*Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."*

 A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the West Taieri, Waipori, and Gabriel's Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

WEST TAIERI DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North from Lammerlaw Mountain by the summit of the leading ridge to the source of Sutton Stream; thence by said stream to the Taieri River; thence generally towards the East by said river; thence generally towards the South-west by the southern shore of Waihola Lake and by the western shores of Lakes Waihola and Waipori to the Waipori River; thence by that river to the north-western boundary-line of the West Taieri Hundred; thence by said boundary-line to a point south-east (true) of Waitahuna Hill; thence by a right line to said hill; thence by a right line to Trig. G, Block VIII., Waipori Survey District; thence by Section No. 5 of said block to the Waipori River; thence by that river to the Verter Burn; thence by the Verter Burn to Block VI., said survey district; thence by said block and by a road-line forming the northern boundary-line of Section No. 4 of said block, and forming the northern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 8 and 4, Block V., and the north-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 5, 4, and 3, Block II., said survey district, and following up the leading ridge to the summit of the watershed between the Waipori River and the Lees Stream; thence by a line along the summit of the leading ridge to Lammerlaw Mountain, the starting point.

GABRIEL'S DISTRICT.

All that area bounded towards the West by a line parallel to and 20 chains distant from the Clutha River, from a point opposite the Crookburn to a point opposite Beaumont Burn; towards the North and North-west by a right-line to the junction of said Beaumont Burn with the Clutha River, and by the Beaumont Burn to its source; thence by the summit of the leading ridge to Lammerlaw Mountain; towards the North-east and South-east by the West Taieri District, before described, to Waitahuna Hill; towards the South-west by the summit of the leading ridge from Waitahuna Hill to the summit of the watershed between the Rivers Tuapeka and Waitahuna; again towards the South-east by the said watershed, and by the summit of the leading ridge to the source of the Crookburn; thence by the Crookburn to the Clutha River, and by a right line across the Clutha River to the starting point: as the same is delineated on the plans in the Survey Office, Dunedin.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

*Districts constituted under "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875."*

 A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration

of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the West Taieri, Waipori, and Gabriel's Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names whereof shall be the West Taieri and Gabriel's Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be co-terminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

*Allocating Land in the Kaikoura Public Cemetery to certain Religious Denominations.*

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf by the thirty-second section of

"The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," and upon the request of the governing bodies of the several religious denominations named in the second column of the Schedule hereto, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby permanently appropriate and set apart the portions of the public cemetery known as the Kaikoura Suburban Public Cemetery, being Section number two hundred and sixty-four, as delineated on the official map in the Survey Office, Blenheim, and described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, for the exclusive interment of the bodies of members of the religious denominations named in the second column of the Schedule aforesaid, opposite to the description of each portion of the said cemetery respectively, upon such terms and conditions as the Trustees, who were appointed by warrant under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, dated the twentieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, may require to be performed and observed: Provided that such terms and conditions are not inconsistent with the known tenets or usages of the religious denominations named.

Fifth. Block IV., marked "Presbyterian" on the plan of the said cemetery, containing by admeasurement 2 acres 1 rood 33·2 perches. Bounded on the Northward by Block V., 350 links; on the Eastward by Scarborough Street, 700 links; on the Southward by a cemetery road, 352·3 links; and on the Westward by another cemetery road, 700 links. *Land set apart on Deferred Payments in the Southland Land District.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Southland did, on the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice of the Colony of New Zealand, and Administrator of the Government thereof, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in the principal land office of the district.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

*Dividing Pangatotara Highway District, County of Waimea, into Two Districts.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor of New Zealand, dated the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, a certain district described in the said Proclamation was constituted a highway district, and called the Pangatotara Highway District: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation as far as it relates to the said highway district, and to constitute two highway districts in lieu of the said district:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Nelson Highways Act, 1872," "The Nelson Highways Act Amendment Act, 1873," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," do hereby revoke the above-mentioned Proclamation as far as it relates to the said Pangatotara Highway District, and do hereby constitute the said district into two highway districts, to be called respectively the Pangatotara Highway District and the Pokororo Highway District, and do declare that the boundaries of the said highway districts respectively shall be those described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

POKORORO HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Nelson, bounded towards the North-east by a right line from Mount Snowden, bearing E. 22° 30' S., to the summit of the dividing range; towards the North-west by the said summit to a point due west of the northern corner of Section No. 62 of Square No. 9; towards the North by a right line; thence to said corner, and by

the north-east boundary lines of said section and of Sections Nos. 56, 57, 22, and 4 of 62 of said Square No. 9, Motueka Survey District, and across a road, to the Motueka River; thence generally towards the South-east by the said river to Graham River; thence towards the South-west by said river to its source; thence by a right line to Trig. L; thence by a right line to Trig. MP, in Mount Arthur Survey District; and thence by a right line to Mount Snowden, the starting point.

