Land taken for Road in the County of Manawatu.

ARTHUR GORDON, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

THEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road in Block five, Te Awahou, Foxton, Manawatu:

And whereas the Manawatu County Council has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required

by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Hamilton Gordon, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

(Circular.)

Downing Street, 15th August, 1881. Sir,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a circular issued by the French Government, containing regulations with regard to the importation

into France of provisions in soldered tins.

I have thought it advisable to send copies of this circular to all colonies, so that those colonies which do not export, but may import provisions in tins, may be aware of the opinion expressed by the French Government with regard to tins soldered in the manner described.

Paris, 28th August, 1880.

THE attention of the Department of Commerce has been called to the dangers which consumers may incur from the use of food-substances enclosed in tins the soldering of which has been effected on the inside, and which are made of metals not coated with pure tin.

The Consulting Committee on Public Health, to

whom the question has been submitted, has recognized that there is, in fact, serious inconvenience to the public health in allowing to be used as food substances which, owing to their contact with solders, or with surfaces covered with alloys containing lead, may

cause poisoning of a more or less grave nature. Committee has, in consequence, expressed its opinion that there is sufficient ground for prohibiting manufacturers of preserved food tins from soldering them inside, and from employing in their fabrication any metals which have not been lined with pure tin. The Committee added that, if manufacturers still persisted in having recourse to soldering the lids from the inside, they ought to be restricted to the use of pure tin only. This opinion has been adopted by the Minister of Commerce, and instructions have been instructions have been issued to Prefects of departments accordingly.

Similar action appeared necessary as regards provision tins from foreign sources, as much for sanitary reasons as not to place French manufacturers in a position less favourable than that of their foreign rivals. The Minister of Finance has consequently decided, under date the 2nd April last, that there was room for requiring that imported tins should be made in accordance with the conditions above mentioned. Those which are found not to comply with the regulations shall be provisionally retained by the authorities, whose duty it will be to immediately inform the Attorney of the Republic for the district.

In order to permit French manufacturers to dispose of the tins which they may have on stock, it has been determined that the new regulations shall come into force only on the 1st August, 1881, at which date they will also rigidly apply to foreign importa-

The Directors are requested to make these regulations known both to the authorities and the public interested.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

Colonial Secretary's Office. Wellington, 1st February, 1882.

OTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under :-

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

STARCH.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given on the first 50 tons of starch, manufactured in the colony, which shall be shipped to an English market, and for which a satisfactory certificate shall be given by dealers or brokers in England that the starch is of good marketable quality.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

Conditions.

- 1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 30th June, 1882.
- 2. The claim must be made before the 31st Decem-
- ber, 1882.
 3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand, Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.

2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.
3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st De-

cember, 1883.

4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above

conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.

5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of bond fide account sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as pig-iron.
