Land taken for Roads in the Mangapiko Highway District, Auckland.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of roads in the Mangapiko Highway District, Provincial District of Auckland:

And whereas the Mangapiko Highway District Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of roads; and that, from and after the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as roads.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement 3 acres 1 rood 9 perches, more or less, situated in the Parish of Mangapiko, in the Mangapiko Highway District, and being the eastern portion of Allotment No. 312; commencing at the north-eastern angle of Allotment No. 312. Bounded towards the East by a line, 3470 links; towards the West by other portion of Allotment No. 312, 3903 links; and towards the North-east by lines, 320 and 148 links.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement 4 acres 2 roods 35 perches, more or less, situated in the Parish of Mangapiko, in the Mangapiko Highway District, and being portions of Allotments Nos. 89 and 91; commencing on the eastern boundary of Allotment No. 91 at a point 836 links distant from the north-eastern angle of that lot. Bounded towards the East and South-east by a road-line 103 links, and by lines 836, 1003, 1610, 640, and 507 links; towards the South by a road-line, 114 links; and towards the West and North-west by Allotments Nos. 89 and 91, 538, 716, 1681, 1008, and 898 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less; and the same being more particularly delineated on the map attached to the memorial above referred to.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE
GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-nine of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that, where the Trustees of any public cemetery, or the Trustees, Managers, or other persons having the care and control of any other cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial heretofore established, shall be desirous of adopting the provisions of this Act, or any of them, in the place of any Act or Ordinance, or any provisions of such Act or Ordinance, heretofore regulating the management of any such last-mentioned cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial, the said Trustees, Managers, or other persons may apply to the Governor in Council in that behalf, who may thereupon cause inquiry to be made in such manner as he shall think fit as to the desirability of granting such petition; and the Governor may, by Order in Council, direct that the provisions of this Act, or any of them, shall come into force in respect of any such cemetery, burial-ground, or place of burial, or he may reject any such application:

And whereas the Trustees of the Hawera Public Cemetery have applied to the Governor to bring the said cemetery under the provisions of the said Act, and due inquiry has been made in pursuance of the said thirty-ninth section as to the desirability of granting such petition:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator

of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and direct that all provisions of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," shall come into force in respect of the public cemetery at Hawera, in the Provincial District of Taranaki, and known as the Hawera Cemetery, as the same is described in the Schedule hereto; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me, I do, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, order and direct that this order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof.

Despatches: Proposed Establishment of a Royal College of Music.—Passports to Naturalised British Subjects.

THOMAS DICK.

Downing Street, 31st May, 1882.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, in such manner as may appear best calculated to secure general attention, copies of two letters from His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, accompanied by reports of the proceedings which have recently taken place in this country in connection with the proposed establishment of a Royal College of Music. I also enclose copies of a paper explaining the terms on which it is proposed that scholarships shall be founded.

It will be perceived that any locality desiring to promote the objects of the proposed College may do so by founding one or more scholarships in the College, for the advantage of persons residing in such locality, to be competed for under regulations to be hereafter made; and that private individuals will be enabled either to found scholarships, and thus to have the nomination of students from the colony to which they belong, or simply to contribute to the general subscription fund.

MY LORD,—I am anxious that no possible steps should be omitted which may be calculated to bring the proposal to found a Royal College of Music under the favourable notice of Her Majesty's subjects in the colonies.

It appears to me that the communication, which I request you in the accompanying letter to be good enough to transmit for the information of the Governments of the various colonies, might advantageously be supplemented by a somewhat more general distribution within these colonies of the proceedings which have taken place here in connection with the movement.

The object of such distribution would be to awaken public interest among all classes of Her Majesty's subjects more thoroughly than even proposals on the part of any of the Colonial Governments to extend their practical aid are calculated to do.

I have therefore directed further copies of these proceedings to be transmitted to you, and would again request that your Lordship will be good enough to forward these further copies for distribution among such religious or educational institutions, municipal or other public bodies, or private persons in the various colonies as may be thought most likely to help the project.

I trust that the efforts now being made here may meet with general support on the part of the clergy of all denominations in the colonies, and that they, as well as the heads of colleges and municipal bodies, may interest themselves in their several localities to make known the advantages offered by the establishment of the Royal College of Music, and especially

that all these advantages, including free instruction, will be open as unreservedly to Her Majesty's colonial subjects as to those residing in the United Kingdom.

Her Majesty's colonial subjects have indeed already shown that the possession of musical talent exists among them in as great a degree as in any other nation; for they may claim with pride that they have produced one of the most accomplished vocalists of the present day.

I have in past years had occasion in many ways, especially through the medium of the various international exhibitions over which I have presided, to notice the manifold benefits which have resulted from the combined action of the colonies and the mother-country in the development of commerce and the advancement of industrial and other material interests; and I cannot but think that the friendly rivalry of all portions of the empire will not now be wanting in the effort to cultivate a refined and elevating pursuit, which in all ages and among all nations has exercised so important an influence on national character, and done so much to strengthen the common love of country.

I have the more confidence in making this appeal from the readiness and public spirit which the colonies have always evinced to promote every object tending to strengthen the ties that now so happily unite us.