**PANGATOTARA HIGHWAY DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Provincial District of Nelson, bounded towards the North-east by the Pokororo Highway District, before-described, to the Motueka River; thence by a right line across said river; towards the North-west by said river to the road forming the eastern boundary of Sections Nos. 246, 247, 248, 249, and 250; towards the East by said road; thence across a road and by Sections Nos. 240, 239, 238, 237, 236, across a road, by Sections Nos. 235, 234, 232, and 231; thence across a road and by Section Nos. 1 of 1 and 2 of 1 to the westernmost corner of last-named section; thence by a right line to the south-east corner of Section No. 51; thence by Sections Nos. 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, and 47 to the south-west corner of last-named section; thence by a right line to the north-west corner of Section No. 82; thence by a right line to the southernmost angle of Section No. 151 of Wai-iti Survey District; thence generally towards the South by Sections Nos. 150, 148, 147, 87, 108, and 139 to the northernmost corner of last-named section; thence by a right line to the most easterly corner of Section No. 10, Thorpe Suburban; thence by said section, and by Sections Nos. 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1, and across a road, to the River Dove; thence by and across that river to the north-west corner of Section No. 88, by that section to its south-west corner; thence by a right line to the south-east corner of Section No. 103; thence by Section No. 104 and across a road to the Motueka River; thence by that river to the mouth of the River Baton; thence by a right line due west to the dividing range between the east and west coasts; and towards the South-west and West by a right line to the junction of the Leslie and Karamea Rivers, and by a right line to Mount Snowden: as the same is delineated on the maps in the Survey Office, Nelson.

*Town District of Papakura, County of Manukau, constituted.*

**A PROCLAMATION.**

**WHEREAS** by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act;

and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Papakura Town District," and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five in number.

**SCHEDULE.**

COMMENCING at the place of intersection of the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 13 of Section No. 8 of the Town of Papakura by the Auckland and Waikato Railway. Bounded towards the North by the railway-line aforesaid from the place above named to Hewling's line; thence by Hewling's line to the easternmost angle of Allotment No. 41 of the Parish of Papakura; thence by a right line in a south-easterly direction, and being the production of the north-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 41 aforesaid, to the southern side of the road which forms the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 3 of the Parish of Opaheke, and by that road to the northern angle of Allotment No. 3, last named; thence by the north-eastern boundary-line of Allotment No. 3 to the north-western angle of Allotment No. 15 of the Kerikeri Settlement, and by the north-western boundaries of Allotments Nos. 15 and 16 to the northernmost angle of the last-named lot; towards the East by the road which forms the eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, and 10, and the north-eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 54, 53, 50, 48, 45, 43, 42, 36, and 37 of the Settlement of Kerikeri aforesaid to the south-eastern angle of the last-named lot; towards the South by the road forming the southern boundary of the Settlement of Kerikeri aforesaid from the place last named to the

western side of the Auckland and Waikato Railway; towards the South-west by the western side of the railway aforesaid to the northern angle of Allotment No. 93 of the Settlement of Kerikeri aforesaid, and by that lot to its south-eastern corner; thence by a line in continuation of the south-east boundary of said Allotment No. 93 to Hunua Road; thence by that road and the Great South Road to Union Street; thence by Union Street to East Street, and by East Street to Elliott Street, and thence by Elliott Street to the waters of the Manukau Harbour; and towards the West by the waters of the Manukau Harbour aforesaid to the road which forms the western boundary of Allotment No. 14 of Section No. 6 of the Town of Papakura; thence by that road to the road which forms the south-western boundaries of Allotments Nos. 16, 14, and 12 of Section No. 8, also of the Town of Papakura, and continuing along the last-described road to the road which forms the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 12, last named; and thence following that road to the place of intersection of the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 13, by the Auckland and Waikato Railway, first mentioned, the place of commencement.

