Defining the Middle Line of Railway, Hamilton to Cambridge (about 12 miles).

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Hamilton to Cambridge is one of the railways specified in "The Railways Authorization Act, 1881," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway, and it has been determined to construct and maintain the said railway:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said railway shall be from a point in Lot number three hundred and two, Parish of Kirikiriroa, to a point in Lot number five hundred and eighty-three, Township of Cambridge, all within the Provincial District of Auckland, Colony of New Zealand, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 8987, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Walter Woods Johnston, Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland, in the Provincial District of Auckland.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point on the railway from Waikato to the Thames, in Lot No. 302, Parish of Kirikiriroa, as described in a Proclamation defining middle line, dated the 8th day of April, 1879, and published in

the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 41, of the 17th day of April, 1879, proceeding thence in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of twelve miles or thereabouts, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, &c.: Parish of Kirikiriroa, Lots Nos. 302, 282, 283, 284, 270, and 271; Parish of Tamahere, Lots Nos. 29, 27, 28, 82, 45, 70, 46, 48, 83, 150, and 76; Parish of Hautapu, Lots Nos. 174, 177, 175, 176, 163, 164, 96, 96A, 95, 94, 116, 90, 89, and 27; the Cemetery, Lots Nos. 191, 192, 193, 194, and 155; the Te Koutu Lake Reserve; Township of Cambridge, Town Belt Lots Nos. 18A, 207, 206, 205, 303, 304, 305, 306, 342, 589, and 577; Whitaker Terrace, Lots 410A, 410, 411, 412, 413, 414, 415, 416, 417, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 422A, 423; and terminating in a point in Lot No. 583; including all adjoining and intervening places, Crown lands, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; all within the Provincial District of Auckland, Colony of New Zealand; in the manner delineated upon the plan marked P.W.D. 8987, signed by the Hon. Walter Woods Johnston, Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland, in the Provincial District of Auckland; the total length being twelve miles or thereabouts.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Southland.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Southland did, on the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at Invercargill, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection maps in that office.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

Approving Times of Meeting of Land Boards.

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

WHEREAS by the first subsection of the twenty-fifth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Board shall sit at such Land Office within the district as the Governor shall appoint (which shall be called the Principal Land Office), at certain times to be determined by the Board, and approved of by the Governor, and published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas by a warrant under the hand of the Governor, dated the second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, certain Land Offices were appointed to be the Principal Land Offices for the several districts constituted under the said Act:

And whereas the Land Boards hereunder mentioned have determined the times which are hereunder set against their names respectively as the times at which the said Boards shall sit at the said Principal Land Offices:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in further pursuance of the hereinbefore recited powers, do hereby approve of the times so determined by the said Land Boards and hereunder set against their names respectively; and I declare that this approval shall operate and take effect as and from the respective times at which the respective Land Boards so determined the times or sitting as aforesaid:—

Taranaki: First and third Monday in each month, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon. In the event of any regular day of meeting being a public holiday, the meeting to be held on the following day.

Canterbury: Thursday in each week, at noon.

Delegation of Governor's Powers under "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858."

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, from time to time to appoint and remove a superior officer of Customs, who shall have the control and direction of all other officers and persons employed in or about the collection and management of the revenue of Customs, and who shall be styled "The Commissioner of Customs," and also in like manner from time to time to appoint and remove, or to depute to the Commissioner the power to appoint and remove, officers and persons subordinate to the Commissioner to collect and manage the Customs revenue, and to perform the several duties incident to and connected with the collection and management thereof:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony as aforesaid, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, do hereby delegate to

HARRY ALBERT ATKINSON,

the Commissioner of Customs appointed as aforesaid, the power to appoint and remove officers and persons subordinate to the Commissioner to collect and manage the Customs revenue, and to perform the several duties incident to and connected with the

collection and management thereof vested in me by the said in part recited Act, to be held and exercised by him from time to time as he shall think fit, so long as he shall hold the said office of Commissioner of Customs.

