A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts within which District Courts shall be respectively held, and such districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define or alter:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, a district was defined within which a District Court should be held under the said Act, and it was thereby declared that the said Court should be designated by the name of "The District Court of Timaru and Oamaru:"

And whereas by Proclamations bearing date the eighteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and the twenty-seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the boundaries of the said district so defined were altered:

And whereas it is expedient to further alter the boundaries of the said district so defined and altered as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the first day of September next, the boundaries of the district within which the District Court of Timaru and Oamaru shall be held shall be altered, and that thenceforth the boundaries thereof shall be the boundaries hereinafter described.

TIMARU AND OAMARU DISTRICT COURT DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial Districts of Canterbury and Otago, bounded towards the North-east by a line along the summit of Two Thumb Range from the Southern Alps, near Mount Tyndall, to the source of Forest Creek; thence by the middle of that creek

to the Rangitata River; and thence by the middle of that river to the sea; towards the East and South-east by the sea to the Waikouaiti River; towards the South by the said river and its north branch to a point due east of Trig. E, on the Silver Peak Hills; thence by a right line to the said trig.; again towards the South-east by the summit of the said hills to Silver Peak; towards the South-west by a right line to the Hummock; thence by a right line to the Taieri River at the south-eastern corner of Run No. 205; again towards the South by the southern boundary of the said Run No. 205 to Run No. 248; thence by a right line to Rock and Pillar Mountain; thence by a right line to Soutra Hill; thence along the summit of the leading ridge to Lammerlaw Mountain; thence along the summit of the Lammerlaw Range and Rough Ridge to South Rough Ridge Hill; thence by a right line to North Rough Ridge Hill; thence along that ridge to the southern boundary of Run No. 225; thence by that boundary to the Idaburn; thence along the centre of the Idaburn and the Manuherikia Rivers to Lauder Creek; thence along the centre of that creek to its source; thence by a right line to the nearest peak of the Dunstan Mountains, and along the summit of the said mountains by the western boundary of Run No. 226 to a peak near the Dunstan Pass; thence by a right line to Mount St. Bathans; thence following the summit of the range through Lindis Pass to Longslip Hill, and by that summit to its intersection by a right line drawn between Mount Aspiring and the outflow of the Ohau River from Ohau Lake; again towards the South by the said line to Mount Aspiring; and towards the North-west by the summit of the Southern Alps: as the same is de-lineated on the plans in the District Survey Office, Dunedin.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rura lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Taranaki did, on the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pass a resolution recom-mending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice of the Colony of New Zealand, and Administrator of the Government thereof, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in the principal land office of the district.

Land reserved for Primary Education.

JAMES PRENDERGAST, Administrator of the Government. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Education Reserves Act, 1877," it is, among other things, enacted that, in order to provide an endowment for primary education in the North Island, at least five per centum of the waste lands in each district therein open for sale on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and a like per centum out of all land over which the Native title may thereafter be extinguished in each such district, and which should from time to time be acquired or purchased by or on behalf of the Crown, should be reserved and set apart as an endowment for the maintenance of primary education within the education district in which the land is situated:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said recited Act, and of every other power and authority me thereunto enabling, do hereby reserve and set apart the several blocks or parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto as endowments for the maintenance of primary education within the education districts in which such blocks or parcels of land are respectively situated.

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently

established in New Zealand, of the first 10,000 gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL-CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first 50 tons of oilcake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk) which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1882.

2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1883.

3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

4. Further information and particulars may be obtained by application to the Colonial Secretary's Office.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.

2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.
3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st De-

cember, 1883.

4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above

conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.
5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of bond fide account sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as pig-iron.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of March, 1875, Her Majesty was accordingly pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the ships of Sweden, the certificates of Swedish nationality and registry, or the certificates of measurement, of which are dated on or after the first day of April, 1875, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Swedish nationality and registry, or certificates of measurement:

And whereas a slight difference in the mode of estimating the allowance for engine-room in Swedish ships has been introduced into the said rules, and the same came into operation on the first day of

April, 1832:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, are, with the exception of the said slight difference in the mode of estimating the allowance for engine-room, still in force in that country:

Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of

Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships: That merchant sailing ships of Sweden, the measurement whereof, after the said first day of April, 1882, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such

ships.
2. As regards steamships: That merchant ships

registry, or the certificates of measurement, of | belonging to Sweden, which are propelled by steam, or any other power requiring engine-room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said first day of April, 1882, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships: Provided nevertheless that, if the owner or master of any such Swedish steamship desires the deduction for engine-room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engineroom measurement and deduction applicable to British ships, instead of under the Swedish rule, the engine-room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules; and that, in the event of the net registered tonnage of such steamships, estimated under the British rule, being denoted in the said certificate of nationality and registry or measurement of Swedish steamships, the same shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted therein.

Declaration between the British and Russian GOVERNMENTS ON THE SUBJECT OF TONNAGE MEASUREMENT.

Signed at London, 9th June, 1882.

The English system of tonnage measurement (Moorsom's system) being henceforward in force as well in the Empire of Russia and the Grand Duchy of Finland as in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and in the British Colonies, the Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the Emperor of All the Russias, have agreed to the following declara-

1. Russian and Finland vessels measured according to the above-mentioned system shall be admitted into the ports of the United Kingdom and its colonies; and British vessels measured according to the same system shall be admitted into the ports of Russia or Finland, without being subjected, for the purpose of payment of navigation dues, to any fresh operation of measurement.

The navigation dues above mentioned shall be

calculated on the net tonnage.

2. The Finland and English regulations respecting tonnage measurement being substantially the same, English certificates of tonnage measurement shall, in the Grand Duchy of Finland, and Finland certificates of tonnage measurement, taken out after the 31st May, 1877, shall, in the United Kingdom and its colonies, be recognized, without any operation of measurement or other formality whatsoever; and the net tonnage of all British or Finland ships inscribed on the ship's papers shall be considered in the respective ports of each country as equivalent to the net register tonnage of national vessels.
3. English certificates of tonnage measurement

shall, in Russia, and Russian certificates of tonnage measurement, taken out after the 20th December, 1879 [1st January, 1880], shall, in the United Kingdom and its colonies, be likewise reciprocally recognized in the ports of each country without any operation of measurement.

As, however, the provisions of the Russian regulations do not entirely correspond to the English regulations relative to the mode to be followed in the determination of crew spaces in ships, and machine and coal spaces in steamers, the deductions in respect of these shall, for English vessels in Russian ports, be calculated according to the figures shown in the certificates of tonnage measurement, in conformity with the regulation sanctioned the 20th December, 1879 [1st January, 1880], without remeasurement of the vessel.

This measure shall be applicable in British ports to Russian vessels touching there, if the captains of the said vessels shall express a desire to that effect; and in such case the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act of the 10th August, 1854, shall be complied

with.

4. The above-mentioned arrangements shall apply also to vessels propelled by any other artificial power than steam.

The present declaration shall come into operation on the 1st [13th] July, 1882, and shall remain in force so long as one of the contracting parties shall not have notified to the other, six months in advance, its intention of terminating it.
