderate N.E. and S.W. winds, except on 23rd, when strong from S.W.; maximum rainfall on 9th, .19 in.; thunder on 8th and 11th; slight hail on 8th.

Dunedin.—Showery and dull, except towards the end of month; maximum rainfall on 1st, 1.39 in.; moderate winds prevailed from S.W. and W.; fog on 28th.

Waitangi, Chatham Islands.—Frequent showers, but no very heavy falls, the maximum recorded on 20th, .72 in.; strong W. wind on 22nd, but otherwise moderate, and generally from S.W. and N.W.

GENERAL REMARKS.—Fine weather except in the south, when the rain was rather in excess; occasional strong winds from N.W. and S.W., and at times thunder. Earthquakes: At Wellington on 1st, at 2.20 p.m., slight, and at 3.8 p.m., sharp; on 20th, very slight, about midnight; on 21st, at 6.30 a.m., slight. At Lincoln, on 1st, slight, at 3.5 p.m.

NOTES FOR MARCH, 1882.

Auckland.—Heavy rain at commencement, followed by excessive damp heat, then strong E. and N.E. gales and unsettled weather; very cloudy; maximum rain on 2nd, 2.435 in.; dense mist on 1st; prevailing winds N. by N.E. to E.

Wellington.—Up to 7th dull wet weather; wind N.E. and N.W., and close; 1.90 in. rain recorded on 4th, the maximum for month; from 8th to 16th very pleasant from S.E. and N.E.; from 17th to 23rd strong N.W. wind, and at times showers of rain; remainder of month fine and generally cool; prevailing S.E. and N.W. winds.

Lincoln.—Very slight rainfall, and fine pleasant weather, with moderate N.E. and S.W. winds; the maximum rain on 6th, .43 in.

Dunedin.—Showery and close weather; maximum rainfall on 5th, .90 in.; light variable winds; thunder on 4th; fog on 5th and 7th.

GENERAL REMARKS.—Wet close weather prevailed; wind moderate, and chiefly N.E. Earthquake at Lincoln on 22nd, at 9.10 a.m., slight.
