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*Defining the Middle Line of Portion of the Waitaki-Bluff Railway.—Waipahi to Heriot Burn Branch.—Swift Creek Section.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the branch line of railway from Waipahi to Heriot Burn from the main line, Waitaki-Bluff Railway, is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point in Section number four, Block four, Township of Kelso, to a point in Section number twenty-seven, Block four, Greenvale Survey District, all within the Provincial District of Otago, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 9212, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Walter Woods Johnston, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Dunedin, in the Provincial District of Otago.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point situate in Section No. 4, Block IV., Township of Kelso, the said point being the termination of a portion of the Waipahi-Heriot Burn Branch Railway, as described in a Proclamation dated the 10th February, 1880, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 15, of the 19th February, 1880; proceeding thence in a generally north-north-easterly direction for a distance of 4 miles 35 chains, or thereabouts, and passing in, through, or over the following lands, &c., viz.: Township of Kelso—Block IV., Sections Nos. 4, 3, 2, and 1; Block III., Sections Nos. 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1; Block II., Section No. 5; Greenvale Survey District—Block II., Sections Nos. 5 and 4; Block I., Sections Nos. 31 and 21; and again Block II., Sections Nos. 6, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42; Block IV., Sections Nos. 7, 8, 9, and 27; and terminating at a point in said Section No. 27 distant about 6½ chains in a southerly direction from the north-western angle of said Section No. 27; and including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; all in the Provincial District of Otago and Colony of New Zealand; as delineated on a plan marked P.W.D. 9212, which plan is signed by the Hon. Walter Woods Johnston, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Dunedin, in the said provincial district.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Council of a borough constituted under that Act may take any land within the borough for any of the purposes of that Act in the manner provided by the Second Part of "The Public Works Act, 1876" (hereinafter called "the said Act"): And whereas the Council of the Borough of Thames, requiring to take the land described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of roads, has laid before me the memorials referred to by section twenty-five of the said Act, praying me to declare, by Proclamation, that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for such purpose:

And whereas the Council of the said borough has, in accordance with the twenty-eighth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," laid before me statutory declarations that the said Council is authorized by law to undertake the work for which the land described in the memorials laid before me under section twenty-five of the said Act is required, that all the provisions of the said Act as to taking such land have been complied with, and that the said Council is of opinion that the proposed works should be executed, and that no private injury will be done for which due compensation is not provided by the said Act:

And whereas it appears to me that all things required by the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," to be done and performed to authorize the taking of such land have been done and performed, and it is expedient to declare that such land is taken for the purpose aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the said Acts, and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken by the Council of the said borough for the purposes of roads; and that, from and after the twenty-fourth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the said land shall become vested in fee-simple in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Thames, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for the purposes of roads as aforesaid.

“Contagious Diseases Act, 1869,” brought into Force in the City of Auckland.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by “The Contagious Diseases Act, 1869,” it is, among other things, enacted that the said Act shall extend and apply to such districts as the Governor shall from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, declare to be subject to the provisions thereof, and the limits of such districts shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be such as are defined in such Proclamation: And whereas it hath been represented to me that it is expedient that the district hereinafter described should be declared to be subject to the said Act as hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the day of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, all that district within the Provincial District of Auckland, which is hereinafter particularly defined, shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, I do hereby define the limits of the said district, for the purposes of the said Act, as follows:—

The Borough of the City of Auckland.

Town District of Wyndham, County of Southland, constituted.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by “The Town Districts Act, 1881” (hereinafter called “the said Act”), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under “The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876,” wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square

miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Wyndham Town District;" and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners of the said district shall consist of five in number.

#### SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the West and North by the Mataura River; towards the North-east by the Mimiha Stream to Section No. 62 on the plan of the Town of Wyndham; towards the East and again towards the North by said section to Section No. 5 of Block I, Wyndham Survey District; again towards the East by said Section No. 5 to Cardigan Road; and again towards the East, towards the South-east, and towards the South by that road and its northern side produced in a westerly direction to the Mataura River: as the same is delineated on the plans in the Survey Office, Dunedin.

