Defining the Middle Line of further Portion of the Foxton to New Plymouth Railway (between Hawera and Manutahi Townships)—9 miles 33 chains.

(L.S.) JAMES PRENDERGAST, Administrator of the Government. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Foxton to New Plymouth is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is, in the seventh section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the aforesaid section seven of "The Public Works Act, 1879," and by seven of "The Fublic Works Act, 1815, and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hun-dred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point on the east side of the road to Tawhiti to a point on the Taumaha Road ; all within the Hawera Survey District, Counties of Hawera and Patea, Provincial District of Taranaki, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 9395, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honourable Harry Albert Atkinson, the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Plymouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point on the east side of the road to Tawhiti, the said point being the termination of a

portion of the railway from Foxton to New Plymouth as described in a Proclamation dated the 15th November, 1880, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 109, of the 18th November, 1880, proceeding thence in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of 9 miles 33 chains or thereabouts, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, viz.: Rural Sections Nos. 185 and 184, Sections Nos. 24, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 32, in the Borough of Hawera; Rural Sections Nos. 546, 193, 194, 195, 196, 234, 235, 236, 237, 238, 239, 240, 241, 242, 243, 244, 245, 209, 246, 247, 248, 212, 249, 250, 251, 269, 270, 268, and 536, Sections Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 31, and 32, Township of Mokoia; Rural Sections Nos. 532, 290, 311, 346, 347, 348, 584, and Native Reserve No. 2, and terminating at a point on the Taumaha Road; all within the Hawera Survey District, Counties of Hawera and Patea, Provincial District of Taranaki, Colony of New Zealand; and including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; in the manner delineated upon the plan marked P.W.D. 9395, signed by the Honourable Harry Albert Atkinson, the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at New Plymouth, in the Provincial District of Taranaki; the total length being 9 miles 33 chains or thereabouts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of November, 1882.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such **here**ditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last-recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judge named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.



Standing Orders on Local Bills.

THE following amended Standing Orders of the Houses of the General Assembly relative to Local Bills are published for general information.

F. E. CAMPBELL, Clerk of Parliaments.

16th October, 1882.

1. Local Bills are those which, not being Private Bills, affect particular localities only.

2. No Local Bill shall be read a second time unless notice shall have been given of the said Bill in the locality to which the Bill refers. Such notice shall state explicitly the object which such Bill is intended to effect, and shall have been published once at least in each of three successive weeks before the second reading in a newspaper circulating in such locality.

3. At the time of the first publication of such notice, a copy of the Bill shall be deposited in the Resident Magistrate's Court of the district, and shall be open to public inspection.

4. When it is intended in such Bill to take power to deal with any lands, plans or surveys of such lands, on a scale of not less than two inches to a mile, and certified by an authorized surveyor, shall be deposited with the Bill.

5.
