A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by "The Canterbury Roads Ordinance, 1872," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby divide the Wakanui Road District into three subdivisions, with the names and boundaries set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and I do further declare that the number of members to be elected for each of such subdivisions shall be one member for number one Ward, two members for number two Ward, and two members for number three Ward, and do severally assign the members of the Road Board now in office to the said subdivisions, in the manner set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

No. 1 WARD (SUBURBS).

BOUNDED towards the North-west and South-west by the north-western and south-western boundaries of the Wakanui Road District; towards the North-east by Reserve No. 1496 (in red), and by a line bearing $144^{\circ} 9'$ for a distance of $2023\frac{1}{2}$ links, drawn from the southernmost corner of said reserve; thence north-easterly $54^{\circ} 9'$, 1100 links; thence south-easterly $144^{\circ} 9'$, 423 links, to the northernmost corner of Rural Section 24369; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 24369 and 18126, and the prolongation of north-west boundary of latter section to the south-west side of road north-east of Reserve No. 1120 (in red); thence north-westerly and south-westerly along the latter reserve and a line in continuation of its north-western boundary to the centre of road north-east of Section No. 13757; thence south-easterly along the centre

line of said road to its junction with Wakanui Road; thence north-westerly along centre of Wakanui Road to its junction with Trevor's Road; thence south-westerly along the centre of latter road and a line in continuation thereof to the middle of the River Ashburton; and from thence by a line along the centre of said river to the aforesaid north-western boundary of the Wakanui Road District.

No. 2 WARD (WAKANUI FLAT).

Bounded towards the North-west by No. 1 Ward towards the North-east by the centre of the Seafield and Butterick's Roads from the north-west boundary to the Wakanui Township Road; thence by the centre of the latter road and of Leadley's Road to the sea; towards the South-east by the sea; and towards the South-west by the south-western boundary of the Wakanui Road District.

No. 3 WARD (PLAINS).

That portion of the Wakanui Road District not included in the above-described wards.

No. 1 Ward (Suburbs), one member: FRANCIS THOMAS MAYO.

No. 2 Ward (Wakanui Flat), two members: HUGO FRIEDLANDER and JAMES BROWN.

*Bonuses on Colonial Industries.*Colonial Secretary's Office,
Wellington, 18th July, 1882.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first 10,000 gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL-CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first 50 tons of oil-cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk) which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1882.
2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1883.
3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.
4. Further information and particulars may be obtained by application to the Colonial Secretary's Office.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.
2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.
3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1883.
4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.
5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of *bona fide* account sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as pig-iron.

at or below Fort Denison, in the harbour of Port Jackson, until boarded by the Health Officer of the port and by him admitted to pratique,—that arrangements are now made, for the purpose of avoiding unnecessary delays, by which, on and after the 1st proximo, all vessels liable as aforesaid, immediately upon or after their entering the heads of Port Jackson, will be boarded and admitted to pratique or otherwise, according to law, by the Assistant Health Officer for the port, specially stationed at Watson's Bay for the purpose; and all vessels not so boarded will, as directed by law, await the visit of the Health Officer at or below Fort Denison as heretofore.

Decision of Court of Inquiry into Loss of s.s. "Westport" confirmed.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government has been pleased to confirm the following decision of the Court of Inquiry into the loss of the s.s. "Westport," by which the New Zealand certificate of competency as master ordinary, No. 21, held by John Gibb, is suspended for six months from the 5th instant. The official number of the "Westport" was 69007, and her registered tonnage 263.

THAT the "Westport" left Timaru for Lyttelton on the 13th June, at 5.15 p.m., with smooth sea, little or no wind, and fine clear weather, steering a course that her captain considered would take her six miles to the eastward of Akaroa light. That she carried these circumstances with her as she ran her course until she neared Banks Peninsula, which was observed to be obscured by fog, and about 1 a.m. she ran into the fog. The captain was called and came on deck about 1.30 a.m., and about ten minutes afterwards he observed land. This land is said to have been about two miles distant, but I am of opinion that it could not have been more than half a mile, as little more than ten minutes after this, without any change of weather, she was run upon the rocks of Piraki Cove, and the high land of that coast was not seen until it appeared to the second mate to be