*Division of the Borough of Timaru into Four Wards under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876."*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," section twenty-one, it is enacted that, if not less than one-fourth of the burgesses of a borough petition the Governor, praying him to divide such borough into wards, the Governor may, by Proclamation, divide such borough into not less than three nor more than six wards, and shall in such Proclamation assign such names and boundaries to each ward as he thinks fit: And whereas not less than one-fourth of the burgesses of the Borough of Timaru have petitioned me to divide such borough into wards:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore recited authority, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Borough of Timaru, as described in the First Schedule hereto, shall be, and the same is hereby divided into four wards, having the names mentioned in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto; and the boundaries of such wards shall be those set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite the name of each ward respectively.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Canterbury, bounded towards the North by Whale's Creek;

towards the North-east, East, and again towards the North-east by the sea to a point on high-water mark in line with the south-eastern boundary-line of Sections Nos. 122 and 128; towards the South-east by a right line to and by said boundary-line and its production in a south-westerly direction to Rural Section No. 1702; towards the South by said section and by Rural Section No. 2367, by a road-line, and by Rural Section No. 1706 and Rural Section No. 1607; towards the West by last-mentioned section, a road-line, by Rural Section No. 1606, a road-line, and by Rural Section No. 707; towards the South by last-mentioned section and by Rural Section No. 1547; again towards the West by a road-line and by Rural Section No. 1652 to Whale's Creek: as the same is delineated on the plans in the Survey Office, Christchurch.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

South-east Ward	Bounded towards the North by North Street and the production of the southern side of said street to the sea; towards the East by the sea to a point where the production of the south-eastern boundary-line of Sections Nos. 128 and 122 intersects the coast-line; towards the South-east by said production and said line produced in the opposite direction to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 1702; towards the South by said section, Section No. 2367, a road-line, Section No. 1706, and Section No. 1607; towards the West by a road-line and Section No. 1606 to a point on the eastern boundary of said section where the production of the eastern side of George Street intersects said boundary; towards the North-west by said production and George Street; and again towards the West by Cross Street.
South-west Ward	Bounded towards the North by North Street; towards the East and South-east by South-east Ward before described; and towards the West by Section No. 1606, a road-line, and Section No. 707.
North-east Ward	Bounded towards the North and East by the sea; towards the South by South-east Ward, before described; towards the North-west by North Street (a right line from north-western corner of South-east Ward to Latter Street) and by Latter Street; again towards the North-west by George Street to a point on south side of said street where it is intersected by the production of the east side of Sophia Street; towards the South-west by said production and Sophia Street to Theodosia Street; towards the West by last-mentioned street and the production of its eastern side to the sea.
North-west Ward	Comprises all that portion of the Town of Timaru not included in the above-described wards.

**RULES FOR INTERMENT IN THE WAIU CEMETERY.**

1. The exclusive right of burial in any plot of ground in this cemetery shall be purchasable at the rate of 5s. per square yard, payable at the time of selection of the site; failing which, after the lapse of one year, the same shall remain open for selection.

2. No burial-plot shall be less than 9 feet in depth, nor contain less than four square yards, viz., 9 feet by 4 feet.

3. No person shall hold more than eight of such plots.

4. Persons not desirous of purchasing the exclusive right of burial may cause burials to take place by paying to the Trustees the sum of 10s. for each such interment, in addition to the usual burial-fees.

5. Applicants for burial-plots, exclusive or otherwise, can select any spot in any section on application to the Secretary, or any person duly authorized, who is hereby empowered to mark off the same on payment of the sum fixed by the regulations.

6. Each plot is to be staked off at the four corners with durable stakes at least 1 foot above the level of the ground.

7. The holders of any plots of burial-ground shall observe such rules with regard to enclosing, fencing, and decent maintenance of the same, as shall from time to time be laid down by the Trustees.

8. The top of any coffin deposited in any part of the cemetery shall not be less than 4 feet below the natural level of the soil.

9. It shall be at the option of the persons using the ground for interment to engage and pay such persons as they prefer either for the burial-service or the interment.

*Bonuses on Colonial Industries.*

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first 10,000 gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL-CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first 50 tons of oil-cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk) which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1882.

*Special Rules under "The Regulation of Mines Act, 1874."*

Mines Department,  
Wellington, 10th August, 1882.

THE under-mentioned special rules, to be observed at the Earnsclough Coal Mine, Otago District, are published in accordance with the provisions of section 31 of "The Regulation of Mines Act, 1874."

*The penalties for the violation of any special rules established under "The Regulation of Mines Act, 1874," and for offences against the Act, are provided for in sections 22 to 28, in Part VI.*

SPECIAL RULES.

1. No officer in a place of trust shall depute another person to do his work without the sanction of his superior; and no person in a place of trust shall absent himself without having previously obtained the permission of his superior officer for his term of absence.

2. Intoxicating drinks shall not be allowed in or about the mine without the consent of the Manager, and then only in cases of necessity; and no person in a state of intoxication shall be allowed to be in or about the mine.

MANAGER.

3. The Manager shall take all reasonable means for carrying out the requirements of the Act and special rules, by publishing and, to the best of his power, enforcing them. He shall be responsible for the appointment of a sufficient number of competent persons to carry out the requirements of the Act and the special rules, and also to see that the working of the mine is carried on with all reasonable provisions for the safety of the persons employed.

