Special Licensing District.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, proclaim and define the part of the colony mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto to be a special licensing district for the purposes of the said Act, and that such district shall be known by the name by which it is designated in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

MAHINAPUA DISTRICT.

BOUNDED towards the North-east by the Borough of Hokitika; towards the North-west by the said Borough of Hokitika to the Hokitika River; again towards the North-east and towards the South-east by the said Hokitika River and a line known as the HH line respectively to the intersection of the latter by another line known as the HM line; again towards the South-east by the said HM line to its intersection by another line known as the HF line; towards the East by the said HF line to the Totara River; towards the South-west by the said Totara River; and again towards the North-west by the ocean to the place of commencement.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Honorable Arthur Hamilton Gordon, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this seventeenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Licensing Districts redefined.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same : And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the Districts of Kanieri and Jackson's Bay :

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do, hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, alter and redefine the boundaries of the Kanieri and Jackson's Bay Districts, which shall henceforth be those described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

KANIERI.

COMMENCING at the mouth of the Arahura River; thence along the southern bank of said river to its source; thence southerly along the dividing range between the Provincial Districts of Westland and Canterbury to the source of the Pass River (a branch of the Hokitika River); thence down the southern bank of said river to its junction with the Hokitika River; and thence down the southern bank of the lastmentioned river to a line known as the HO line; thence westerly along the said HO line to its intersection by another line known as the HH line; thence north-easterly along the said HH line to the Hokitika River; thence north-westerly along the southern bank of the said Hokitika River to the south-eastern boundary-line of the Borough of Hokitika; thence along the said south-eastern boundary-line and along the north-eastern boundary-line of the said Borough of Hokitika to low-water mark of the ocean; and thence northerly along low-water mark of the ocean to the mouth of the Arahura River, the place of commencement.

JACKSON'S BAY.

Commencing at the mouth of the Totara River; thence along the northern bank of the said Totara River to a line known as the HF line; thence northerly along the said HF line to its intersection by another line known as the HM line; thence easterly along the said HM line to its intersection by another line known as the HH line; thence northerly along the said HH line to its intersection by another line known as the HO line; thence easterly along the said HO line to the Hokitika River; thence along the southern bank of said Hokitika River to its junction with the Pass River (a branch of the Hokitika River); thence along the southern bank of last-mentioned river to its source; thence southerly along the northern boundary-line of Lake County to the ocean; and thence northerly by the ocean to the place of commencement.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Auckland.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Auckland did, on the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursu-

ance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the twenty-first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at Auckland, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in that office.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

Land withdrawn from the Deferred-payment System in Otago.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation : And whereas the land specified in the Schedule hereto was, with other lands, on the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, proclaimed as set apart for sale on deferred payments :

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamation above referred to, so far as it relates to the section therein mentioned and included in the Schedule hereto, and do proclaim and declare that the said section is hereby withdrawn from the operation of the deferred-payment system.