#### *Extending the Boundaries of the Borough of the City of Auckland.*

#### A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and the Acts amending the same, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district the boundaries whereof are specified in the First Schedule hereto is hereby incorporated into the Borough of the City of Auckland, and shall constitute a separate ward of the said borough, to be called the Ponsonby Ward; and that the boundaries of the said borough shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland, bounded towards the North-east by Waitemata Harbour to a point on original high-water mark opposite the middle of Franklin Road; towards the South-east and North-east by the middle of Franklin and Ponsonby Roads to the south side of Richmond Road; towards the South by Sections Nos. 35, 34, 40, 41, and 43 to the left bank of Cox's Creek, and by that bank of said creek to Waitemata Harbour; and towards the West and North-west by high-water mark of said harbour.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

ALL that area commencing in the middle of Franklin Street, at the original high-water mark of Freeman's Bay; thence bounded towards the West by lines, 50 links and 300 links; towards the North by lines, 1225 links, 700 links, 270 links, 4300 links, 550 links, 90 links, 225 links, 675 links, 1350 links, 225 links, 300 links, 400 links, 250 links, 200 links, 1950 links, and 1800 links; towards the East by a line, 1500 links, to the Strand; thence along the Strand, 50 links; thence by Suburban Section No. 96, by the east side of Stanley Street from the south-western angle of Section No. 11 of the City of Auckland to the junction of Stanley Street with Grafton Road, by the east side of Grafton Road from the junction of Stanley Street to a point opposite the northern boundary of Lot No. 41 of Suburban Section No. 3; thence by a line at a right angle with Stanley Street to and by the northern boundary of said Lot No. 41, the northern boundary of Lot No. 8 of Suburban Section No. 15, by the east side of Symonds Street from the north-western angle of said Lot No. 8 to the junction of the Karangahape Road; towards the South by the south-east side of the Karangahape Road from Symonds Street to the junction of Ponsonby Road; thence by Sections Nos. 36, 35, 34, 40, 41, and 43 to the left bank of Cox's Creek, and by that bank of said creek to the Waitemata Harbour; again towards the West, towards the North-west, and towards the North-east by high-water mark of Waitemata Harbour to the point of commencement.

*Lands declared to be Waste Lands of the Crown.*

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands described in the Schedule hereto have been purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and Acts amending the same, to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, and it is expedient that the said lands should be declared to be waste lands of the Crown:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the seventeenth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," and the twenty-eighth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," and all other authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the said lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as in the first-mentioned Act provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown in force in the land districts in which they are respectively situated.

## RAWHITIROA No. 1.

ALL that parcel of land at Herekino, in the District of Hokianga, in the Provincial District of Auckland, known by the name of Rawhitiroa No. 1, containing by admeasurement 1,482 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North by the Rangiwahakaoma No. 2 Block, 630 links; towards the East by the sea, 450 links; towards the South by a line, 585 links; and towards the West by a line, 346 links.

## RANGIWHAKAOMA No. 4.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR DUNSANDEL CEMETERY, COUNTY OF SELWYN.**

1. The Trustees appointed by the Governor under "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," shall have the entire control and management of the Dunsandel Cemetery.

2. The Trustees have power by the said Act to allocate portions of the cemetery to the various religious denominations requiring the same. No interference will be permitted with such allocations. A portion of the cemetery will be set apart as open ground for purposes of general interment.

3. The exclusive right of burial in perpetuity in any plot of ground may be sold by the Trustees, to persons applying for the same, at £1 per plot.

4. Applications for this purpose may be made to the Trustees or to the Secretary, or other person authorized by them to receive the same.

5. In event of any person wishing to purchase a plot in any part of the cemetery not already plotted, such person must pay all costs of survey by a qualified surveyor.

6. Every burial-plot shall be 9 feet by 4 feet, and every grave 6 feet in depth at the least. In the event of the purchaser of private ground desiring a greater depth, an extra charge of 2s. 6d. shall be made for every foot more than 6 feet.

7. Any purchaser of private ground may transfer his or her interest therein to any other person upon payment of a fee of 5s. for such transfer.

8. A plan of the cemetery shall be kept, showing the plots as laid off in the several divisions, and each plot shall have a separate number on the plan.

9. A book shall be kept in which shall be entered the number of every plot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of the sale or transfer of the same. A register shall also be kept of all burials in the cemetery, which register shall be open for inspection of the public.

10. In all cases of intended interment the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the sexton or other duly-authorized person for a warrant for such interment, which warrant shall be granted upon payment of the following fees, viz. :—

*Bonuses on Colonial Industries.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

## LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first 10,000 gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

## OIL-CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first 50 tons of oil-cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

## SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

## SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

## SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

## OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

## BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk) which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1882.
2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1883.
3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

## IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.
3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1883.

THREE scholarships, to be held at the Native College, Te Aute, Hawke's Bay, are offered by the Trustees of the fund instituted in memory of the late Sir Donald McLean for promoting the higher education of Maori youths.

Two of these scholarships are open to any Maori or half-caste whose age on the 30th November, 1882, shall not exceed fifteen years, and who shall have attended a Native college or school for the preceding twelve months.
