Declaring Lands Open for Sale within the District of Westland.

(L.S.) **JAMES PRENDERGAST,**

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fifty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any Crown lands within any mining district, not held under license or lease at the date of such Proclamation, or over which the license or lease has been cancelled, to be open for sale or selection, in sections of such size and form, and on such date, as he may determine; and any land so proclaimed may hereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be, as Crown lands of the same class not within a mining district: And the Governor may from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Chief Justice of the Colony of New Zealand, and Administrator of the Government thereof, do hereby declare that the land specified in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale, and that the nineteenth day of October next ensuing shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for sale.

SCHEDULE.

ONE hundred and seventy acres, more or less, situated in the Matakitaiki Survey District. Bounded towards the North by boundary of Run No. 21; towards the East by road reserve along Copper-mine Creek; towards the South by a straight line running through peg 65, by-road to Waita River, and at a right angle with said road; and towards the West by a line 40 chains distant from and parallel with said

by-road to Waita River: exclusive of necessary roads and reserves, and subject to existing rights under "The Mines Act, 1877."

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir James Prendergast, Knight, Chief Justice, the Administrator of the Government of Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this eighth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Regulations for the Management of the Campbelltown Cemetery, County of Southland.

THE following regulations for the management of the Campbelltown Cemetery, having been submitted to His Excellency the Administrator of the

Government in Council, are published in accordance with "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877."

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CAMPBELLTOWN CEMETERY, MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTIONS 9 AND 23 OF "THE CEMETERIES MANAGEMENT ACT, 1877."

1. A portion of the cemetery shall be divided into three classes, viz. :—

2. Class A : Being ground of which the perpetual and exclusive right may be acquired, with the privilege of enclosing the ground and of erecting headstones or other monuments thereon. A portion of ground of this class shall be staked off into lots of 13 feet by 9 feet. These lots shall be sold for £4.

3. Class B : These lots shall be 13 feet by 4 feet 6 inches, and shall be sold for £2 each, with permission to fence same and erect headstones.

4. Class C : These lots shall be 6 feet 6 inches by 3 feet, and shall be sold for £1, with permission to place flat tombstones on same.

General Regulations.

5. All graves to be 6 feet deep, but, in the event of the purchasers of private ground desiring a greater depth, an extra charge of 3s. 6d. shall be made for every foot more than 6 feet deep in first class graves, and 3s. per foot in second class graves.

6. The Clerk shall provide all necessary furniture and attendance for properly conducting interments.

7. Any purchasers of private ground in which no interment shall have taken place may transfer his or her interest in said ground to any other person upon payment being made to the Clerk of the cemetery for the time being of a fee of 2s. 6d. for such transfer.

8. A plan of the cemetery shall be prepared showing particularly the lots so laid off, together with the numbers thereof.

9. The Clerk to the cemetery for the time being shall keep a book in which he shall enter from time to time the number of every lot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of sale of the same, and shall keep a record of the burials in the cemetery.

10. The Clerk of the cemetery for the time being shall receive the purchase-money for the sale of such lots, and shall give a receipt for the same, which receipt shall be held conclusive evidence of the purchase and selection of the lots mentioned therein.

11. In all cases of intended interment the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the Clerk of the cemetery for the time being for a warrant for such interment, which warrant the said Clerk is hereby authorized to grant upon payment to him of the following fees, viz. :—

For paupers no charge shall be made for the warrant or for recording.

12. The said warrant when received by the gravedigger shall be sufficient authority to him for such interment.

13. The moneys arising from the sale of such lots and the said fees shall, after deducting thereout all necessary expenses incurred and to be incurred, be expended in improving the cemetery.

14. The Clerk shall publish a statement once a year, showing the amounts received and paid by him on account of the cemetery.

15. The said record-book shall be open for the inspection of the public on paying a fee of 2s. 6d. for each inspection.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first 10,000 gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL-CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first 50 tons of oil-cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50

tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk) which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1882.

2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1883.

3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

4. Further information and particulars may be obtained by application to the Colonial Secretary's Office.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.

2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.

3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1883.

4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.

5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of *bonâ fide* account sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as pig-iron.

It will be seen by the above analyses that in only one case was a trace of lead found in any of the samples, and this only where a portion was in contact with the solder of the can. The general contents when further tested gave not a trace. In one or two cases, lead was apparently found in the tin coating, but further examination showed that this was due to the fact that the solder had run as a thin film into the tin surface. In no case did the true tin surface contain lead. In none of the samples examined were any loose lumps of solder found, yet from my own experience I know that lumps of solder are very frequently found in tinned provisions, and in such cases any acid contents, such as fruit, would be almost certain, in tins, to become contaminated with the lead. The method of soldering on the outside, which is now being adopted, is certainly much the safest mode of fastening the tins, and prevents even the liability of lead contamination.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 496, against 458 in July, an increase of 38. The deaths amounted to 164 in August, an increase of 27 on the number for July. Of the above deaths, males contributed 100; females, 64. 66 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 40.24 per cent. of the whole number; 39 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 270 in August, against 245 in July, an increase of 25.

The deaths in August were 101, against 81 in July, an increase of 20.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: two males of 88 and 84, and two females of 83 and 79, died at Auckland; three males of 79, 78, and 65, and a female of 74, at Wellington; two males of 73 and 66, and a female of 74, at Christchurch.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these causes were much more numerous in August than in July, having increased from 15 to 27. Scarlet fever again appears on the list, the month of July having been the only one of the last twelve months in which it was not given as a cause of death. Diphtheria and croup each caused 5 deaths in August, against 1 in July. Typhoid fever also appears as having caused 1 death, not having been returned as a cause of death in either June or July. Two deaths are again returned as the result of intemperate habits.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases were 18 in August, against 10 in July. Of these, phthisis caused 11 deaths in August and 6 in July.

Local Diseases.—There was a slight increase in the deaths from these diseases in August as compared with July. Diseases of the nervous system caused 13 deaths in August and 7 in July; and diseases of the respiratory organs caused 15 deaths in August, against 10 in July.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
