# A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881," (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of among other uning, enacted that the inhabitance of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such

locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of "The Petone Town District;" and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners of the said district shall consist of seven in number.

## SCHEDULE.

Land taken for Waitaki-Bluff Railway (part of Branch from Main Line to Duntroon), in Block III., Papakaio District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a certain railway was proclaimed in the New Zealand Gazette of the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, under the name of the Awamoko Railway, and the said railway now forms the branch line of railway from the main line (Waitaki-Bluff) to Duntroon:

And whereas the two hundred and twenty-ninth section of "The Public Works Act, 1882," enacts that any public work authorized under the authority of any Act repealed by this Act, or of any Act or Ordinance repealed by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and any land required to be taken, purchased, or acquired for such work, or anything commenced under any such authority as aforesaid, may be continued, taken, purchased, or acquired, executed, carried out, enforced, and completed under the provisions of this Act:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required for a portion of the said branch

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and in pursuance of the power conferred upon him by the one hundred and thirtieth and two hundred and twenty-ninth sections of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the said land so described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the said portion of the said branch railway.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of November, 1882.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, bearing date this fourteenth day of November, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto

shall be disposed of as small-farm allotments upon

deferred payments.

2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for

application shall be Monday, the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, at the Land Office, Dunedin.

3. The sections shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1877," and to the provisions of section nine of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879."

4. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one section.

5. The price stated in the Schedule hereto shall be the price at which the lands shall be open for application.

6. If there should be more than one application for any allotment, the right to occupy the same shall

be determined by lot amongst the applicants.
7. Each applicant will be required to make the declaration prescribed by section sixty-two of "The Land Act, 1877," and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the Otago Land District one-tenth of the price of the allotment. Such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee due on the first day of

July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
8. The purchaser of any lands described in the Schedule hereto, upon the payment, and also the fulfilment of the transmission. fulfilment of the terms and conditions prescribed by "The Land Act, 1877," and "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," relating to land on deferred payments, will be entitled to his Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way upon payment of the fees prescribed by law.

Powers delegated to the Tauranga Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1881."

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourteenth day of November, 1882.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the colony, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council dated the seventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears, and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Tauranga Public Domain Board, viz.,—

GEORGE BENTHAM MORRIS, THOMAS TUNKS, RICHARD HENRY FARRER, JAMES WEIR GRAY, JOSEPH FOSTER BUDDLE, and The MAYOR of the BOROUGH of TAURANGA

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the office of the Chairman, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in December in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the mem-bers present shall choose some one of their number

to be Chairman of such meeting.
6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a

meeting.

Authorizing the Auckland Gas Company (Limited) to build a Wharf in Auckland Harbour.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS by the sixteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence the Governor in Council may authorize any person to

Any meeting may be adjourned from time struction of any graving dock, dock, or breakwater struction of any graving dock, dock, or breakwater in any harbour or in the sea), and to use and occupy such part of the foreshore, or of any tidal land or tidal waters, as may be necessary for the construc-tion or use of such harbour works in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence: And whereas by the seventeenth section of the said Act it is also enacted that every such Order in Council shall be made upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit, and the rights thereby conferred shall only be granted for a limited period not exceeding in any case fourteen years, and may at any time be altered, modified, or revoked: And whereas by the one hundred and fifty-second section of the said Act it is further enacted that, where it shall appear to the Governor in Council that any harbour works are required for the use, benefit, or convenience of the public within a harbour under the control of a Harbour Board, and that such Board cannot conveniently execute or carry out such works. then, and in any such case, the Governor in Council may exercise the powers vested in him by the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth sections of the said Act:

And whereas the Auckland Gas Company (Limited) (hereinafter termed "the Company"), desire to build a wharf, for the use, benefit, and convenience of the public, in Auckland Harbour, which harbour is within the control of the Auckland Harbour Board; but the said Board cannot conveniently execute or carry out such work; and the Company have applied to the Governor in Council for the issue of this order:

And whereas the said Company have deposited plans of the said wharf (marked M.D. 625, 626, and 627) at the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in the manner prescribed by the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of the said Act, and, it having been made to appear to the Administrator of the Government in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, the Administrator of the Government in Council hath this day approved of the said deposited plans without any modification or addition, and subject to the conditions set forth in this Order in Council:

Now, therefore, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize the Company to build, in Auckland Harbour, for the use, benefit, and convenience of the public, a wharf, in accordance with the said plan marked M.D. 627, and in the position shown on the said plans marked M.D. 625 and 626, and to use and occupy such portion of the foreshore or of any tidal land or tidal water as may be necessary for the construction and use of such wharf, subject to the following conditions, that is to say,-

1. That all persons shall, at all reasonable times, either in the daytime or at night, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, after the same shall have been completed in accordance with the said plans, and to have ingress to and upon the said wharf, and egress therefrom, and regress thereto,

as occasion may require. 2. That every person, authority, or thing exempt from harbour dues under the one hundred and thirtysecond section of the said Act shall also be exempt from all dues or payments in respect of the said

wharf or the use thereof.