Your Lordship will, I am sure, be glad to learn that I have had the advantage of communicating with a number of gentlemen resident in several of the colonies, who are temporarily in England, as well as with former colonists permanently residing here; and they have kindly undertaken, by their individual exertion, to further the present more extended movement, which I trust will also meet with your Lordship's encouragement and approval.

I need not state to you how anxious I am to secure the co-operation of the Government of the several colonies, and of our fellow-subjects residing here, in the present movement.

I do not, however, presume to suggest in what form their support should practically be given, but must leave it to the Governments of the various colonies to evince their interest in such manner as each may consider becoming.

I trust that this movement may meet with your Lordship's support, and that you may feel warranted in commending it to the favourable consideration of the Governors of Her Majesty's colonies.

ROYAL COLLEGE OF MUSIC.

THE Royal College of Music will consist of two branches—a foundation and a paying branch, the members of the foundation comprising only persons who attain that distinction by open competition.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has

recently received representations from various localities expressing a desire to found scholarships to be restricted to each locality.

His Royal Highness the President has, therefore, decided that scholarships providing tuition and maintenance may be established, open to local competition only, on payment of a capital sum of £3,000, such scholarships bearing the name of the founder. The candidates must pass an examination before examiners appointed or approved by the College; and if no candidate reaches the required standard of excellence, the scholarship will be applied to the general funds of the College until such time as a sufficiently qualified candidate is offered.

Under these conditions, any locality for each sum of £3,000 may have in perpetuity a scholar in the College designated by the name of the locality.

SIR,—Her Majesty's Government have had under their consideration the position of aliens naturalised in a colony, when travelling beyond the limits of the colony in which naturalisation has been granted, and they have decided that aliens naturalised in British colonies shall, as regards their claim to British protection out of Her Majesty's dominions, be placed in future on the same footing as aliens naturalised in this country under the Naturalisation Act of 1870.

2. To carry out this object, aliens naturalised in British colonies will be allowed to receive from the Governor of the colony in which they have been naturalised a passport unlimited in point of duration instead of a passport for one year, as is now authorized. These passports will also be issued by the Foreign Office in London, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

3. If, however, an alien naturalised in a colony, and not possessing such passport, finds himself in need of one when in a foreign country, a British Minister or Consul will be empowered, on such evidence as he may deem sufficient, to grant him a provisional passport, limited in duration, in order to meet the immediate requirements of his case, and to enable him to return to his colony or to the United Kingdom, and so establish his identity beyond question, and obtain a permanent passport.

4. I enclose an amended regulation, which will be substituted in the colonial regulations for the present Regulation No. 404, in chapter xiv.; and also an amended form of passport, which will be inserted in the appendix, in place of the form and memorandum now in use.

Form of Passport.

THIS passport is granted to A.B., naturalised as a British subject in this colony, to enable him to travel in foreign parts.

This passport is granted with the qualification that the bearer shall not, when within the limits of the Foreign State of which he was a subject previously to obtaining his colonial certificate of naturalisation, be entitled to British protection, unless he has ceased to be a subject of that State in pursuance of the laws thereof or in pursuance of a treaty to that effect.

§ II.—*Passports to Naturalised British Subjects in the Colonies.*

404. Governors are authorized to issue passports for foreign travel to persons naturalised in their respective colonies. The form of passport is inserted in the appendix (page 317). These passports must be signed by the Officer Administering the Government, and must contain an express declaration that the person receiving the passport has been naturalised as a British subject in the colony.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE DIPTON CEMETERY.

1. A portion of the cemetery shall be surveyed into allotments of 10 feet by 8 feet, and 10 feet by 4 feet.

2. The exclusive right of burial in perpetuity in these allotments may be acquired at the following rates, viz. :—

3. Those grave-sites occupied before survey of the cemetery may be similarly acquired, according to the dimensions shown on the plan, on payment of the sum of £2 for each lot.

4. In all cases of intended interment the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the Clerk of the cemetery for the time being for a warrant for such interment, which warrant the Clerk is hereby authorized to grant.

5. The person applying for a warrant shall be liable for the payment of the following fees, viz. :—

6. The said warrant when received by the gravedigger shall be sufficient authority to him for each interment.

7. All graves shall not be less than 6 feet deep.

8. Should any person require a grave dug deeper than 6 feet, an extra charge of 2s. per foot shall be made.

9. The Clerk for the time being shall keep a book, in which he shall enter from time to time the number of every lot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of sale of the same, and shall keep a record of burials in the cemetery.

10. The Clerk for the time being shall receive the purchase-money for the sale of such lots, and shall give a receipt for the same, which receipt shall be held conclusive evidence of the selection and purchase of the lot mentioned therein.

11. All fences erected around any lot must be kept within the pegs of such lot.

12. All graves, gravestones, and fences must be

kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

13. The Trustees shall have power to prevent the planting of anything on any grave which they may consider objectionable or detrimental to the cemetery.

14. Any purchaser of private ground in which no interment shall have taken place may transfer his or her interest in said ground to any other person upon payment being made to the Clerk of the cemetery for the time being of a fee of 5s. for such transfer.

15. The costs and charges of the burial of any person in such cemetery will be remitted on proof being given to the satisfaction of the Trustees that such person was a pauper at the time of his death, and that there are no funds applicable, and no person is liable, for the payment of such costs and charges.

OIL-CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first 50 tons of oil-cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk) which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1882.
2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1883.
3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300

tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.
