A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient

that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Cambridge Town District," and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five in number.

SCHEDULE.

CAMBRIDGE TOWN DISTRICT.

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and the House of Representatives of the said colony, No. 48, of 1881, entitled "An Act to amend 'The Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Act, 1867,'" was presented to the Governor of the said colony for Her Majesty's assent, and the said Bill was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, do, by this Proclamation, signify and proclaim to all whom it may concern that the said Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the lands described in the Schedule hereto are now vested in Her Majesty, being lines of road which were closed by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, issued under the hand of his Honor James Macandrew, the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by "The Roads Diversion Ordinance, 1868," and "The Roads Diversion Ordinance, 1871," respectively: And whereas it is desirable that the lands should be dealt with as provided by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881:"

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," and all other powers and authorities enabling me on that behalf, do hereby declare and define that the purposes for which the said lands shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, be dedicated shall be for a public highway.

WHEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is, among other things, provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or revoke by-laws and regulations for regulating the traffic on roads and bridges used both for ordinary and railway traffic:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities vested in him for that purpose, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the by-laws and regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for regulating the traffic on the Rakaia Bridge, and which said bridge forms part of the railway from Hurunui to the Bluff, and is used both for ordinary and railway traffic; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers and authorities, and with the like advice and consent, doth revoke all by-laws and regulations in force at the date hereof authorizing or regulating traffic on, along, or across the said bridge.

SCHEDULE.

1. All horses crossing the bridge which are not driven in harness, or led by bridle or halter, and all cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, mules, and donkeys, must have a man behind them, and cattle, sheep, and horses, in mobs, must also have a man before them.

2. Horses or light-wheeled vehicles will not be allowed to enter upon the bridge within twenty minutes, drays within thirty minutes, and cattle and sheep or pigs within one hour of the time that any train is due on the bridge.

3. Horsemen or wheeled vehicles will not be allowed to travel at a greater rate than six miles an hour across the bridge.

4. Traction engines and portable engines employed in agriculture, flax-dressing, or other purposes may pass over the bridge on their own wheels, provided they have no fewer than four travelling wheels with tires not less than five inches broad; the boiler must be empty, and all fire must be drawn at least half a mile distant from the bridge.

5. No greater weight than three tons gross on any one pair of wheels with tires less than five inches broad will be permitted to cross the bridge.

6. Any authorized officer of the Railway Department may, at his discretion, relax any of the restrictions in clause 2, as the case may require.

7. Any person or persons entering upon the bridge within the prohibited hours, or resisting the gatekeepers in the execution of their duties, will be subject to the penalty hereinafter mentioned.

8. Any person in a state of intoxication will not be permitted to enter upon the bridge whilst in such condition.

9. Any person offending against any of these regulations will be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

10. So far as applicable the general by-laws and regulations for the time being respectively in force and affecting the traffic on the New Zealand railways shall extend and apply to the Rakaia Bridge.