3. That the Company shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for construct harbour works (other than the reclama- the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights: Provided that no light shall be | Alteration of Boundaries of Pukekura and Rangiaohia exhibited until after it has been approved of by the

- 4. That any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repairs thereof; and that, upon such Minister leaving at the last known address of the Company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Company, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the Company shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed, or such repairs to be made.
- 5. That the Company will not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.
- 6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the Company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.
- 7. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Auckland Harbour Board.
- 8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.
- 9. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time be resumed by the Governor without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Company six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at the last known address of the Company.
- 10. The Company shall not sell, mortgage, lease, or otherwise part with, charge, or encumber the said wharf, or any right or privilege hereby conferred upon it, without the consent in writing of the Minister.
- 11. Nothing contained in this Order in Council shall be deemed to prevent its revocation at any time and without any notice in case the Company shall-
  - (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
  - (2.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved;
  - (3.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf.

And publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Company, and to all persons concerned or interested in the said wharf, that this Order in Council and the rights and privileges thereby conferred have been revoked and determined.

12. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

# Standing Orders on Local Bills.

THE following amended Standing Orders of the Houses of the General Assembly relative to Local Bills are published for general information. F. E. CAMPBELL,

16th October, 1882.

- 1. Local Bills are those which, not being Private Bills, affect particular localities only.
- 2. No Local Bill shall be read a second time unless notice shall have been given of the said Bill in the locality to which the Bill refers. Such notice shall state explicitly the object which such Bill is intended to effect, and shall have been published once at least in each of three successive weeks before the second reading in a newspaper circulating in such locality.
- 3. At the time of the first publication of such notice, a copy of the Bill shall be deposited in the Resident Magistrate's Court of the district, and shall be open to public inspection.
- 4. When it is intended in such Bill to take power to deal with any lands, plans or surveys of such lands, on a scale of not less than two inches to a mile, and certified by an authorized surveyor, shall be deposited with the Bill.
- 5. In the case of Bills authorizing the construction of harbour works, or the raising of further loans for the completion of harbour works previously authorized, such Bill shall be accompanied by a statement of the financial position of the promoters, an estimate of the cost of construction, and the estimated increased revenue to be derived from the proposed works, together with the plans or surveys before mentioned.
- 6. Before the Bill is introduced into the Legislative Council or House of Representatives, the beforementioned plans or surveys and estimates shall be forwarded to the office of the Clerk of the House in which the Bill is to be initiated.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 487, against 461 in September, an increase of 26. The deaths amounted to 181 in October, an increase of 16 on the number for September. Of the above deaths males contributed 101; females, 80. 81 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 44.75 per cent. of the whole number; 51 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—
The births were 247 in October, against 238 in September, an increase of 9.
The deaths in October were 117, against 100 in September, an increase of 17.
There were 6 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: three males of 88, 70, and 69 died at Wellington; a male of 77 at Christchurch; and a male of 67 and female of 67 at Dunedin.

The mortality in Wellington of children under 5 years of age was exceptionally great in October, there having been 29 deaths of children under 5 years of age to 24 deaths of persons at 5 years and over, caused by the prevalence of measles, whooping-cough, and diseases of the respiratory organs.

Zymotic Diseases.—These diseases caused a greater mortality in October than September, the deaths having increased from 18 to 29. Measles caused 7 deaths, of which 6 occurred in Wellington, 3 being of children under 5 years of age; one death from measles occurred in Auckland. Whooping-cough caused 2 deaths—both in Wellington—both of children under 5 years.

Diphtheria caused 3 deaths in Christchurch and 1 in Wellington. 2 deaths were directly attributable to intemperance.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases amounted to 16 in October, against 25 in the previous month, the

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases amounted to 16 in October, against 25 in the previous month, the smaller number of deaths from phthisis (8 in October, 16 in September) nearly accounting for the decrease.

Local Diseases.—These diseases, on the other hand, were much more fatal than in September, the deaths having been 44 in September and 54 in October. The increase was chiefly owing to a larger number of deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs. Bronchitis and pneumonia were especially fatal in Wellington, the deaths from these causes in that city having been 13, against 2 in the previous month. Of these, 12 were of children under 5 years of age.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health. condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
