A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the forty-fourth section of "The Sheep Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and order that the Proclamation dated the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and all other Proclamations issued under the before-mentioned section, are hereby rescinded

And I do further proclaim and declare that the places mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be places at which all sheep to be introduced by land into the several sheep districts in the Schedule hereto respectively mentioned shall be crossed over the boundaries of such districts.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Auckland. Further Terms and Conditions of Special Settlement on Manawaru Block, in the Te Aroha Block, by Messrs. Grant and Foster.

> JAMES PRENDERGAST, Administrator of the Government. ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this thirty-first day of October, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

THEREAS by "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any special settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas the Governor has, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eightytwo, set apart six hundred and sixty-two acres of a block of rural land in the North Island of New Zealand, known as the Manawaru Block, as a special settlement under and for the purposes of the said Act, as therein mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions as those upon which the said special settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same,

that is to say,

1. The price to be paid for the said six hundred and sixty-two acres shall be one thousand two hundred and eighty-four pounds, being a competent valuation at the rate of about two pounds one shilling

and fourpence per acre.

2. Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

LINSEED OIL.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the production, by machinery permanently established in New Zealand, of the first 10,000 gallons of oil, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

OIL-CAKE.

A bonus of one hundred pounds (£100) will be given for the production of the first 50 tons of oilcake, of good marketable quality, from linseed grown in the colony.

SUGAR.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production of the first 125 tons of sugar, manufactured in New Zealand, from beet or any other root or plant grown in the colony.

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

SUGAR-REFINING.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for three years in succession for the refining each year, by machinery established in New Zealand, of not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The estaof not less than 100 tons of cane sugar. The establishment by which such refining is effected must be what is ordinarily known as a sugar-refinery. The firm refining the first 100 tons of sugar, and receiving the bonus, shall be also entitled to the bonus of the two following years upon fulfilling the conditions above

OSTRICHES.

A bonus of five pounds (£5) per head will be given for healthy ostrich chicks landed in New Zealand for the purpose of being reared and maintained in the colony; the number of any importation to be not less than ten nor more than fifty.

BUTTER OR CHEESE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 25 tons of cheese (produced in a factory worked on the American principle, and to which factory any farmer, subject to certain conditions, may send his milk) which shall be exported from New Zealand, and sold at such prices in a foreign market as shall show that the articles are of fair quality.

THESE shall include,—

1. General or key plan, showing route of road between well-known termini, with locality of proposed works marked thereon; or the site of works may be indicated on the plan by reference to survey sections along any line of road. Scale: 1 mile to 1 inch.

2. Longitudinal section of ground and road-line formation, with grades marked on it, and heights at change of grade from a datum-line, also depths of cuttings and banks at every chain in rough ground, or at every 2 or 3 chains in ground of an even character. This section to be in sheets, each showing not more than 1 mile in length. Scale: 3 chains to 1 inch longitudinal, 30 feet to 1 inch vertical.

3. Cross sections not more than 2 chains apart of all parts of the ground where the transverse inclination of the same is more than 1 in 4; and ground of the latter character to be described on the longitudinal section as "sideling ground" or "level," as the case may be. Scale: 15 feet to 1 inch, natural.

4. Estimates for large culverts and bridges need? not be given in detail, but per lineal foot. The kind of bridge must be described as iron or wood, truss or plain; size of spans, as also the width of roadway, and its height above ordinary water-level and above highest flood-level.

Standing Orders on Local Bills.

THE following amended Standing Orders of the Houses of the General Assembly relative to Local Bills are published for general information.

F. E. CAMPBELL, Clerk of Parliaments.

16th October, 1882.

1. Local Bills are those which, not being Private

Bills, affect particular localities only.

2. No Local Bill shall be read a second time unless notice shall have been given of the said Bill in the locality to which the Bill refers. Such notice shall state explicitly the object which such Bill is intended to effect, and shall have been published once at least in each of three successive weeks before the second reading in a newspaper circulating in such locality.

3. At the time of the first publication of such notice, a copy of the Bill shall be deposited in the Resident Magistrate's Court of the district, and shall

be open to public inspection.

4. When it is intended in such Bill to take power to deal with any lands, plans or surveys of such lands, on a scale of not less than two inches to a mile, and certified by an authorized surveyor, shall be deposited with the Bill.

5. In the case of Bills authorizing the construction of harbour works, or the raising of further loans for the completion of harbour works previously authorized, such Bill shall be accompanied by a statement of the financial position of the promoters, an estimate of the cost of construction, and the estimated increased revenue to be derived from the proposed works, together with the plans or surveys before mentioned.

6. Before the Bill is introduced into the Legislative Council or House of Representatives, the beforementioned plans or surveys and estimates shall be forwarded to the office of the Clerk of the House in

which the Bill is to be initiated.

Description of the above Lands.

Waimate: Block I., parts of the land known as the

Continuous Native Reserve. The sections front to | Dunedin, in the latter end of February, 1883, twelve cleared road-lines, running back into the bush. The land is partly open and partly bush.

Opunake: Block XIII., from three to four miles south-east of Opunake Town, by coach-road. The land is level, mostly open, with background of bush.