4. The Manager shall see that an adequate amount of ventilation is constantly produced in the mine to dilute and render harmless noxious gases to such an extent that the working-places of the shafts, levels, stables, and workings of the mine, and the travelling roads to and from such working-places, shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be in a fit state for working and passing therein.

5. The Manager shall see that an ample supply of timber, props, sprags, and other requisite materials are always on the premises, and that the same are distributed. He shall see that the roof and the sides in all working-places are properly secured by the persons working in them, and that the roof and sides of every travelling road be made and kept secure.

6. Where a place is likely to contain a dangerous accumulation of water, the Manager shall see that the working approaching such place does not exceed eight feet in width, and that there is constantly kept at a sufficient distance, not being less than five yards in advance, at least one bore-hole near the centre of the working, and sufficient flank bore-holes on each side.

7. The Manager shall see that the air-ways and air-crossings are kept properly opened, and shall travel through the air-ways at least once a week. He shall see that a ventilating furnace or other ventilating apparatus is provided if the natural cur-

rent be insufficient, and that the same is properly attended to.

8. The Manager shall see that all the provisions contained in this Act as to the employment of boys and male young persons are strictly enforced.

9. The Manager shall see that all places not in actual use are properly fenced across the whole width, so as to prevent persons inadvertently entering the same.

10. The Manager shall see that all the provisions contained in the Act relating to the use of gunpowder and other explosive substances used in the mine are strictly enforced.

11. The Manager shall see that proper man-holes and signals which are made or provided are kept in good order, according to the provisions of the Act.

12. The Manager shall withdraw men from working-places which are in any way unsafe.

MINERS.

13. Every miner shall, under the direction of the Manager, set a sufficient quantity of props and bars for safely supporting the roof and sides in his working-place. The timber shall be properly set, and be removed and renewed as often as is necessary.

14. No miner shall use or allow to be used any gunpowder, except in conformity with General Rule 2.

15. In addition to the examination by the under-viewer, or other officer, each work-person must examine his working-place before commencing work, and from time to time during his shift, and withdraw in case of danger.

16. Any person discovering any stoppage or derangement of the ventilation, injury to air-crossings, doors, stoppings, brattices, or air-pipes, or observing any obstruction in an air-course, a weakness in the roof, or deficiency of timber, or accumulation of gas or water, shall immediately give notice to the men and boys in that part of the mine, and to the Manager or underviewer.

17. Any person passing through a door must instantly close it; and no person shall injure a door or leave it open, break down or interfere with a stopping or a brattice, obstruct or damage an air-course, air-crossing, or air-pipe, or remove a caution-board or danger-signal, or do anything to interfere with the proper working of the mine, without an order from the Manager. No door must be propped or fastened back whilst on its hinges. All doors must be kept in good repair, and hung so that they will fall-to of themselves.

18. No person shall leave any light or any gunpowder in any part of the mine when leaving his work.

19. Shots must be rammed with soft material not likely to strike fire, and no person shall fire shots without authority from the Manager.

20. When a shot has missed fire it shall not be unrammed, but shall be reported to the Manager, and the place shall not be approached without the permission of the Manager.

21. No coal or other material shall be raised or lowered in the shaft when any person is therein.

22. The Manager, or some other competent person, shall, every morning before commencing work, examine the ropes and winding-gear, and the horse-harness; and, if he find any weakness or defect therein, shall not allow coal to be raised until such weakness or defect be remedied.

23. The Manager, or some other competent person, shall, every morning before commencing work, examine the shaft and ladders by which men ascend and descend; and, if he find any weakness or defect therein, shall not allow men to descend until such weakness or defect be remedied.

24. The banksman in charge of the pit-top shall not allow any stranger to go down the shaft without the permission of the Manager.

25. The banksman shall see that the fencing is placed securely round the top of each shaft when not at work.

*Te Makarini Scholarships.*

THREE scholarships, to be held at the Native College, Te Aute, Hawke's Bay, are offered by the Trustees of the fund instituted in memory of the late Sir Donald McLean for promoting the higher education of Maori youths.

Two of these scholarships are open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 30th November, 1882, shall not exceed fifteen years, and who shall have attended a Native college or school for the preceding twelve months. The remaining scholarship is open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 30th November, 1882, shall not exceed thirteen years, and who shall have attended a Native village school for the preceding twelve months.

The scholarships are of the annual value of £35, and are tenable for two years from the 1st January, 1883.

The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 18th and 19th December, 1882. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted not later than the 31st October.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Secretary to the Education Department.
