Amending Crossing-places under "The Sheep Act, 1878."—Notice No. 129.

A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the forty-fourth section of "The Sheep Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and order that the Proclamation dated the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and all other Proclamations issued under the before-mentioned section, are hereby rescinded.

And I do further proclaim and declare that the places mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be places at which all sheep to be introduced by land into the several sheep districts in the Schedule hereto respectively mentioned shall be crossed over the boundaries of such districts.

SCHEDULE.

NAPIER, AUCKLAND, AND WELLINGTON SHEEP DISTRICTS.

On the boundary between the Wellington and Napier Sheep Districts, where the coast-line crosses the Waimata Stream.

In the Township of Woodville, Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, at the junction of the main road from Masterton with the main road from the Manawatu Gorge to Napier.

At Te Reinga, on the boundary between the Napier and the Auckland Sheep Districts.

Where the main road from Napier to Taupo crosses the boundary of the Napier and the Auckland Sheep Districts.

CANTERBURY AND WAIAU SHEEP DISTRICTS.

The ferry on the Waiau-ua River, known as Arthur's or Upper Waiau Ferry.

The ford or bridge on the Waiau-ua River, opposite the homestead of Leslie Hill's Run.

The ford on the Waiau-ua River, about opposite the Township of Waiau.

The ford or bridge on the Hurunui River, on the Great North Road.

On the boundary of the Canterbury and Waiau Sheep Districts, where the road between St. Leonards and Culverden Runs crosses said boundary.

At the Culverden boundary-fence on the Main North Road near Rotherham.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of a portion of the railway from Whangarei to Kamo, being one of the railways specified in "The Immigration and Public Works Appropriation Act, 1878," was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and

Further Terms and Conditions of Special Settlement on Manawaru Block, in the Te Aroha Block, by Messrs. Grant and Foster.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this thirty-first day of October, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any special settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas the Governor has, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, set apart six hundred and sixty-two acres of a block of rural land in the North Island of New Zealand, known as the Manawaru Block, as a special settlement under and for the purposes of the said Act, as therein mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby fix the following terms and conditions as those upon which the said special settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The price to be paid for the said six hundred and sixty-two acres shall be one thousand two hundred and eighty-four pounds, being a competent valuation at the rate of about two pounds one shilling and fourpence per acre.

2. The said Manawaru Block shall form part of and be incorporated with the special settlement of the Te Aroha Block formed or to be formed by Samuel Grant and John Stovin Foster in pursuance of an Order in Council issued on the seventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty; and all the terms and conditions for the formation of the last-mentioned special settlement set forth in such last-mentioned Order in Council shall, so far as they are applicable, apply to and be the terms and conditions for the settlement of the Manawaru Block aforesaid.

MY LORD,—The Committee of the Exhibition which is to take place at Amsterdam next year has set apart for the Modern Art Section a special building in which space, to be defined later on, will be placed, without cost, at the disposal of each country.

Only those articles, however, which have real value from an artistic point of view will be accepted by the Committee.

In order therefore to prevent disappointments, the Committee in question considers that it would be very desirable that the different Governments should appoint Commissions of Artists to decide if the objects presented can be admitted to the Exhibition.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first 10,000 gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL-CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first 50 tons of oil-cake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above named.

OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of butter or the first 50 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk) which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1882.
2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1883.
3. The other conditions as to quantity, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.
4. Further information and particulars may be obtained by application to the Colonial Secretary's Office.

IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, of 300 tons of pig-iron, of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.
2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1882.
3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1883.

In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.

THE following particulars relative to estimates, plans, and specifications to be submitted to the Minister for Public Works under sections 9 and 10 of "The Roads and Bridges Construction Act, 1882," are published for general information.

THESE shall include,—

1. General or key plan, showing route of road between well-known termini, with locality of proposed works marked thereon; or the site of works may be indicated on the plan by reference to survey sections along any line of road. Scale: 1 mile to 1 inch.

2. Longitudinal section of ground and road-line formation, with grades marked on it, and heights at change of grade from a datum-line, also depths of cuttings and banks at every chain in rough ground, or at every 2 or 3 chains in ground of an even character. This section to be in sheets, each showing not more than 1 mile in length. Scale: 3 chains to 1 inch longitudinal, 30 feet to 1 inch vertical.

3. Cross sections not more than 2 chains apart of all parts of the ground where the transverse inclination of the same is more than 1 in 4; and ground of the latter character to be described on the longitudinal section as "sideling ground" or "level," as the case may be. Scale: 15 feet to 1 inch, natural.

4. Estimates for large culverts and bridges need not be given in detail, but per lineal foot. The kind of bridge must be described as iron or wood, truss or plain; size of spans, as also the width of roadway, and its height above ordinary water-level and above highest flood-level.

Full particulars of culverts must be given as to shape, width, height, and thickness, and the material of which it is proposed to build them.

5. Tracings on cloth of plans as above to be sent for approval. These will be kept in the Public Works Department as a record.

A specimen sheet of each of such plans will be furnished to any local body applying for them.

Standing Orders on Local Bills.

THE following amended Standing Orders of the Houses of the General Assembly relative to Local Bills are published for general information.

F. E. CAMPBELL,
Clerk of Parliaments.

16th October, 1882.

1. Local Bills are those which, not being Private Bills, affect particular localities only.

2. No Local Bill shall be read a second time unless notice shall have been given of the said Bill in the locality to which the Bill refers. Such notice shall state explicitly the object which such Bill is intended to effect, and shall have been published once at least in each of three successive weeks before the second reading in a newspaper circulating in such locality.

3. At the time of the first publication of such notice, a copy of the Bill shall be deposited in the Resident Magistrate's Court of the district, and shall be open to public inspection.

4. When it is intended in such Bill to take power to deal with any lands, plans or surveys of such lands, on a scale of not less than two inches to a mile, and certified by an authorized surveyor, shall be deposited with the Bill.

5. In the case of Bills authorizing the construction of harbour works, or the raising of further loans for the completion of harbour works previously authorized, such Bill shall be accompanied by a statement of the financial position of the promoters, an estimate of the cost of construction, and the estimated increased revenue to be derived from the proposed works, together with the plans or surveys before mentioned.

6. Before the Bill is introduced into the Legislative Council or House of Representatives, the before-mentioned plans or surveys and estimates shall be forwarded to the office of the Clerk of the House in which the Bill is to be initiated.

Description of the above Lands.

Waimate: Block I., parts of the land known as the

Continuous Native Reserve. The sections front to cleared road-lines, running back into the bush. The land is partly open and partly bush.

Opunake: Block XIII., from three to four miles south-east of Opunake Town, by coach-road. The land is level, mostly open, with background of bush.

Oeo: Block I., open level land, on the coach-road south-east of Opunake.

Kaupokonui: Block XI. lies behind the Continuous Reserve. It is eight to ten miles from the Eltham Railway-station, and the same distance from Manaia, being connected to both places by a cleared road-line. The land is level, all bush, and well watered, and very suitable for settlement.

Kaupokonui: Block XII., inland of the Waimate Plains, west of the Waingongoro Stream and Eltham Railway-station. From Eltham and other points roads have been opened up to this land, which is on the railway-line from Waitara and New Plymouth to Hawera. With the exception of a few rata, the bush consists mainly of soft woods and other light timber, and can easily be cleared. The country is well watered, and is admirably adapted for conversion into grass lands.

Kaupokonui: Blocks XIII. and XIV. lie behind, and also form part of, the Continuous Native Reserve to the east of the Oeo River. The land is level, all bush, and well watered.