about to strike the masts above her. On first sighting the land the captain appears to have taken no precaution to ascertain his position, and to have guessed it incorrectly. The sight of land, even within two miles, when his course was laid to go six miles outside the light, must have warned him that wherever he was he was not on his course. If he had used the log his distance would have shown him that he must have been far off it to be within two miles of land, but the log had not been used. If he had heaved the lead the soundings would at once have told him where he was, and the loss of the ship would have been avoided. This was not done. Instead, the captain put his ship's stern to the land, and ran about a mile away from it to the south-east, and then hauled his course again, and in about five minutes more ran on the rocks. He appears to have been about thirteen miles out of his position in a run of about seventy-two miles; and, although there is no clear evidence as to the cause, the fact itself, and the negating of any other sufficient reason, is enough to suggest deviation of the compass in an iron ship which had not been swung in this hemisphere.

Examination showed such injuries to the ship that if they had not been inside a watertight compartment she must, when afloat, have sunk in five minutes, and also other injuries outside that compartment, which caused her to make from two to three feet of water per hour. By jettisoning cargo Captain Gibb got her off, and in this condition took her round to Akaroa, where he beached her.

Here the marine surveyor for the underwriters came on board, and a portable engine and centrifugal pump were taken on board, and, after some rude expedients had been used, which cannot be dignified by the name of repairs, the safety of the ship was intrusted to the strength of the bulkhead and the capacity of the pump, and she was taken round to Port Lyttelton. On this passage the pump, as was to be expected in a grain-laden ship, choked more than once, and gave plain warning that the experiment was dangerous even for so short a passage. No other repairs worth mentioning were effected, and the marine surveyor for the underwriters gave a certificate that the ship was fit for sea, with intent to enable the captain thereby, and which did enable him, to obtain his clearance. Of course no certificate given by any irresponsible person can relieve the person who is responsible of his liability; and it is only as it influenced the action of the captain and the loss of the ship that the conduct of this gentleman calls for remark; but I feel bound to say that, on his own evidence, his survey was useless and perfunctory; his recommendation to load down the leaky ship with wet grain would have increased the danger; and his certificate was untrue in fact, and was calculated to lead the captain directly into a "wrongful act and default."

At 4.45 a.m. on the 18th June Captain Gibb took his ship out of Lyttelton in this disabled and unseaworthy condition, trusting only, for the voyage to Wellington, to the strength of the bulkhead and the sufficiency of the pumping gear, and, with from twelve to twenty tons of loose coal and fifty or sixty bags of wheat in his hold, a few grains of which were sufficient to choke his pump, and after many difficulties, reached Cape Campbell, which he left on the 20th, to cross the Straits. Here it came on to blow heavily, and he tried to force his disabled vessel through the storm to the other side, but was at last compelled to put back with his pump broken and in a sinking condition to Flaxbourne, when the crew had as much as they could do to escape with their lives, and the vessel foundered.

In my opinion the loss of the "Westport" resulted from the wrongful act and default of Captain Gibb—

1. In not heaving the lead when he sighted the land;
 2. In not navigating more cautiously in a dense fog, when he knew he was close to a rocky shore and out of his course;
 3. In not having swung his ship in this hemisphere;
 4. In going to sea from Lyttelton in an unseaworthy condition;
 5. In attempting to press his disabled vessel across the Straits in the face of bad weather until she was unable to retreat.

And I suspend his certificate for six months. The costs to be borne by Captain Gibb: £10 10s. Nautical Assessors' expenses, and £3 10s. expenses of five witnesses.

We recommend, under section 246, that a certificate of the grade of first officer be issued to Mr. Gibb, in lieu of his master's certificate suspended.

Te Makarini Scholarships.

THREE scholarships, to be held at the Native College, Te Aute, Hawke's Bay, are offered by the Trustees of the fund instituted in memory of the late Sir Donald McLean for promoting the higher education of Maori youths.

Two of these scholarships are open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 30th November, 1882, shall not exceed fifteen years, and who shall have attended a Native college or school for the preceding twelve months.