Despatch.—Revised Regulations respecting the Examination, &c., of Naval Cadets.

THE following despatch, received from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

Downing Street, 20th January, 1882.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for information in the colony under your Government, copies of revised regulations respecting the examination and entry of naval cadets, which will come into force for the examination taking place in June next.

I have been requested by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to call attention to the alteration made in paragraph 9, whereby colonial cadets will in future be required to obtain five-tenths of the marks in arithmetic, instead of four-tenths as heretofore.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.—(FOR THE INFORMATION OF CANDIDATES.)

1. Appointments to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the under-mentioned exceptions:—

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies;

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from the sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; to the Secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the test examination specified in paragraph 8, and will in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

The examination of candidates nominated to compete, and also of service cadets, will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners. A fee of 10s. will be required from each candidate.

2. Except in special circumstances not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves for examination at the Royal Naval College will be entered.

3. Nominations for naval cadetships will take place half-yearly, as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received.

4. Examinations of the young gentlemen who have obtained nominations will be held at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, commencing on the second Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and the 15th January following respectively.

5. No candidate will be eligible for examination in June whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, *viz.*, not less than twelve nor more than thirteen and a half years of age, nor in November whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.

6. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary

disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the navy.

7. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a certificate of the date of his birth,* or a declaration thereof made before a Magistrate; (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) a certificate of good health.

8. The candidates will be tested by examination in the following subjects:—

	Marks.
(1.) Arithmetic: including proportion, vulgar and decimal fractions	250
(2.) Algebra: including fractions and simple equations of one unknown quantity	175
(3.) Geometry: definitions, postulates, axioms, and subjects of the first twenty-six propositions of Euclid's Elements	175
(4.) English: writing from dictation—spelling, 75; handwriting, 25... ..	100
English: reading with intelligence, and parsing easy sentences	100
(5.) French: translating, by aid of a dictionary, French into English, and English into French; reading, parsing, and speaking	200
(6.) Scripture history	100

Candidates will be further examined in any two of the following subjects they may select:—

Elementary mathematics: miscellaneous questions in arithmetic, algebra (including quadratic equations), and geometry to the end of the first book of Euclid's Elements	300
Latin: reading, parsing, and translating, by aid of a dictionary, Latin into English, and English into Latin	300
Geography and English history	300

The final order of merit will be determined by the sum of the marks obtained in the test, as well as in the further examination.

In arithmetic the candidate will be required to obtain five-tenths, and in each of the other subjects of the test examination four-tenths, of the marks allotted thereto.

9. Colonial and service cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain 660 marks in the aggregate, as well as five-tenths in arithmetic and four-tenths in each of the other subjects.

10. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the regulations as to limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.

11. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

12. For all cadets entered under these regulations the payment will be at the rate of £70 per annum for the period in the "Britannia," to be paid half-yearly in advance to the Accountant-General of the Navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the cadets entered at each half-yearly examination, a number, not to exceed ten, being sons of officers of

the navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the cadets.

13. The period of training on board the "Britannia" will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

14. There will be examinations in seamanship and study at the end of each term.

Cadets who pass unsatisfactory examinations, or who are reported for unsatisfactory conduct, will be "warned," and they will be liable to be discharged at the end of the following or any subsequent term should they again be reported as failing to attain the proper number of marks at the examinations, or for unsatisfactory conduct.

If a cadet is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term he will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the "Britannia."

Any cadet who shall appear to their Lordships for any reason to be unfit for the service will be removed from the "Britannia."

15. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the "Britannia" is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the "Britannia") to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.

16. Cadets will, on passing out of the "Britannia," rank according to the amount of sea-time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea-time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the "Britannia."

17. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

18. Pay and pocket-money will not be allowed by Government to cadets entered in and after June, 1881.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first 50 tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 30th June, 1882.
2. The claim must be made before the 31st December, 1882.
3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.
